This item contains 4 bulletins published by the Kansas Emergency Relief Committee (KERC) and the Civil Works Administration (CWA) in Topeka, Kansas. The bulletin numbers are #127 (1924-1933), #289 (1934), #355 (1935), and #380 (1936). The year listed by the bulletin number is the year covered; though the bulletin generally had a publication date sometime the next year. Bulletin Number 127 covers a ten year period from 1924-1933. This report has an introduction, information on the KERC; special programs of the KERC; state statistical summaries; and 105 county reports. Bulletin 289 covers state organization; accomplishments under Work Relief and CWA, special programs in the state and county in 1934; case load and expenditures; state and county statistical summaries; 105 county reports; wage rates, labor relations, and complaints; economic conditions affecting relief load; grants and loans from State and Federal Agencies other than Relief; and maps and charts. Bulletin Number 355 covers the Relief Department, Accounting and Finance Department, Engineering Department; state and county statistical summary; 105 county statistical reports; relief obligations and case load, Homestead Rehabilitation Department; economic conditions affecting relief load; relief appropriations and relief laws; the coordination of public and private welfare service; grants and loans from federal state agencies other than relief. Bulletin Number 380 covers Legislation of 1936, social service development in 1936; case load and case work service and the cost of public assistance and administration; accounting procedures for funds, equipment, materials and commodities; production and distribution projects; Boards of County Commissioners and County Social Welfare Personnel; KERC publications, KERC Audit Reports, and KERC Personnel and Pay Rolls. Also, information on the State and Social Welfare Building, Trust Deed, and the Kansas Homestead Rehabilitation Corporation, State Charter and KHRC Audit Reports. Each of the first three bulletins has an index at the end.

WORK RELIEF AND CWA, OCTOBER, 1932, THROUGH DECEMBER, 1934

Surfacing of the county roads with gravel to make all-weather connections between small communities and the state highway system has been an important improvement in Saline county under the CWA and work relief programs (October, 1932, through December, 1934). At the close of 1934, 140 miles of county and township roads and 14 miles of state highway had been improved, nine bridges and large culverts had been built, 10 small culverts constructed, and 25 plank floor bridges repaired. Local red gravel was used on the roads in most instances. South of the City of Gypsum, however, the county used a gypsum shale for surfacing with excellent results, according to CWA reports.

Other improvements included repair of 74 rooms in 26 schoolhouses, located in various parts of the county, as well as in the cities of Assaria, Brookville, Gypsum, Glendale, Bayaria, and Kip. Six sanitation units were installed. As water conservation measures 31 farm ponds and two emergency wells were constructed.

Salina also made many improvements. Work on streets consisted of filling in bad cracks and repairing of large sections by removing car tracks and then paving. Center parks in one street were removed for some distance and replaced with gravel. Sidewalks and sewers also were repaired. A park was built on a 20-acre tract in the northwest section of the city, and in the main city park a project for a formal garden was carried out. This latter work included a change of entrance columns, sidewalks, and streets. Drives in the fairgrounds were improved with shale, the buildings improved by painting, and the grandstand underpinning reinforced. Landing facilities were expanded at the Salina airport. Public building improvement in Salina consisted of painting and repairing of the Memorial building and general repair of school buildings.

Two sewing rooms and a mattress factory, the first to be opened as a work relief project in the state, were developed as projects for women workers. During 1934 a total of 1,331 mattresses was produced.

The employment situation did not improve materially in 1934, local relief officials report, and consequently the relief rolls were increased. The drought was the most vital factor influencing the situation, although curtailed activities among the railroad companies also added to the relief rolls.

STREET AND BRIDGE IMPROVEMENTS

The street (upper left) was the first in Salina to be paved. Before relief workers turned the brick, it was one of the roughest streets in the city; now it is one of the best.

This county road was straightened by eliminating curves and making channel changes (lower left). A standard double 6 by 14-foot reinforced concrete box culvert (background) was built over a drainage channel.

