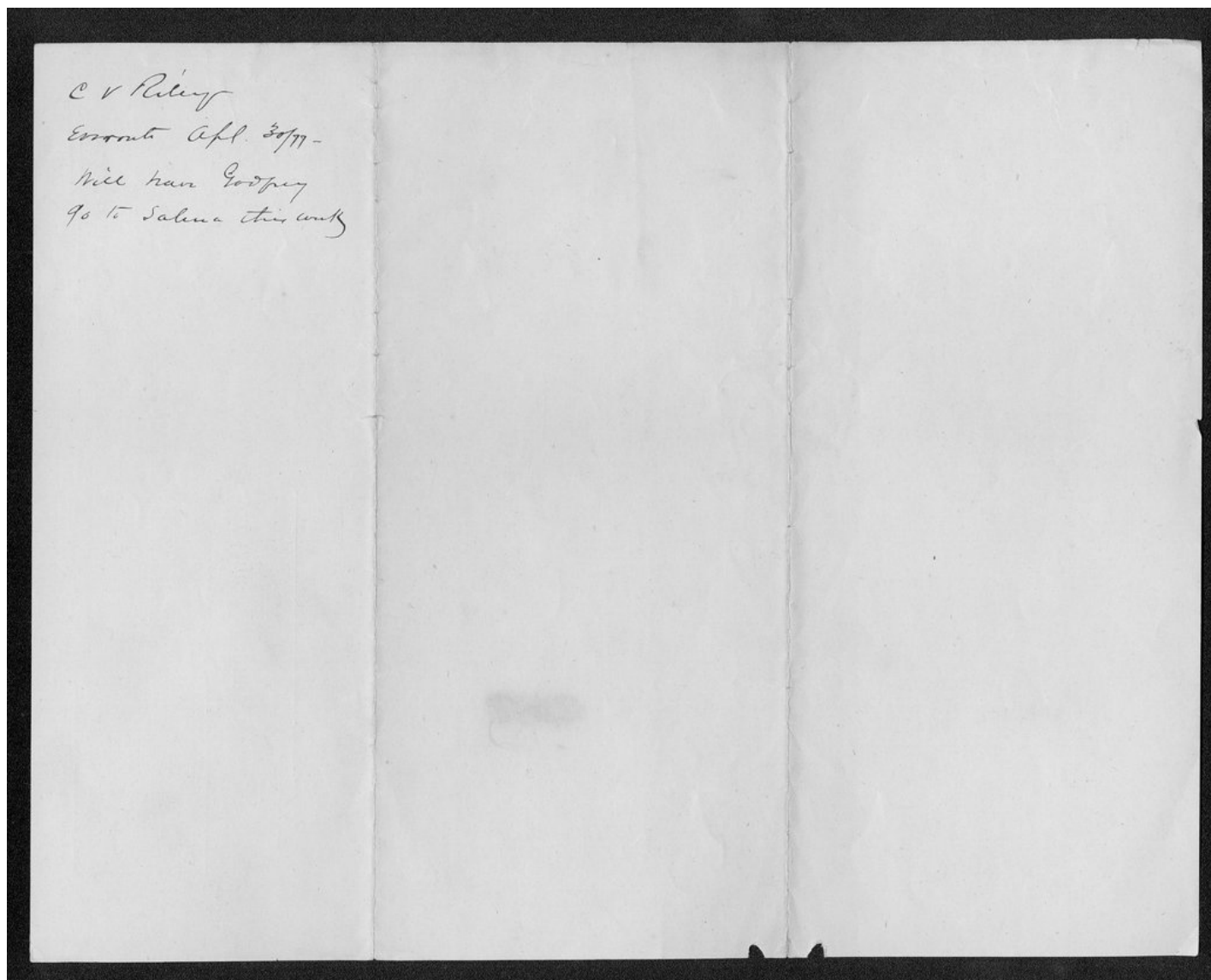
If you see Mr. Gray, tell him that I will send the Victoria Report by you when you return to Topeka.

