ED. News: On the 2d of Sept. the Illinois picnicers assembled at the beautiful grove of J. J. Davis', on Cherry creek. People were there from all over the county. After an old-fashioned picnic dinner, of which there was plenty for all, the assembly was called to order by president Davis, who introduced the Hon. L. W. Leplinger, of Humboldt, to the audience. Mr. Keplinger held the crowd spell-bound for one half an hour by his eloquent address. He showed the contrast between the early settlement of Illinois and Kansas; how much faster Kansas is being settled than Illinois was. He also touched lightly en the all-absorbing topic of the day, the prohibitory amendment to the constitution of Kansas. A vote of thanks was tendered Mr. Keplinger for his eloquent ad-The following officers were elected for the ensuing year: President-J. J. Davis, Everett. Vice-Presidents-J. W. Depew, Center; D. W. Finney, Neosho Falls; J. Robbins, Belmont; A. F. Darst, Eminence; D. Crist, Perry; J. H. Bayer, Owl Creek; W. W. Smith, Everett; H. S. Trueblood, Liberty. Secretary and Treasurer-C. A. Smith, Center. The Davis grove was the place selected for the next pienic. The name of "Picnic Association" was changed to "The Illinois Kansas Picnic Association." The next picnic will be held on the first Thursday in September, 1881. Committee of Arrangements-C. A. Smith, Center; Wm. Frevert and Wm. Blandy, Owl Creek; D. Babione, Belmont; Geo. Inge, N. Falls. C. A. SMITH, Sec. Picnic. The fourth annual picnic of the Illinois pienic association will be held June 16th, 1881, at the Davis Grove, 7 miles southwest of Neosho Falls.