REMODELING PARKS AND JAIL

Oakdale and Kenwood Parks (right) were improved on related projects. Work included grading and planting of trees and shrubbery, painting and repairing of buildings and grandstands, and construction of concrete lily pools and tennis courts. The view at Oakdale Park was taken from the diving tower in the swimming pool, looking down upon the pagoda and flower bed.

Lower right, the old jail was remodeled to provide relief administration offices. Brick supporting walls were relaid to insure safety, new flooring laid, and stairs constructed.

WORK RELIEF AND CWA, OCTOBER, 1932, THROUGH DECEMBER, 1935

The principal work in Scott county done by relief labor has been the improving of county roads, particularly drainage conditions, city street repair, and the construction of farm and garden ponds which was begun in the summer of 1934 under the water conservation program. Under the relief program which began in October, 1932, and continued until November, 1933, when the CWA started, a large per cent of the work projects was set up to repair flood damage to roads along Beaver creek and the state park in the north central part of the county. Most of the road work, however, which consisted of surfacing, grading, and culvert construction, was done under Civil Works. By the close of 1934, when the work relief program was in operation, 50 miles of county and township roads had been improved, 100 blocks of streets had been improved, and 10 culverts placed where needed. Street improvements were made to the greatest extent in Scott City.

Outstanding projects in the county have been the construction of an athletic field at the Scott City high school and general improvements made at the state park. This new athletic field covers 10 acres and has a lighted ball diamond, a cinder track, and a newly constructed grandstand.

The repair of 16 rooms in five schoolhouses, two at Scott City, one at Manning, one at Shallow Water, and one at Modoc, has been of great benefit to the communities involved. Other improvements made throughout the county consisted of the construction of 45 garden ponds and 11 farm ponds, construction of 15 community sanitation units, cleaning of one sewage disposal plant and the laying of 220 feet of sanitary sewer at Scott City, and work on four playgrounds located at various schools in the county. The relief offices located at Scott City also underwent repairs.

The establishment of a sewing room at Scott City in December, 1934, gave employment to women work relief clients.

The relief load in Scott county was increased during 1934 because of adverse weather conditions. Crop failures were general throughout the county, and in addition to the lack of employment for farm laborers the farmers also needed work of some sort to support their families.

