This item contains 4 bulletins published by the Kansas Emergency Relief Committee (KERC) and the Civil Works Administration (CWA) in Topeka, Kansas. The bulletins numbers are #127 (1924-1933), #289 (1934), #355 (1935), and # 380 (1936). The year listed by the bulletin number is the year covered; though the bulletin generally had a publication date sometime the next year. Bulletin Number 127 covers a ten year period from 1924-1933. This report has an introduction, information on the KERC; special programs of the KERC; state statistical summaries; and 105 county reports. Bulletin 289 covers state organization; accomplishments under Work Relief and CWA, special programs in the state and county in 1934; case load and expenditures; state and county statistical summaries; 105 county reports; wage rates, labor relations, and complaints; economic conditions affecting relief load; grants and loans from State and Federal Agencies other than Relief; and maps and charts. Bulletin Number 355 covers the Relief Department, Accounting and Finance Department, Engineering Department; state and county statistical summary; 105 county statistical reports; relief obligations and case load, Homestead Rehabilitation Department; economic conditions affecting relief load; relief appropriations and relief laws; the coordination of public and private welfare service; grants and loans from federal state agencies other than relief. Bulletin Number 380 covers Legislation of 1936, social service development in 1936; case load and case work service and the cost of public assistance and administration; accounting procedures for funds, equipment, materials and commodities; production and distribution projects; Boards of County Commissioners and County Social Welfare Personnel; KERC publications, KERC Audit Reports, and KERC Personnel and Pay Rolls. Also, information on the State and Social Welfare Building, Trust Deed, and the Kansas Homestead Rehabilitation Corporation, State Charter and KHRC Audit Reports. Each of the first three bulletins has an index at the end.

