These reports of the Kansas State Mine Inspector mostly concern coal mining, though by 1929 the scope of the reports broadens to include metal mines. The content of individual reports will vary. The reports address mining laws and mining districts; industry production and earnings; fatal and non-fatal accidents; accident investigations and transcripts of oral interviews; labor strikes; mine locations; mining companies and operators; and proceedings of mining conventions. The reports document the political, economic, social, and environmental impacts of more than seventy years of mining in southeastern Kansas.

### REPORT OF COAL MINE INSPECTION DEPARTMENT

The total coal production for the state of Kansas for the year ending December 31, 1938, was 2,789,684 tons, a decrease of 358,717 tons below the 1937 production. There were 2,025,643 tons produced from the strip mines and 764,041 tons produced from the shaft mines.

There were 161 shaft, slope and drift mines, and 61 strip mines in operation during the year, a total of 222 mines. These mines gave employment to 3,585 men and worked an average of 102½ days, which is a reduction of 4½ days from the total of the previous year.

There were 1,075 men employed in the strip mines and 2,510 men employed in the deep mines. The total amount of explosives used was 37,615 kegs of powder, 1,173,118 pounds of dynamite, and 360,880 pounds of pellet powder. Two fatal accidents occurred during the year. This is the lowest number of fatal accidents in the coal industry in this state since any record was made, and the records have been published since 1884. The total number of nonfatal accidents reported for the year was 406.

The Crawford county strip mines produced 1,321,134 tons, a decrease of 288,392 tons from last year's production. The Crawford county strip mines rank first in the production of coal in the state. There were 27 mines in operation, which employed 699 men and worked an average of 103½ days. The amount of explosives used was 26,247 kegs of powder, 763,950 pounds of dynamite and 81,218 pounds of pellet powder. There was one fatal accident and 91 nonfatal accidents during the year.

The Crawford county deep mines produced 554,278 tons of coal during the year, a decrease of 94,230 tons below the production of the previous year. There were 57 mines in operation, which employed 1,215 men and worked an average of 112 days. The amount of explosives used was 7,112 kegs of powder, 77,135 pounds of dynamite and 52,669 pounds of pellet powder. There was one fatal accident and 220 nonfatal accidents during the year.

The total production of the deep and strip mines in Crawford county for the year 1938 was 1,875,412 tons (which is 67 + percent of the state's tonnage).

Cherokee county strip mines produced 477,398 tons of coal, a decrease of 3,010 tons below the production of the previous year. There were 8 strip mines in operation, which employed 218 men at an average of 139 days during the year. The amount of explosives used were 1,161 kegs of powder, 266,775 pounds of dynamite and 64,000 pounds of pellet powder. There were no fatal accidents and 76 nonfatal accidents during the year.

The Cherokee county deep mines produced 28,064 tons, a decrease of over 50 percent below the production of the previous year. There were 37 deep mines in operation, which employed 173 men and worked an average of 73 days. The amount of explosives used were 1,009 kegs of powder, 985 pounds of dynamite, and 15,610 pounds of pellet powder. There was no fatal accident

and no nonfatal accident reported during the year. This is the fourth successive year that Cherokee county has not had a fatal accident in the coal industry.

Bourbon county is continuing to advance in regard to the production of coal in the state. It produced 157,286 tons of coal during the past year. This is an increase of 91,978 tons over the production of 1937. There were 8 strip mines in operation in this county, which employed 92 men, at an average of 133 days during the past year. The amount of explosives used was 134 kegs of powder, 46,900 pounds of dynamite and 27,500 pounds of pellet powder. There was no fatal accident and 12 nonfatal accidents during the year.

Franklin county produced 12,504 tons of coal during the year. There were 14 mines in operation, which employed 85 men at an average of 89 days during the year. The total amount of explosives used was 1,966 pounds of dynamite and 150 pounds of pellet powder. There was no fatal accident and one nonfatal accident.

Labette county produced 10,576 tons of coal during the year. There were 6 strip mines in operation, which employed 22 men at an average of 123 days during the year. The total amount of explosives used was 125 pounds of dynamite and 2,560 pounds of pellet powder. There was no fatal accident and no nonfatal accident during the year.

Leavenworth county produced 86,511 tons of coal during the year. There were 3 deep mines in operation during the year, which employed 511 men at an average of 169 days. The largest mine in this county is the state mine, located at the state prison, at Lansing, and operated under the supervision of the warden at the state prison. The total amount of explosives used was 3 kegs of powder, 2,050 pounds of dynamite and 500 pounds of pellet powder. There was no fatal accident and 1 nonfatal accident during the year.

Linn county produced 30,295 tons of coal during the year. The 14 deep mines produced 19,158 tons of coal and employed 99 men at an average of 98 days. The amount of explosives used was 1,851 kegs of powder, 702 pounds of dynamite and 116,540 pounds of pellet powder. There was no accident during the year. The 5 strip mines produced 11,137 tons of coal and employed 20 men at an average of 99½ days. The amount of explosives used was 65 kegs of powder, 170 pounds of dynamite and 120 pounds of pellet powder. No accident was reported during the year.

Osage county deep mines produced 62,996 tons of coal during the year. There were 26 deep mines in operation, which employed 397 men and worked an average of 116 days. The total amount of explosives used was 7,225 pounds of dynamite and 13 pounds of pellet powder. There were 3 nonfatal accidents and no fatal accident during the year.

Osage county strip mines produced 5,670 tons of coal for the year. There were 6 strip mines in operation, which employed 17 men and worked an average of 96 days. The amount of explosives used was 33 kegs of powder and 635 pounds of dynamite. No accident was reported during the year.

Neosho county small drift mines produced 480 tons of coal during the year. There were 9 mines giving employment to 24 men and working an average of 60 days. No explosives were used and no accident was reported for the year.

Cloud county had 1 small deep mine in operation for a short time, produc-





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ing 50 tons of coal and employing 6 men, working an average of 20 days. No explosives were used and no accident was reported for the year.

Wilson county had 1 strip mine in operation, which produced 2,492 tons of coal and employed 7 men, working an average of 170 days for the year. There were 4,500 pounds of dynamite used. There was one nonfatal accident during the year.

As in the previous year, we have, in addition to the regular mines operating in Cherokee county, a pyrite plant in connection with the Pittsburg Midway Washer and Preparation Plant at Mineral. This is a byproduct plant, and is operated by the Mineral Products Company. The refuse from this plant is salvaged to such extent that this plant produced 39,950 tons of coal and 17,757 tons of pyrite in the last year. The plant employed 24 men and worked 320 days during the past year.

There has been a considerable decrease in the production of the coal industry of this state during the last year, due, very greatly, to the open winter in the closing months of the year. We also have in this field a great many idle men who go to the old strip mines and scrape their own coal. This amounts to a considerable tonnage. Men with trucks also get this coal and sell it in the open market. This deprives our small custom mines of considerable production. There is no way that this department can get a record of this tonnage.