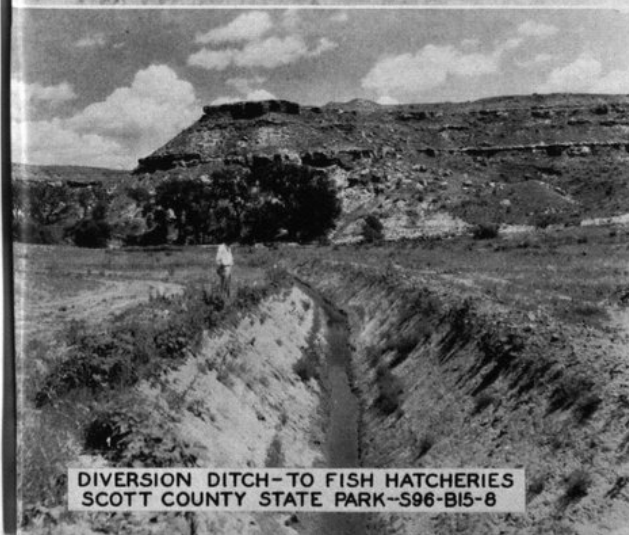

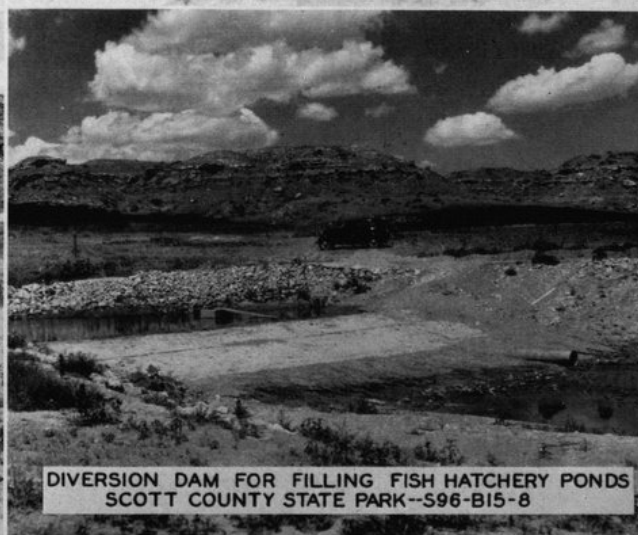

WORK RELIEF AND CWA, OCTOBER, 1932, THROUGH DECEMBER, 1934

Road and park improvements, in addition to repair of public buildings, were most extensive in Sedgwick county under the work relief and CWA programs, October, 1932, through December, 1934. Approximately 550 miles of roads were improved and eight bridges and large culverts and 513 small culverts were constructed. Street projects included the paving of 36 blocks in Wichita and the sanding of 215 blocks in Cheney and other towns throughout the county. Eleven parks, covering between 300 and 400 acres, were improved; work on eight of them was begun in Wichita under the CWA. In all parks, landscaping work was done and benches were renewed. Forty-three playgrounds also were improved.

The courthouse and city hall at Wichita and 865 rooms in 51 schoolhouses were repaired. Other improvements made principally in Wichita included work on the exposition building, boys' and girls' detention homes, county home and hospital, McLain fountain, municipal warehouse, city jail, and municipal museum. The project for remodeling the old fire station and converting it into a city jail and police headquarters was an outstanding CWA project. Runways and landing facilities were improved at the Wichita airport.

Under flood control projects seven miles of Arkansas river improvement was completed, chiefly near Ackerman Island. The river channel was diverted at this point to minimize flood damage. Two emergency wells and 27 farm ponds were constructed. Six sewing rooms in Wichita produced 12,007 garments and the mattress factory 1,405 mattresses. A total of 2,681,838 cans of beef was processed at the Wichita canning plant.

General projects included shoe repair (17,000 pairs), feed production, a laundry project (operated in connection with the canning plant), and a project for drafting county plans. Four hundred fifty sanitation units were installed and 4,720 feet of sanitary sewer laid, in addition to the improvement of a sewage disposal plant. An extensive playground program was developed in Wichita in the summer of 1934.

The outstanding development in public welfare service during 1934 was the development of a case working staff adequate to care for the needs of an increased case load, the county relief administration reports. The case load which each staff worker was forced to care for was cut approximately three-fourths during the year. A closer cooperation between private and public welfare agencies also resulted.

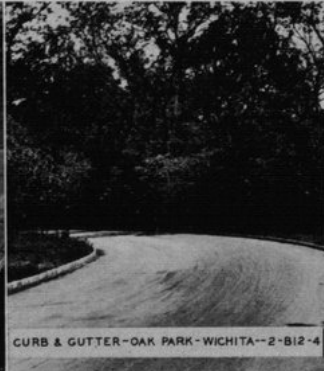

WICHITA AIRPORT FROM THE AIR

Wichita municipal airport (upper left), one of the outstanding Kansas landing fields, is on several important air routes. Improvements were begun by CWA workers who repainted the telephone poles around the airport and cones on the field, graded the park area, and graveled drives. Work relief laborers landscaped the grounds in front of the airport building, planted trees and shrubbery, and constructed cement taxi strips.

NEW MUNICIPAL STADIUM AND BATHHOUSES

Many Wichita improvements were designed to produce better athletic opportunities for youthful residents. Every park in the city was improved, and pictures at the right show typical improvements. At Lincoln Park (above) a swimming pool already installed was remodeled, principally for use by children, and a bathhouse of colonial architecture built. At Seneca Park the pool was improved, a new bathhouse constructed, and tennis courts built.