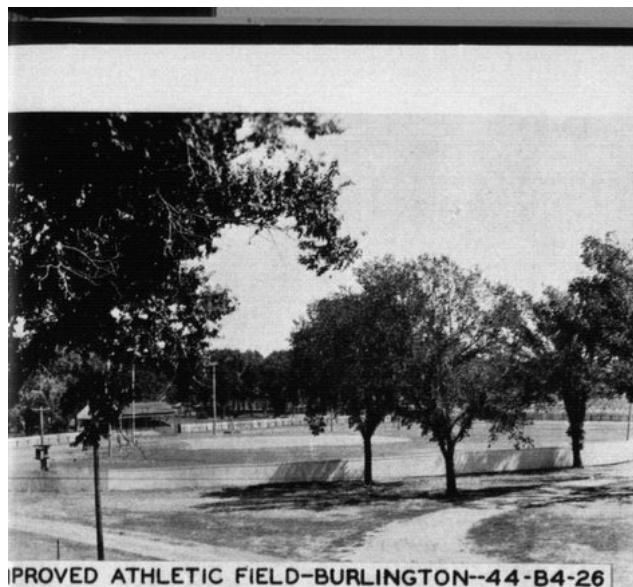

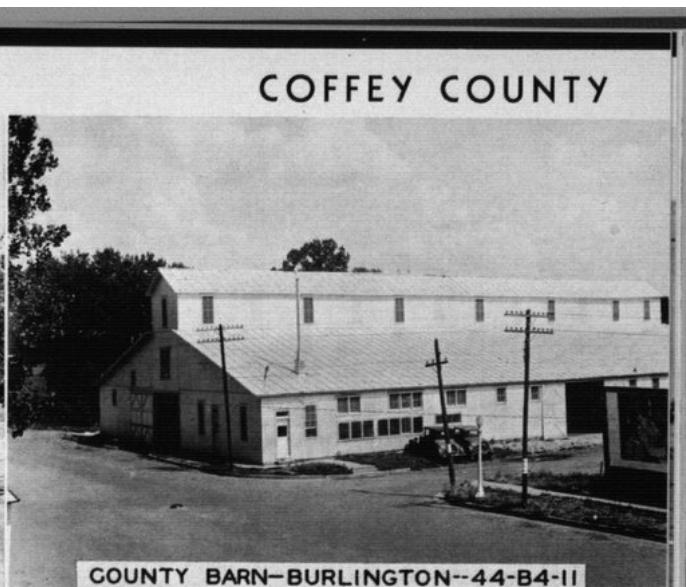

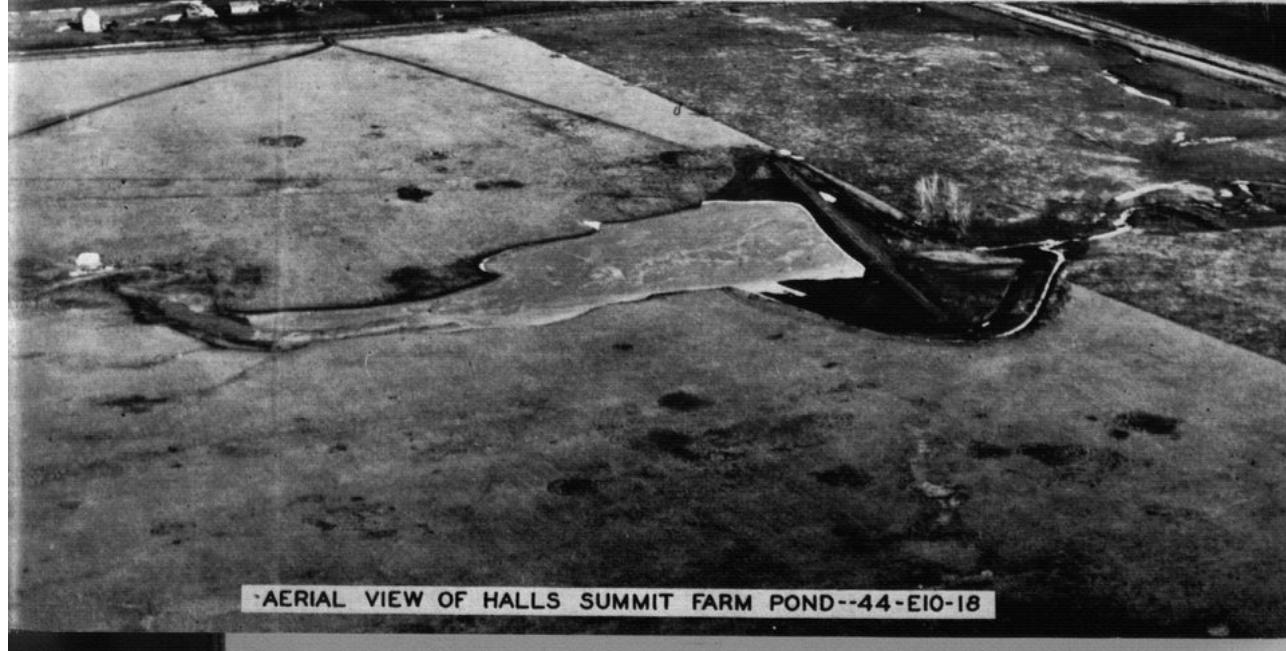

WORK RELIEF AND CWA, OCTOBER, 1932, THROUGH DECEMBER, 1934

The work relief and CWA programs in Comanche county, between October, 1932, and December 31, 1934, were almost entirely confined to road work, although repairs on public buildings were important.

An inventory of physical accomplishments in the county for the entire period shows that 19 miles of state highway and 23 miles of county and township roads were graded, eight bridges and large culverts and six small culverts were built; and one-half mile of water main was laid at Protection. Two city halls at Coldwater and Protection, the courthouse at Coldwater, and 22 schoolhouses were improved, and park improvements were made at Protection. Water conservation work included construction of 12 garden ponds and seven farm dams.

Under the CWA, a number of pile bridges were constructed which have been of considerable help in taking care of the bridge needs. Among other projects completed were: Construction of the Protection township library at Protection, a building of modern design and good materials; improvement of the courthouse basement; remodeling of the municipal building at Coldwater; the reroofing and installing of oak floors in the city hall at Protection; and the installation of 89 sanitation units.

