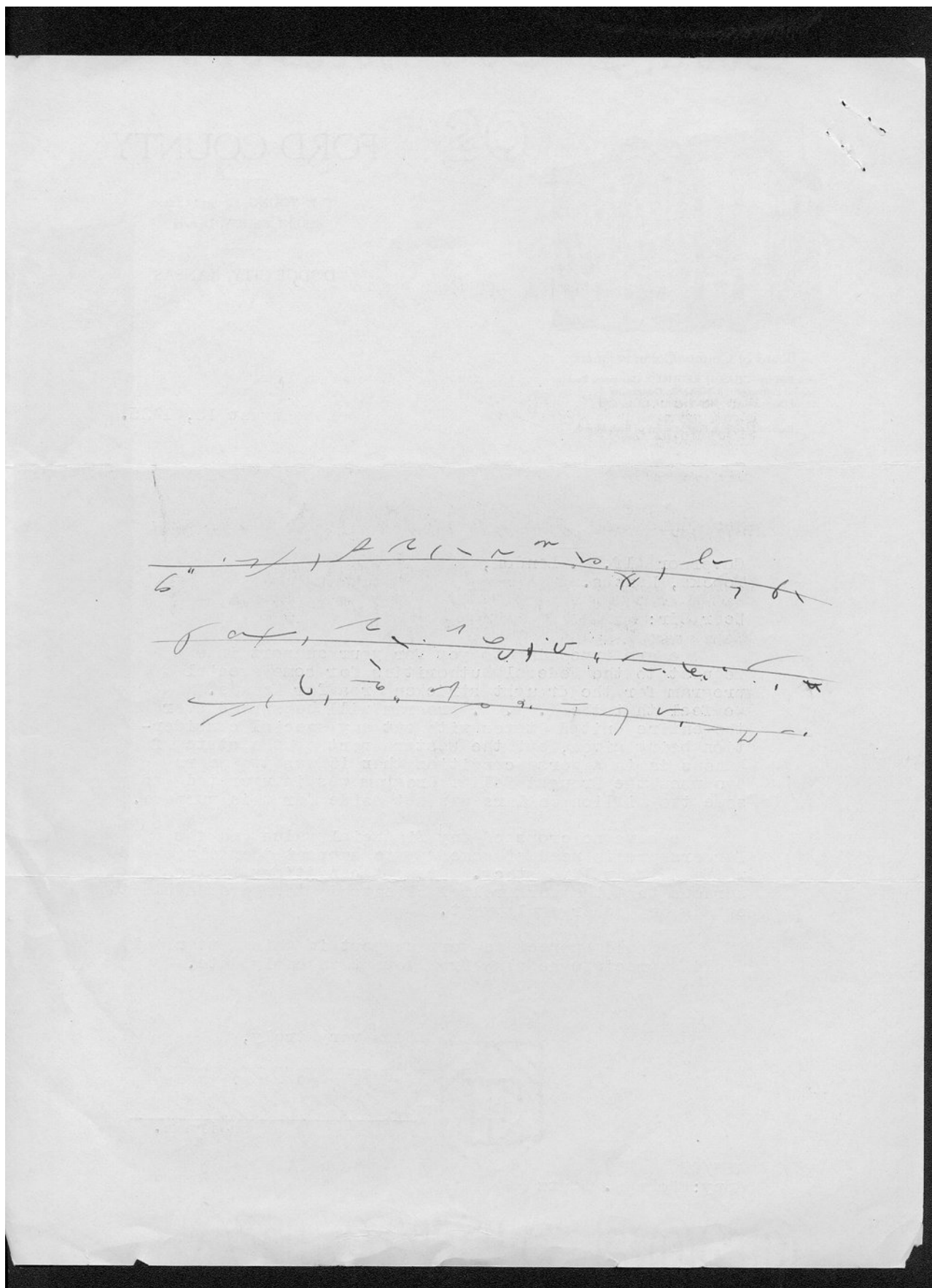

At a meeting of the County Commissioners of the Sixth Highway District of Kansas, held in Garden City, Kansas August 16th, 1935, the following Resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, On account of the present serious drought condition of this section, it is evident that the farmers will produce no crop to sell, and not enough roughage to maintain their live stock during the coming winter. This being evident, it follows that the collection of taxes will be seriously curtailed and the amount of aid for the coming winter be materially increased.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That this meeting ask that a Drouth Relief Project be instituted for the building of farm to market roads, in order that the farmers of this district may find employment for themselves, their teams and trucks during the coming year and that the necessary funds be allocated for this special purpose.

