

#### Basic campaign speech

This is Governor John Carlin's basic campaign speech for his 1982 gubernatorial reelection campaign. He outlines his accomplishments during his first term as governor: a balanced budget, no growth in the number of state employees, and limited increases in state spending. He also identified several goals for a second administration including property tax relief, enactment of a severance tax on gas and oil producers, improvements in education, and transportation enhancements. Governor Carlin defeated Sam Hardage in the 1982 election and served a second term as governor.

WHEN I BECAME GOVERNOR FOUR YEARS AGO, I DIRECTED MY CABINET.

TO FOCUS ON THREE MAIN GOALS. FIRST, TO BALANCE THE STATE BUDGET.

SECOND, TO STOP THE GROWTH OF STATE GOVERNMENT, AND THIRD TO STOP



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THE INCREASES IN STATE SPENDING. WE HAVE ACCOMPLISHED ALL THREE OF THOSE GOALS. WE HAVE SUBMITTED THE FIRST BALANCED BUDGETS IN A DECADE. WE HAVE ZERO GROWTH IN THE NUMBER OF STATE EMPLOYEES.

AND WE HAVE BROUGHT STATE SPENDING BELOW THE RATE OF INFLATION.

AND WE BEGAN THAT PROCESS IN 1979, WELL BEFORE RONALD REAGAN

MADE IT FASHIONABLE. WE'VE DONE MUCH MORE. BUT WE HAVE NOT BEEN

ABLE TO ACHIEVE EVERYTHING WE'VE WANTED, AND WHAT WE HAVE BEEN ABLE

TO DO WITHIN FOUR YEARS IS NOT ENOUGH. LET ME GIVE YOU SOME EXAMPLES.

I PROMISED TO DO EVERYTHING A GOVERNOR CAN DO TO HOLD THE LINE

ON UTILITY RATES, AND I HAVE. WE HAVE ELIMINATED THE SALES TAX ON

UTILITIES. WE HAVE PUSHED THROUGH A LAW TO INSURE KANSAS CITIZENS

GET THE LOWEST POSSIBLE GAS RATES. AND WE HAVE SAVED OUR UTILITY

RATE PAYERS TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY MILLION DOLLARS.

THAT IS WHY UTILITY RATES IN KANSAS ARE AMONG THE LOWEST IN THE ENTIRE COUNTRY. HOWEVER, A GOVERNOR CAN ONLY EFFECT ABOUT 10 PERCENT

OF THE PRICE YOU PAY FOR UTILITIES. BECAUSE OF THE DEREGULATION

OF NATURAL GAS PRICES BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, AND BECAUSE OF

INFLATION AT THE NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL LEVELS, WHAT YOU PAY

FOR UTILITIES HAS GONE UP.

WE HAVEN'T HAD ANY GENERAL TAX INCREASE SINCE I HAVE BEEN

GOVERNOR. IN FACT, WE HAVE REDUCED TAX RATES AND REFUNDED MILLIONS

OF DOLLARS IN PROPERTY TAXES AND HAVE INCREASED THE PERSONAL EXEMPTIONS

YOU CAN TAKE ON YOUR TAXES. THESE MEASURES WILL PUT OVER 250 MILLION

DOLLARS BACK INTO THE POCKETS OF KANSANS LIKE YOU BY THE END OF THIS

FISCAL YEAR.

LONGER MANDATORY SENTENCES. WE HAVE ENACTED STRONGER DRUNK DRIVING

LAWS. WE NOW HAVE TOUGHER JUVENILE CRIME PENALTIES. AND WE HAVE

GREATLY IMPROVED OUR AGING PRISON FACILITIES.

BUT WE NEED TO MAKE OUR PRISONS MORE SECURE, TO DO MORE TO HELP THE VICTIMS OF CRIME, AND TO GET LAW-ABIDING CITIZENS MORE INVOLVED IN THE PROCESS OF PREVENTING CRIME.