Important contributions to county welfare have been the nursing service and the sewing rooms at Coldwater, Protection, and Wilmore, which produced a total of 8,305 garments, the county relief administration reports. Through the former, both practical and trained nurses were employed at work which was of permanent benefit to health conditions in the county.

The two main sources of income for Comanche county, cattle and wheat raising, were ruined by below-normal dryness 1934, and, according to reports from the county, the relief load had increased by the end of the year. Drought conditions left the local farmers without crops for from three to five years, depending upon their location, since rainfall was not the same over the entire area during that period. Farmers, therefore, with resources exhausted, particularly after the dry summer of 1934, were forced on relief for support. Employment naturally was influenced by farm production, so that all persons who previously had found work during at least part of the year, also were thrown on relief.

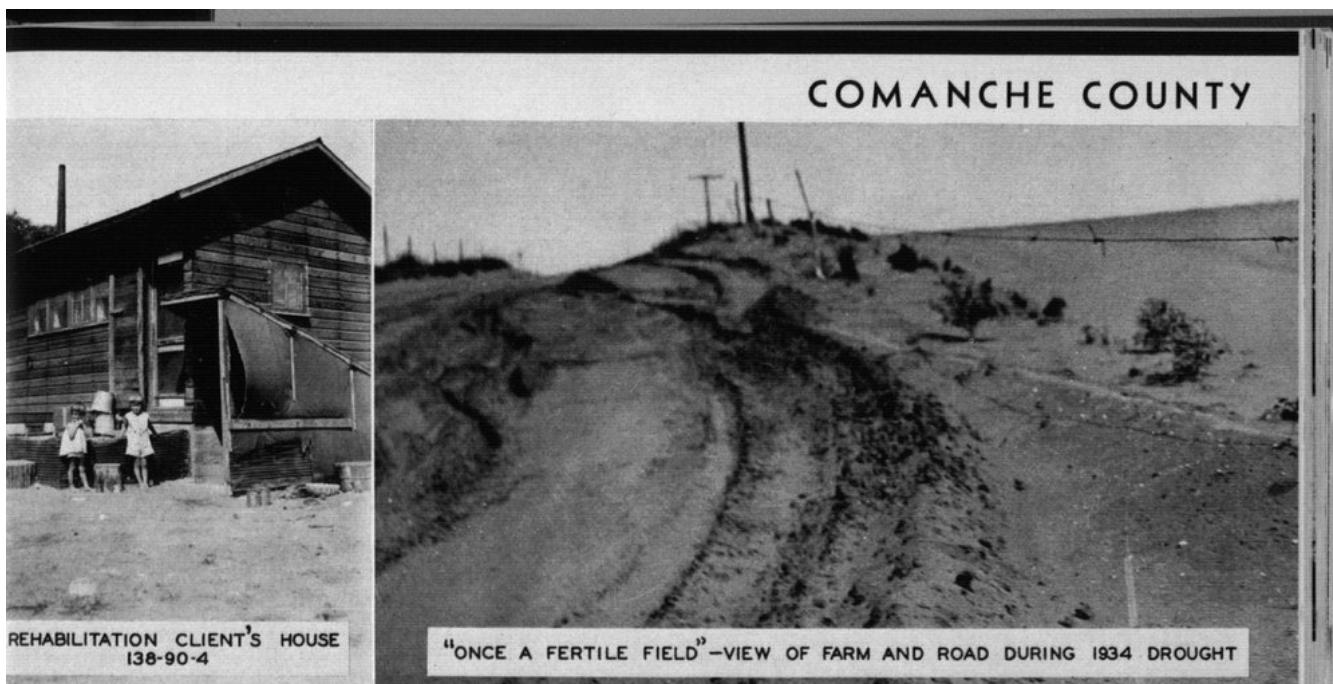

Cowley county projects under the CWA and work relief programs (October, 1932, through December, 1934) were divided into three general classifications: City improvement, park and recreation, park buildings, streets, and cemeteries; improvement of bridges and flood drainage, and community and government relief work.

