

#### State inspector of coal mines reports

These reports of the Kansas State Mine Inspector mostly concern coal mining, though by 1929 the scope of the reports broadens to include metal mines. The content of individual reports will vary. The reports address mining laws and mining districts; industry production and earnings; fatal and non-fatal accidents; accident investigations and transcripts of oral interviews; labor strikes; mine locations; mining companies and operators; and proceedings of mining conventions. The reports document the political, economic, social, and environmental impacts of more than seventy years of mining in southeastern Kansas.

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#### REPORT OF COAL-MINE INSPECTION

#### FOR THE FIRST HALF OF 1946

Total coal production in the state of Kansas for the first half of the calendar year ending June 30, 1946, was 1,086,449 tons. There were 999,363 tons produced from the strip mines, and 87,086 tons produced from the shaft mines.

There were 36 shaft, slope, and drift mines and 39 strip mines in operation during the first half of the year, a total of 75 mines. These mines gave employment to 1,416 men and worked an average of 52 days.

There were 792 men employed in the strip mines, and 624 men employed in the deep mines. The total amount of explosives used was 700 kegs of powder, 1,046,415 pounds of dynamite and 38,266 pounds of pellet powder. There were no fatal accidents, but there were 67 nonfatal accidents reported during the first half of the year ending June 30, 1946.

Bourbon county strip mines produced 74,262 tons of coal. There were five mines in operation, employing 59 men and working an average of 43 days. The total amount of explosives used was 45,400 pounds of dynamite, and 400 pounds of pellet powder. There were no fatal accidents, but there were four nonfatal accidents.

Cherokee county deep mines produced 2,772 tons of coal. There were five mines in operation, employing 25 men and working an average of 28 days. The amount of explosives used was 116 kegs of powder, 200 pounds of dynamite, and 2,515 pounds of pellet powder. There were no fatal accidents and no non-fatal accidents.

Cherokee county strip mines produced 420,673 tons of coal. There were 13 mines in operation, employing 293 men and working an average of 72 days. The amount of explosives used was 16 kegs of powder, 473,350 pounds of dynamite, and 10,050 pounds of pellet powder. There were no fatal accidents, but there were 29 nonfatal accidents.

Crawford county deep mines produced 46,786 tons of coal. There were 14 mines in operation, employing 245 men and working an average of 47 days. The amount of explosives used was 553 kegs of powder, 1,875 pounds of dynamite, and 6,350 pounds of pellet powder. There were no fatal accidents, but there were three nonfatal accidents.

Crawford county strip mines produced 501,194 tons of coal. There were 14 mines in operation, employing 421 men and working an average of 55 days. The total amount of explosives used was 522,905 pounds of dynamite, and 14,230 pounds of pellet powder. There were no fatal accidents, but there were 25 nonfatal accidents.

Franklin county deep mines produced 904 tons of coal. There were three mines in operation, employing 13 men and working an average of 41 days. The amount of explosives used was 180 pounds of dynamite. There were no fatal accidents and no nonfatal accidents.

Labette county strip mines produced 376 tons of coal. There were three mines in operation, employing three men and working an average of 26 days. The amount of explosives used was 1,000 pounds of pellet powder. There were no fatal accidents and no nonfatal accidents.



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The one deep mine in Leavenworth county produced 25,144 tons of coal. There were 234 men employed, and the mine worked an average of 152 days. The amount of explosives used was 800 pounds of dynamite. There were no fatal accidents, but there were five nonfatal accidents.

Linn county deep mines produced 1,723 tons of coal. There were seven mines in operation, employing 21 men, and working an average of 30 days. The amount of explosives used was 90 pounds of dynamite, and 2,721 pounds of pellet powder. There were no fatal accidents and no nonfatal accidents.

Osage county deep mines produced 9,757 tons of coal. There were six mines in operation, employing 86 men and working an average of 60 days. The amount of explosives used was 1,350 pounds of dynamite. There were no fatal accidents, but there was one nonfatal accident.

Osage county strip mines produced 2,858 tons of coal. There were four mines in operation, employing 16 men and working an average of 64 days. The amount of explosives used was 15 kegs of powder, and 265 pounds of dynamite. There were no fatal accidents and no nonfatal accidents.

As in the past, we have in this field, a great many men who go into the old strip mines and scrape their own coal. This individual operation amounts to considerable tonnage. Men with trucks also get this coal and sell it on the open market. This division is unable to obtain an accurate record of this tonnage.

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
