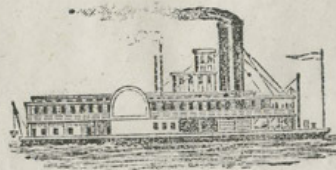

Three Steamboats on the Kansas River.

Three first class light draft steamers are now plying on the Kansas River, from **Wyandott to Lawrence, Topeka and Manhattan.** Stages are also leaving Wyandott daily for Lawrence.

This is the cheapest, quickest and most direct route into the interior of the great Territory of Kansas.

Wyandott lays directly at the mouth of the Kansas River, and is fast becoming the great gateway into the Territory. The Wharf Boat at Wyandott is fitted up with hotel accommodations for three hundred people and a store house for five hundred tons of freight.

All freight left in charge of, or shipped to F. A. HUNT & CO., Wyandott Wharf Boat, will be sent forward immediately to its destination, or stored to order. Emigrants will please look on their Maps and see the geographical position of Wyandott, and bear in mind the fact that three Steamers are now plying on that river, and three more are to be put on immediately.