By the close of 1934 the city park and cemetery at Arkansas City had been improved as had the grounds around the public library and the high school athletic field there. Parks and cemeteries also were improved at Burden, Atlanta, and Udall, and work was done on parks at Cambridge and Dexter as well. Public buildings repaired included the city hall, library, and one schoolhouse at Arkansas City, the courthouse, and the garage at the state hospital at Winfield. County storage shops were built at Burden and Arkansas City, and a new building was erected in Arkansas City to house the relief administration. At the poor farm a barn was constructed almost entirely of native stone.

As flood prevention measures, drainage ditches were cleaned north and west of Arkansas City, and the channel of the Arkansas river was cleared in several places. Dikes were extended along the river northwest of Arkansas City and along the banks of Walnut river. This work was especially worthwhile, according to county officials, for the land in that section is low and each flood causes thousands of dollars of damage. In addition, work was done on the improving of 170 miles of county and township roads and 19 miles of state highway. Roads were straightened by making rock cuts and fills some of which were 15 inches deep, and 32 bridges and culverts were built. One hundred six blocks of streets were improved.

Under the water conservation program 24 miles of emergency pipe line were laid, connecting the City of Udall with river and creek water supplies; 21 emergency wells were drilled, 13 farm ponds constructed, and six emergency pumping plants set up. Twelve septic tanks were improved.

Approximately 6,150 garments were produced in sewing rooms at Winfield and Arkansas City.

The rapid advance in numbers on the relief roll during 1934 was due to drought conditions, the local relief administration reports.