Two views of Wichita municipal stadium are shown at the right. The stadium is of reinforced concrete and was built in connection with a new athletic field. Seats originally were provided for 2,500 people, but additional sections were built.

MAKING COMFORTERS AND CANNING BEEF

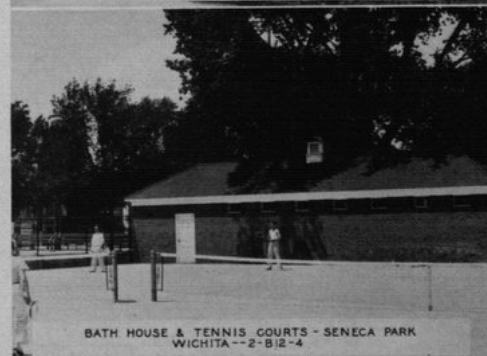

WORK RELIEF AND CWA, OCTOBER, 1932, THROUGH DECEMBER, 1934

Work relief labor in Seward county during 1934 was employed to a great extent on street and road improvement, although repair of school buildings and construction of farm ponds have been equally important accomplishments. Road work was distributed well over the county and more than 300 miles of county and township roads and 17 miles of state highway were improved during the operation of the work relief and CWA programs from October, 1932, until the close of 1934. Thirty-three culverts were built in connection with the road work. The city of Liberal graded and graveled approximately 30 blocks of streets and the city of Kismet graded and graveled nearly all the streets in the town. Under the drought relief program the State Highway Commission surfaced 30 miles of roads.

Public property improvements at Liberal included work on the city hall and library, one park, a playground, a swimming and wading pool, and one cemetery. An artificial lake was constructed at the sewage disposal plant which has been made into a game reserve for migrating birds. The high school buildings at both Liberal and Kismet were redecorated, and the high school athletic field at the former was graded and sodded and a sprinkling system installed. The park board at Liberal sponsored an airport project to expand and improve the landing field. Runways were graded and surfaced with gravel.

Improvements in various sections of the county consisted of work on six rural school-houses, the construction of 49 garden ponds and two farm ponds under the water conservation program, and the installation of 36 sanitation units. The latter project employed from eight to ten men steadily. Late in the year approximately 30,000 rabbits were killed in a jackrabbit eradication project.

A sewing room operated at Liberal for women work relief clients who produced 4,143 garments during 1934.

County relief officials believe that if it had not been for the drought the number of persons on relief would have been greatly reduced by the end of 1934. However, approximately the same number of names appeared on the relief rolls then as at the first of the year. An important development of the local relief administration was the employment and training of an adequate staff of case workers.

TYPICAL DROUGHT PICTURES

The pasture (upper photograph) and the ghost cornfield (center right) are typical examples of farm and pasture lands in the western part of the state during the drought of 1934. Seward county, situated in the south-western part of the state, was designated as one of the original 18 drought counties where conditions were particularly bad. These views show grass and crops dead or dying, seared by the hot winds and stunted by lack of adequate rainfall.

SEWAGE DISPOSAL PLANT IMPROVEMENT

The flume (lower left), constructed by digging a V-shaped ditch and lining it with concrete, was built as a part of a project for the disposal of sewage at Liberal. This flume is a part of the effluent line.

RETAINING WALL ALONG CREEK BANK

This rock retaining wall (bottom center) was built along Can creek at Liberal to direct the flow of water in times of heavy rainfall and to prevent temporary overflows and floods. Native stone, laid in a dry rock wall, was quarried and placed by work relief laborers.