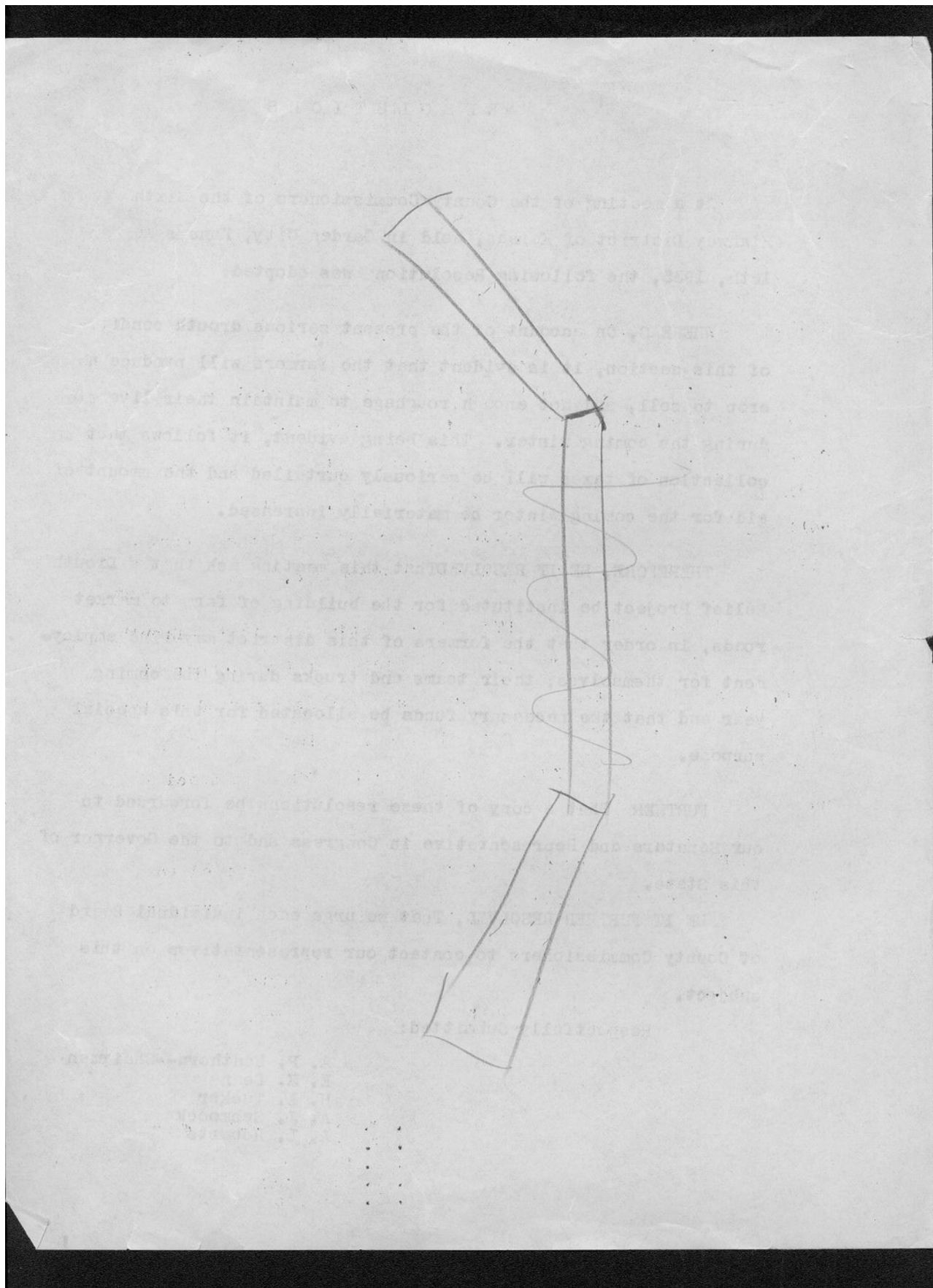
FURTHER That a copy of these resolutions be forwarded to our Senators and Representative in Congress and to the Governor of this State.


Please note the date and location of the nearest meeting to your county and plan to secure the attendance of a representative delegation. The county agent and selected leaders from each county should be in attendance at one of these meetings. If impossible for the county agent to attend because of previously scheduled work, the county should be represented by the leaders who are directly interested in this program.

This meeting is held in cooperation with the State Board of Agriculture. It will be desirable to have all of the seed and feed dealers of the county in attendance if possible. The new seed laws, new feed laws, and the proposed bindweed law will be discussed in addition to the emergency feed problems. Please notify all seed and feed dealers in your county of the date, location, and program arranged for this meeting. Please invite your county commissioners to attend this meeting.

There is again an emergency feed situation in more than 40 western Kansas counties. It will be necessary to conserve all the feed available in this area. This need will be stressed at the meetings in that portion of the State together with the methods of feed conservation that can be practiced to best advantage. In eastern Kansas, there is a decided need to conserve the feed supplies available because of the situation in the rest of the State and in planning for future needs.

It is planned to have an Agronomist and a Livestock specialist on the program at all meetings in addition to staff members from the State Board of Agriculture.

### KANSAS APPROVED SEED LIST

The Kansas approved seed wheat list has been compiled through the aid of the drought committees in the various counties. The members of these committees and the Extension Division can take no responsibility for the purity of the varieties, trueness to name, or freedom from weeds or diseases.

This seed list is being sent to all counties for the purpose of acquainting the wheat growers of Kansas who may be in the market for seed wheat, with a potential source of supply. The drought committees were instructed not to include wheat which contained more than a trace of rye, bunt or stinking smut, or goat grass (*aegilopsis*). In most instances the prices asked by the growers are listed in relation to the market price and before any sale of seed wheat is made, a price must be agreed upon between buyer and seller.

In purchasing seed wheat, attention should be given to the adaptation of varieties to the different sections of the state. The following suggestions are offered:

Tenmarq and Blackhull have their best adaptation in central and south central Kansas.

Turkey is adapted to all of central and western Kansas.

Kanred is adaptable to all sections of central and western Kansas, and is superior for the extreme western and northwestern portion.