FINALLY, BECAUSE MY OPPONENT SAYS SO MUCH ABOUT IT, LET ME

BUSINESS BECAUSE WE HAVE LOW TAXES AND LOW GOVERNMENT SPENDING.

WE HAVE LOW UTILITY COSTS. AND WE HAVE SPECIAL PROGRAMS TO ATTRACT

BUSINESS. THIS HARD WORK IS BEGINNING TO PAY OFF. IN THE PAST

THREE YEARS, KANSAS RANKS SECOND REGIONALLY IN THE NUMBER OF NEW

AND EXPANDED FIRMS, AND IN THE NUMBER OF NEW PRIVATE SECTOR JOBS

CREATED.

BUT BEFORE WE CAN REALLY COMPETE FOR NEW JOBS AND NEW INDUSTRY,

WE NEED BETTER SCHOOLS, BETTER HIGHWAYS, AND ADDITIONAL PROPERTY TAX

RELIEF. THE WAY TO GET NEW AND BETTER JOBS FOR KANSAS IS NOT TO

SIMPLY FLY AROUND THE COUNTRY AND ENJOY EXPENSIVE, EXPENSE-ACCOUNT

LUNCHES. THE WORK WE NEED TO DO MUST BE DONE HERE AT HOME IN KANSAS.

To improve our schools and to improve our roads, and to do those things without increasing gasoline taxes, or remaining dependent on property tax increases, we must pass a severance tax on oil and gas produced in Kansas. I know that my opponent, Sam Hardage, and I

TAX, OPPOSES THE SEVERANCE TAX, AND CONSEQUENTLY WOULD RATHER SEE

PROPERTY TAXES CONTINUE TO CLIMB. BUT, IN MY OPINION, THE SEVERANCE

TAX IS THE ONLY FAIR AND REASONABLE AND WORKABLE ALTERNATIVE. IF

WE WANT TO MAINTAIN AND IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF OUR SCHOOLS AND

HIGHWAYS, AND IF WE WANT TO DO IT WITHOUT RAISING GASOLINE AND

PROPERTY TAXES, WE MUST ENACT A SEVERANCE TAX.

SAM HARDAGE'S ANSWER TO MEETING PRIORITY NEEDS OF THIS

STATE IS TO SIMPLY CUT WASTE IN STATE GOVERNMENT. WELL, CERTAINLY

GOVERNMENT SHOULD BE MADE AS EFFICIENT AS IT CAN BE. NOBODY

CAN DISAGREE WITH THAT. BUT I WOULD POINT OUT THAT IS EXACTLY

WHAT THE LAST FOUR YEARS HAVE BEEN ABOUT. WE HAVE CUT AND CUT,

AND CONSOLIDATED, AND SCRUTINIZED EVERY DEPARTMENT OF STATE GOVERNMENT.

WE'VE STOPPED THE GROWTH OF STATE GOVERNMENT, AND WE HAVE STOPPED IT

COLD.

SO, IN THE LAST ANALYSIS, WE HAVE THREE OPTIONS IF WE ARE SERIOUS

ABOUT ADDRESSING THE NEEDS KANSANS.

FIRST, WE CAN LET OUR ROADS AND BRIDGES CRUMBLE, AND NOT DO

OBUIOUSLY, THAT IS UNACCEPTABLE.)

ANYTHING TO MAINTAIN AND IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF OUR SCHOOLS. SECOND,

IF WE CHOOSE TO DEAL WITH THOSE PROBLEMS, WE CAN FUND THEM BY LETTING

YOU PAY MORE IN GASOLINE TAXES AND BY FORCING LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TO

INCREASE YOUR PROPERTY TAXES MORE AND MORE AND MORE.

OR, WE CAN HOLD THE LINE ON THE TAXES PAID BY THE AVERAGE WORKING

PEOPLE OF KANSAS AND MAKE THE LARGE OIL AND GAS PRODUCERS PAY THEIR

FAIR SHARE FOR THE RESOURCES THEY TAKE OUT OF KANSAS SOIL.

