Program Outlined and Adopted

Meeting held at State Headquarters

Thursday, Feb. 15th.

First: In order to bring before the State of Kansas the full plan and program of the National League in its campaign for national prohibition, and in order that we may co-operate in an intelligent and effective way, it is proposed to invite the National League to inaugurate a campaign of education.

(a) To inaugurate a great speaking campaign in which every village and city in the state should have an opportunity to hear at first-hand of the great national drive for national prohibition.

(b) That the National League provide us with all necessary literature bearing upon the national campaign, giving direction and enthusiasm.

(c) The immediate need is constant information. The National League having a great printing plant, the largest reform printing plant in the world, we direct our Superintendent to arrange with the publishing interests of the National League to provide us with the American Issue, the official organ in the prohibition campaign, which we understand has a circulation of a million a month.

Second: That the educational and Inspirational National Prohibition Campaign culminate in a great state wide National Prohibition Field day on Sunday, June 10th.

Third: That immediately following the Educational and Inspirational National Prohibition Campaign a great National Prohibition Congress be held in the Capitol City of the State, beginning Monday night, June 18th and continuing the 19th and 20th. That we invite all neighboring State Anti-Saloon Leagues and W. C. T. U. organizations to participate in this gathering.

Fourth: That this National Prohibition Congress be made the most notable gathering ever held upon this question, and that this Congress being held in the Capitol City of the pioneer prohibition state shall sound the key note and challenge the attention of the American Congress to speedily heed the voice of the people and submit at the earliest time possible a constitutional prohibition amendment.

Fifth: That a National Prohibition Club be organized consisting of State and County Officers, Business and Professional men, Ministers and College Professors, College and University Presidents, Editors, etc., who will be ready to respond to the call of the National League, to affiliate and co-operate with the same. That this National Prohibition Club plan at the proper time and at the call of the National League to charter a train and have not less than 500 of our leading citizens go to Washington in a body and there enter our firm demand for the submitting of a National Prohibition Amendment, and to participate in such demonstration deemed advisable which will command the attention of the entire nation, and place the great Sunflower State far in the lead in demanding the speedy destruction of the liquor traffic in the nation.

Sixth: That immediately at the close of the Kansas session of the legislature a compilation of all the liquor and reform laws be made and published, and that immediately an aggressive law enforcement campaign be inaugurated.

To this end we, your Headquarters Committee and Superintendent invite the hearty and enthusiastic co-operation of the temperance forces of Kansas.
