#### Osage County organization records

In order for an unorganized county to be recognized by the state of Kansas, a certain number of householders/legal electors had to petition the governor. The governor would appoint a census taker. Initially, unorganized counties were required to document that they had at least 600 inhabitants in order to be recognized as a county by the state legislature. Over time the number of residents needed to organize a county changed to 1500 and later to 2500 residents. The census was submitted to the governor who then issued a proclamation indicating that the requirements had been met, appointing county commissioners and a county clerk, and naming a county seat. Not all of these documents are available for each county.

Included in this file is a letter declaring Burlingame the county seat of Osage County.

Whereas, at an election held in orage bounds hunses, on the 14th day of march 1. 1. 1869, for the perfer of selecting a place for the temperary location for the County Seat for Said County, the entire number of botes cut for said location was two hundred and this teen, of which the town of Burlingarou of said Co, received one hundred and their eight botes, versaelles Seventy four and Havana on, Now, therefore, the town of Burlingame having received a majority of all the lotes Cast is hereby weclared to be the legal County Seat of Said County-In lestimony whereof we have hereunto digned and names and affixed The Seal of the Courty this first day of april a.D. 1869 By S. a. Jairchild Depy of Board of Commoners
