

#### Governor John St. John, Exoduster received correspondence

Kansas Governor John P. St. John (1879-1883) received these letters from persons concerned with the migration of southern blacks to Kansas, commonly known as the Exodus or Exoduster movement. The letters come from blacks considering a move to Kansas, persons assisting with or monitoring the migration, officials of cities along the route, and persons providing for the relief of the migrants upon their arrival. The letters proceed in rough chronological order. Most include remnants of abstracts that were attached to the letter and then partially removed. The top of the abstract includes a reference to the letterpress book and page number of the governor's response. The governors' letterpress books are a separate collection. This collection comprises box 13 folders 13-15 and 20, box 14 folders 1-9, and box 15 folders 1-5 of the John St. John governor's records. The 1879-1880 correspondence was filed under "Immigration, Negro Exodus." The 1881-1882 correspondence was filed under "Freedman's Institute, Relief Association." Richmond. Fort Bend County, Texas, Ineselsy. Hept 29# 1879. Goo John & St. John, Topeks. Konsor. Des Sir. My sofourn in this front of Texas. has lengthened into seven, instead of two weeks, and I have been so bussily engaged. in business mothers with my colored colonists here that I have had no time to write you fully in regard to the Exodus peeling of the colored people I will only say now, that the better closes of the colored people in this portion of Texas, are closing to well, that in my opinion they cloud care to emmigrate, nor incleed to far as festility of soil, climste and their trestment by the white people are concerned, it would be harely possible for for them to better their condition elsewhere. On my return home I shall write you one of my usel lengthy letters, as I have much to say and to unge in regard to turning the ticle of the Exocher. Etc.