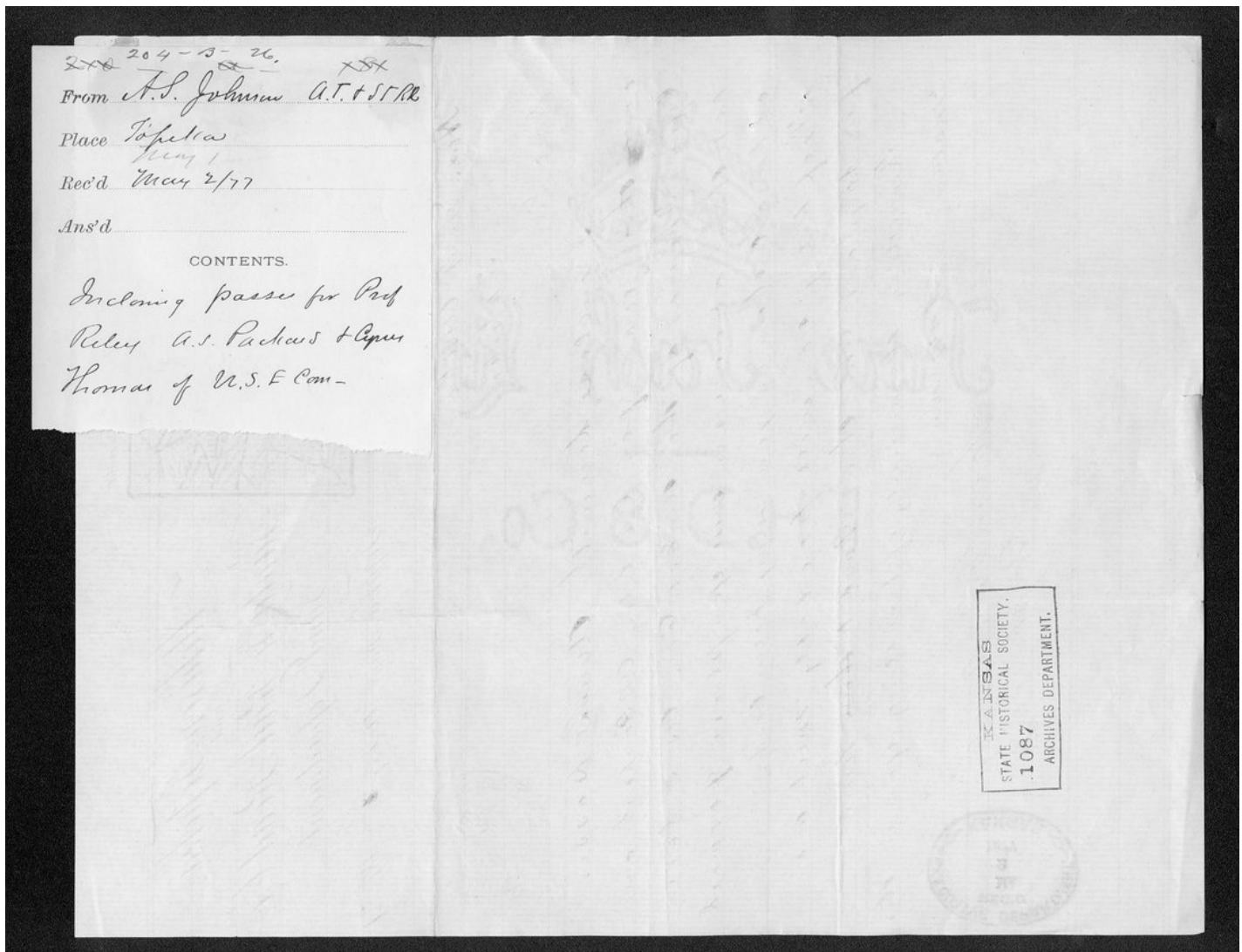

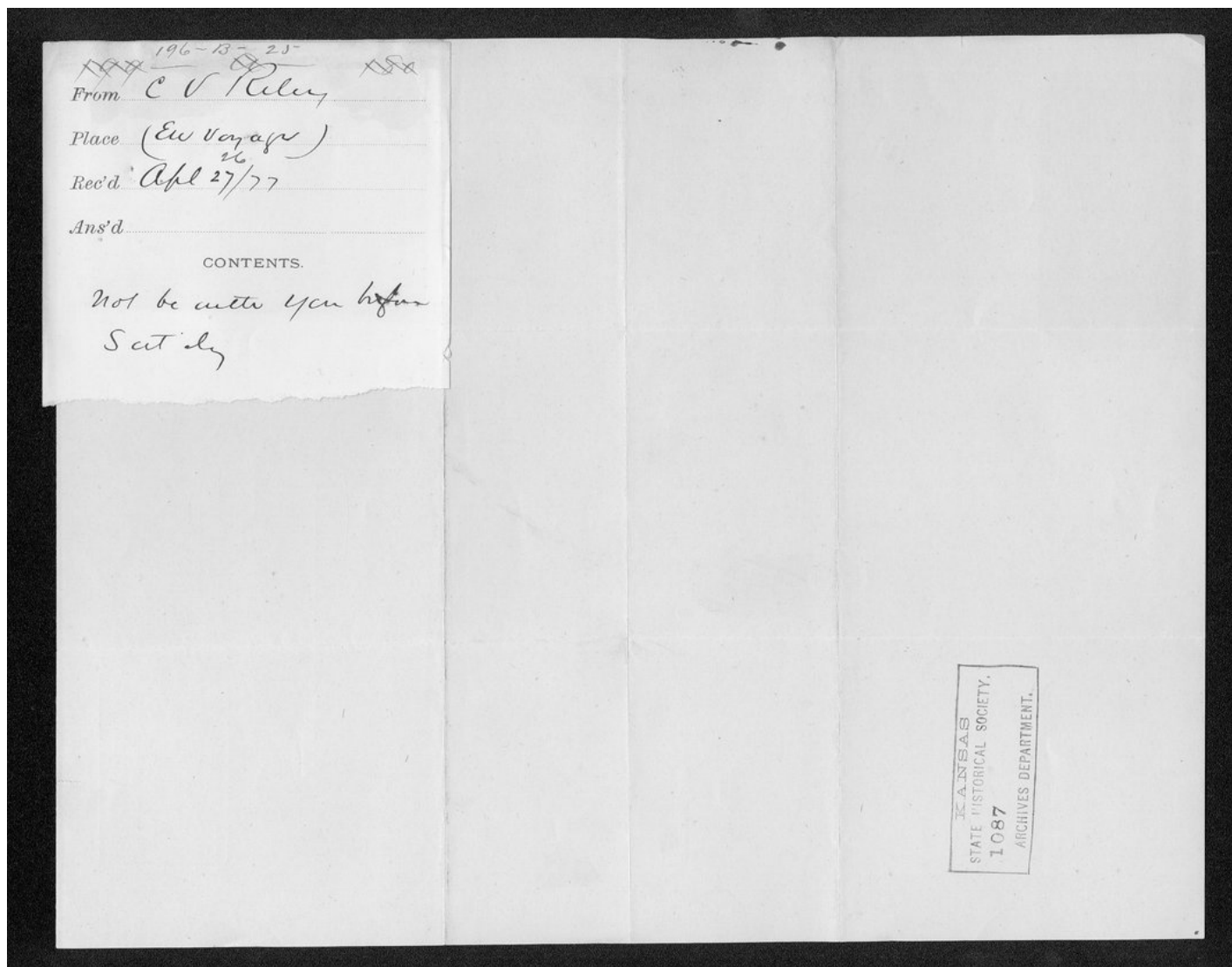

My dear Sir:

On behalf of the U. S. Ent. Comm. recently created I desire to say that the 5 Commissioners and the \$25,000⁰⁰ asked for by the Omaha Conference, were reduced to 3, and \$18,000⁰⁰, and while we may feel grateful for this recognition, the reduction in the appropriation very much weakens our power for efficient work, by limiting to a very small sum the means that can be used for special assistants. It becomes all the more imperative, therefore, that the Commission endeavor to secure the coöperation of the States interested, in accordance with the first resolution ^{on} ~~of~~ p. 22.

of the Omaha pamphlet. I write to urge upon you, if it be in your power, to appoint some one in your State to coöperate with the Commission. If the principal States interested would appropriate or pay out of the contingent fund simply \$100 ⁰⁰/₁₀₀, and coöperate with the Government thus much, it would greatly assist the Commission in the work in those States respectfully.