THERE HAS BEEN A LOT OF CONFUSION ABOUT WHAT A SEVERANCE TAX IS,

AND WHAT IT IS NOT. ALL A SEVERANCE TAX SAYS IS THAT LARGE OIL AND

GAS PRODUCERS -- AND IT DOES NOT APPLY TO SMALL, MARGINAL PRODUCERS

OR ROYALTY OWNERS -- MUST PAY A TAX TO THE STATE OF KANSAS FOR TAKING,

OR SEVERING, GAS AND OIL FROM OUR STATE. IT'S JUST THAT SIMPLE.

WILL DESTROY THE OIL AND GAS INDUSTRY? OF COURSE NOT. THE PRICE OF A BARREL OF OIL HAS RISEN BY APPROXIMATELY 700 PERCENT SINCE 1973. IN ADDITION, THE FEDERAL WINDFALL PROFITS TAX WILL NO LONGER BE IN EFFECT AS OF NEXT YEAR, AND WITH THIS ACTION KANSAS STRIPPER WELL PRODUCERS STAND TO MAKE OVER 100 MILLION DOLLARS MORE IN 1983 ALONE. SO THERE IS NO QUESTION BUT THAT THE OIL AND GAS INDUSTRY WILL REMAIN HEALTHY EVEN WITH THE ENACTMENT OF A SEVERANCE TAX. AND THE INDUSTRY CAN CERTAINLY AFFORD TO PAY ITS FAIR SHARE HERE IN KANSAS, WHERE WE SO SERIOUSLY NEED NEW RESOURCES TO

OPPONENTS OF THE SEVERANCE TAX ALSO TRY TO SAY THAT THE COST OF THE TAX WILL BE PASSED ON TO KANSAS CONSUMERS. THAT IS SIMPLY NOT TRUE. 70 PERCENT OF THE COST WILL BE PAID BY NON-KANSANS. IN FACT, ONLY 5 PERCENT WILL BE PAID BY RESIDENTIAL USERS IN KANSAS.

AND IT IS ONLY FAIR TO SHIFT THE BURDEN TO OTHER STATES BECAUSE WE

HAVE BEEN PAYING FOR ROADS AND SCHOOLS IN WYOMING, LOUISIANA, OKLAHOMA, AND TEXAS AS LONG AS WE'VE USED THEIR OIL AND GAS.

SO, THIS ELECTION COMES DOWN TO A FUNDAMENTAL QUESTION. WHO WILL

STATE GOVERNMENT IN KANSAS LOOK OUT FOR? I SAY THE BIG OIL AND GAS

PRODUCERS SHOULD PAY THEIR FAIR SHARE AND THAT WE SHOULD HOLD DOWN

PROPERTY TAXES AND GASOLINE TAXES FOR AVERAGE WORKING PEOPLE IN KANSAS.

MY OPPONENT SAYS THAT OIL AND GAS SHOULD NOT PAY AND, IN EFFECT, THAT

WE SHOULD INCREASE PROPERTY TAXES AND GASOLINE TAXES, OR NOT HAVE THE

QUALITY OF LIFE WE ALL EXPECT.

WE HAVE A LOT TO DO IN KANSAS OVER THE NEXT FOUR YEARS -- A LOT OF THINGS TO IMPROVE AND A LOT OF GOOD PROGRAMS TO CONTINUE.

THE QUESTION IN THIS ELECTION IS WHETHER THE OIL AND GAS INDUSTRY

AND THEIR POWERFUL LOBBYISTS WILL RUN THE STATE OR NOT.

I SAY NO. I SAY THE FUTURE OF KANSAS -- OUR ROADS AND BRIDGES,

OUR CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM, OUR SCHOOLS, AND OUR GOVERNMENT -- BELONGS