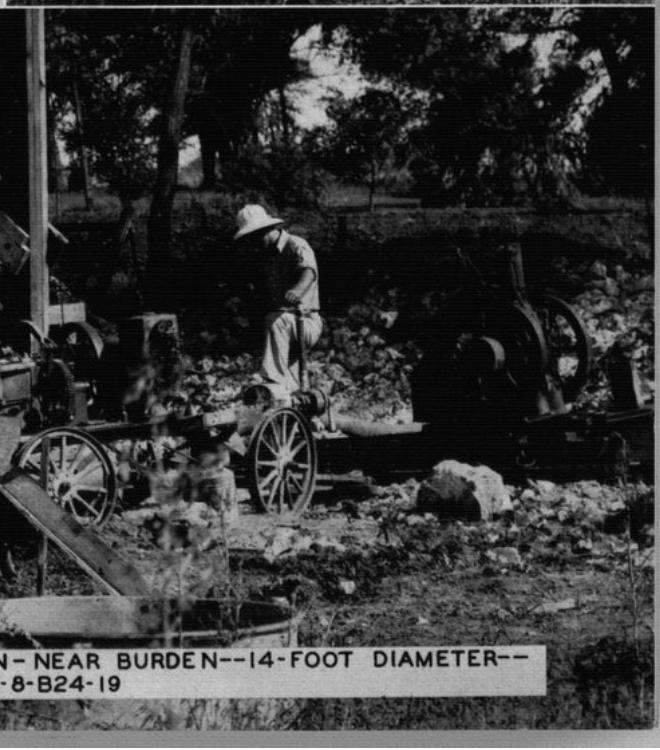

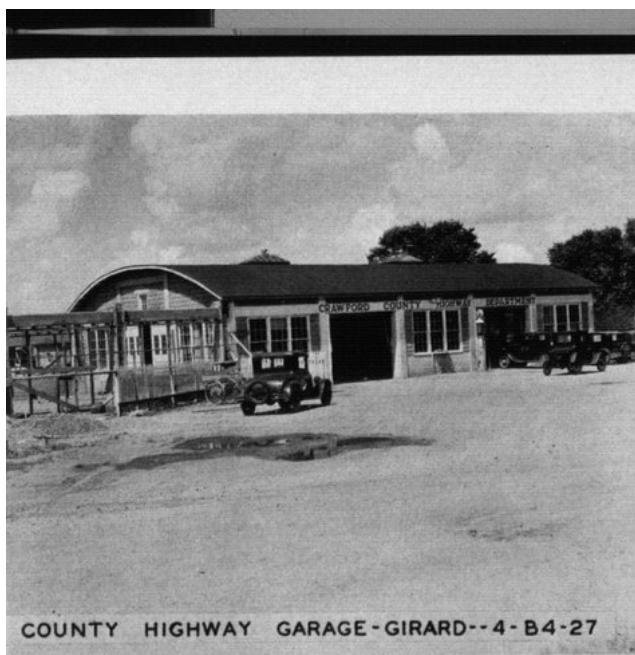

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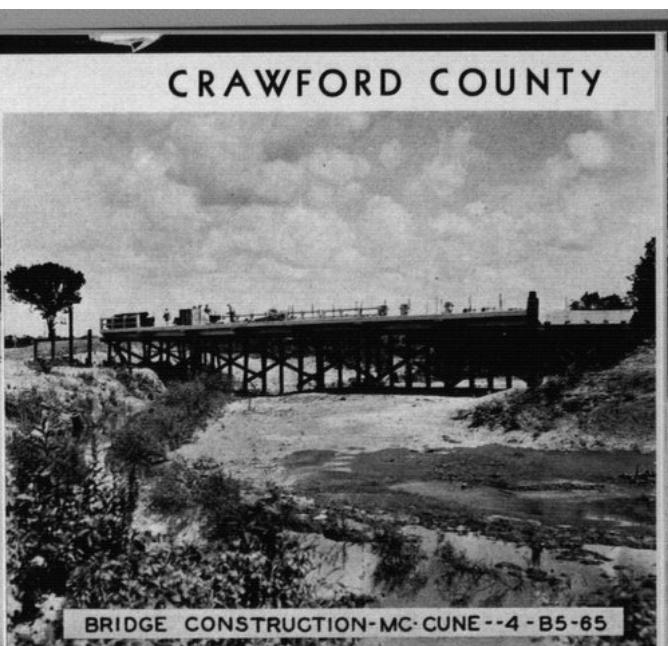

WORK RELIEF AND CWA, OCTOBER, 1932, THROUGH DECEMBER, 1934

Building the dam for Jennings lake, clearing the lake valley of trees, and building the protecting fence kept most of the work relief laborers busy in Decatur county during 1934. When finished, this county lake will cover approximately 68 acres. A soup kitchen operating in a dugout near the dam site proved popular in cold weather.

As in most counties, road work was an important part of the work relief and CWA programs from October, 1932, through December, 1934. Approximately 110 miles of county and township roads and 34 blocks of city streets at Oberlin, Jennings, and Noreatur were improved. One of the best projects under the CWA provided for the building of a road around a lake about two miles north of Oberlin which was formed by a state highway fill, damming a small creek with a large drainage area. The lake was practically inaccessible before construction of the road. Four bridges and large culverts and four small culverts were constructed in connection with the road work.

Approximately 1,000 feet of water mains were laid at Oberlin and some 2,500 feet of river improvement was made under the general programs. The courthouse at Oberlin was improved along with six schoolhouses and two other public buildings. Four sanitation units were installed, a wading pool was improved as well as a park at Jennings, and three playgrounds were improved at Oberlin and Noreatur. Women workers on the sewing room project at Oberlin turned out approximately 1,650 garments. A thistle-baling project put up 84 tons of Russian thistle. Water conservation measures in addition to the Jennings lake included the construction of 35 farm ponds.

Decatur county was hit hard by the 1934 drought. No market or feed crops were raised, and farmers, badly in debt, had to sell most of their livestock because they could not afford to buy feed. After exhausting all their resources they were forced to turn to relief. Obviously enough farmers could not hire farm laborers, so that class also was forced to turn to relief. The county relief administration reports, however, that the farmers did not wish to accept a dole but were pleased and eager to earn their budgets on work relief projects.