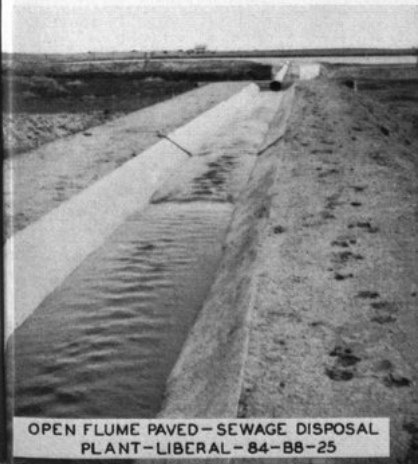

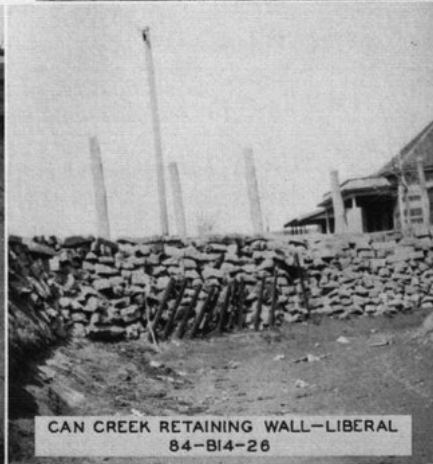

WORK RELIEF AND CWA, OCTOBER, 1932, THROUGH DECEMBER, 1934
Accomplishments under the water conservation program were an outstanding part of the work relief program in Shawnee county during 1934, although road and general improvement work was carried on extensively. Special projects including a canning plant and mattress factory also provided extensive employment.

A total of 13 farm ponds was built under the water conservation program, 21 emergency wells were drilled, and an emergency pumping plant was set up to alleviate water shortages. More than one mile of emergency water pipe line was laid, and nearly a mile of channel change was made under flood control projects. One cistern was cleaned at Rossville.

Under the work relief and CWA programs (October, 1932, through December, 1934) approximately 150 miles of county and township roads were improved by resurfacing with oil or by surface widening with gravel and 64 miles were otherwise improved; about 4,000 cubic yards of banks and 20,000 cubic yards of bluffs were sloped; and 24 bridges and large culverts were constructed. Eight county quarries and five state highway quarries produced 59,500 and 47,000 cubic yards of rock, respectively, for use on the roads. Streets were improved at Willard.

Nineteen parks, 12 playgrounds, and 45 public buildings were improved and 289 sanitation units were installed under the general building and repair programs. Also eight miles of water main and .86 mile of storm sewer were laid. Among buildings and grounds improved at Topeka were the courthouse, a fire station, industrial school, county garage shop, poor farm, fairgrounds, libraries, school grounds, and the Topeka airport. The sewing room at Topeka produced 144,212 garments, the Topeka mattress factory 1,750 mattresses, and the canning plant there processed 838,000 cans of beef.

Shawnee county made rapid strides in public welfare service during 1934, according to county relief officials. The relief administration changed from a commissary type to an accredited case working agency, and the standard of relief-giving was definitely raised. Weekly meetings of the county emergency relief committee were held throughout the year to devise better methods of giving aid to clients, and the weekly news bulletin, issued from the county relief office, has been a helpful medium in settling questions which have arisen in reference to relief problems and in keeping the clients and the public informed as to progress.

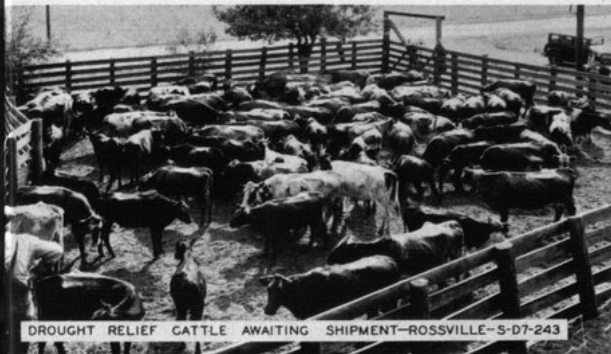