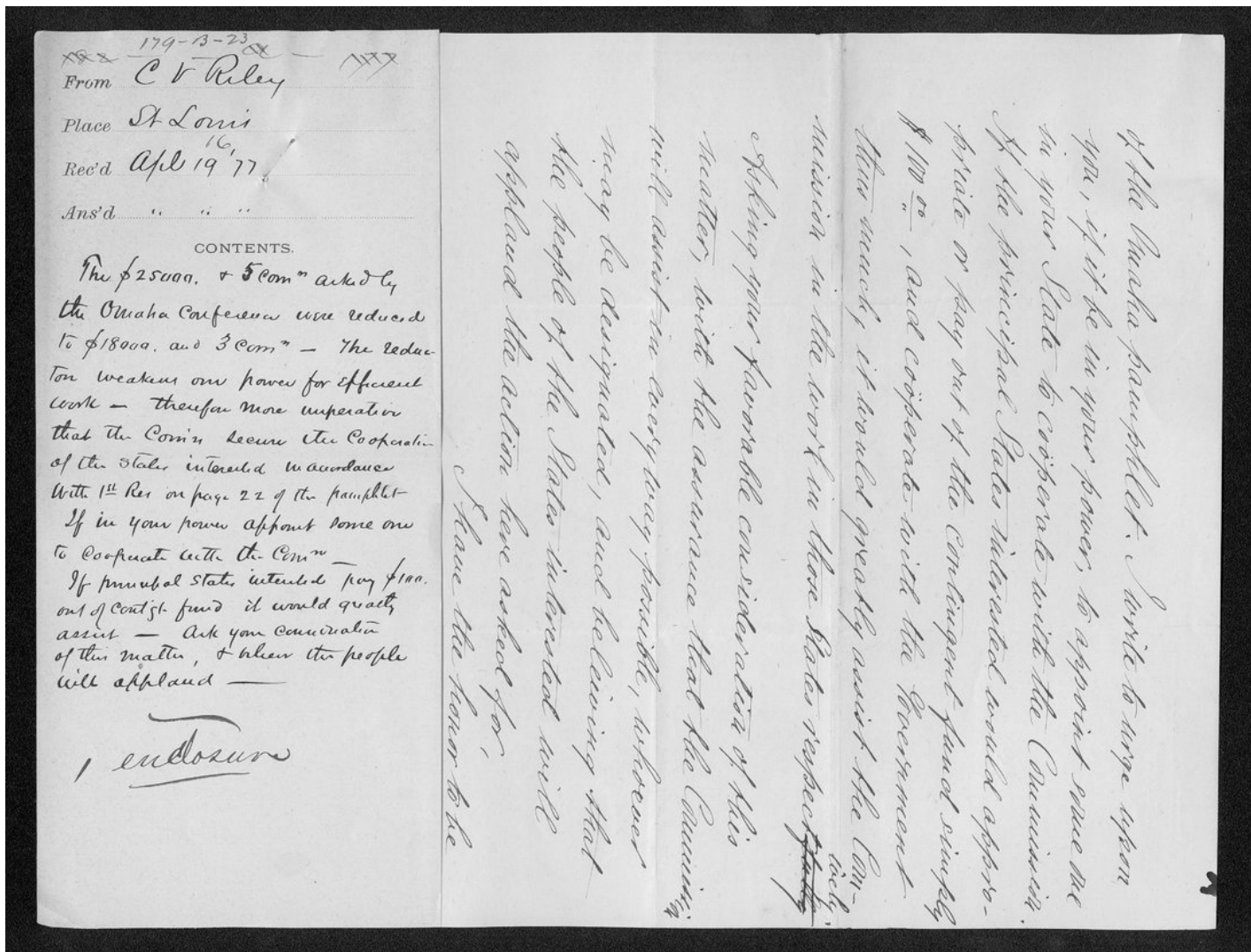

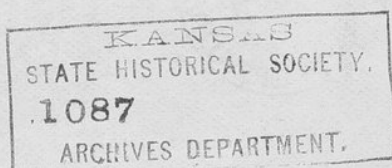
