Lists of varieties and collections must be presented to the Superintendent for the use of the committee.

Separate samples must be furnished for each display.

The Awarding Committee will be selected by the Board of Directors, from citizens of other States.

Awarding Committee will report for duty to the Superintendent promptly at 9 a. m., Thursday.

The Awarding Committee is required to report on the creditability of county displays not taking premiums.

General County Display.

Including Agricultural, Horticultural Floral, Vegetable, Mineral and Manufactured Products.

Seventy-five dollars will be guaranteed to each General County Display not taking that amount in premiums, making a creditable display, occupying 400 feet of floor space and 300 feet of wall space. Payment to be made on report of Awarding Committee as to creditability of display.

CLASS 4.

Railroad Display.

To include Agricultural, Horticultural, Floral, Minerals and Wood.

To be made from products of country tributary to line of road making display.
