"Sac & Fox now on Res no 417. Still
with great reluctance that they submit
to the innovations of civilization
and Christianization - would not
the past year, when allow some of the
more religiously inclined members
of the Baptist Church to build a house
of worship - The school averages
29 1/2 daily attendance, wheat
averaged 15 bu per acre

Mo Ko ho co Band
They were brought down to the Res
in the early part of Dec last, but
nearly all have returned to their



former home in Kansas and
are living vagabond lives and
intruders on the citizens' lands
there - This band now numbers
about 100 souls - - - - -
