A small settlement on Pottawatomie river, in the southwest corner of Miami county, 18 miles from Paola, the county seat, and 92 from Topeka. Ship to Fontana, on the Missouri River, Ft. Scott & Gulf R. R. Exports, pork, cattle and corn. Stage to Paola and Garnett. Daily mail. Settled, 1856. Population, 20. John R. Henley, postmaster.

A small settlement on Appanoose creek, formed in 1855, and located in the northwestern part of Franklin county, 20 miles from Ottawa, the county seat and shipping point, 30 by road from Topeka, and 73 from Kansas City, Mo. Stage to Lawrence, Ottawa, Lyndon and Burlingame. Tri-weekly mail. George W. Eaton, postmaster.

APPIN.

A hamlet, located on Smoky Hill river, in the southern part of Saline county, 10 miles from Salina, the county seat and nearest shipping point.

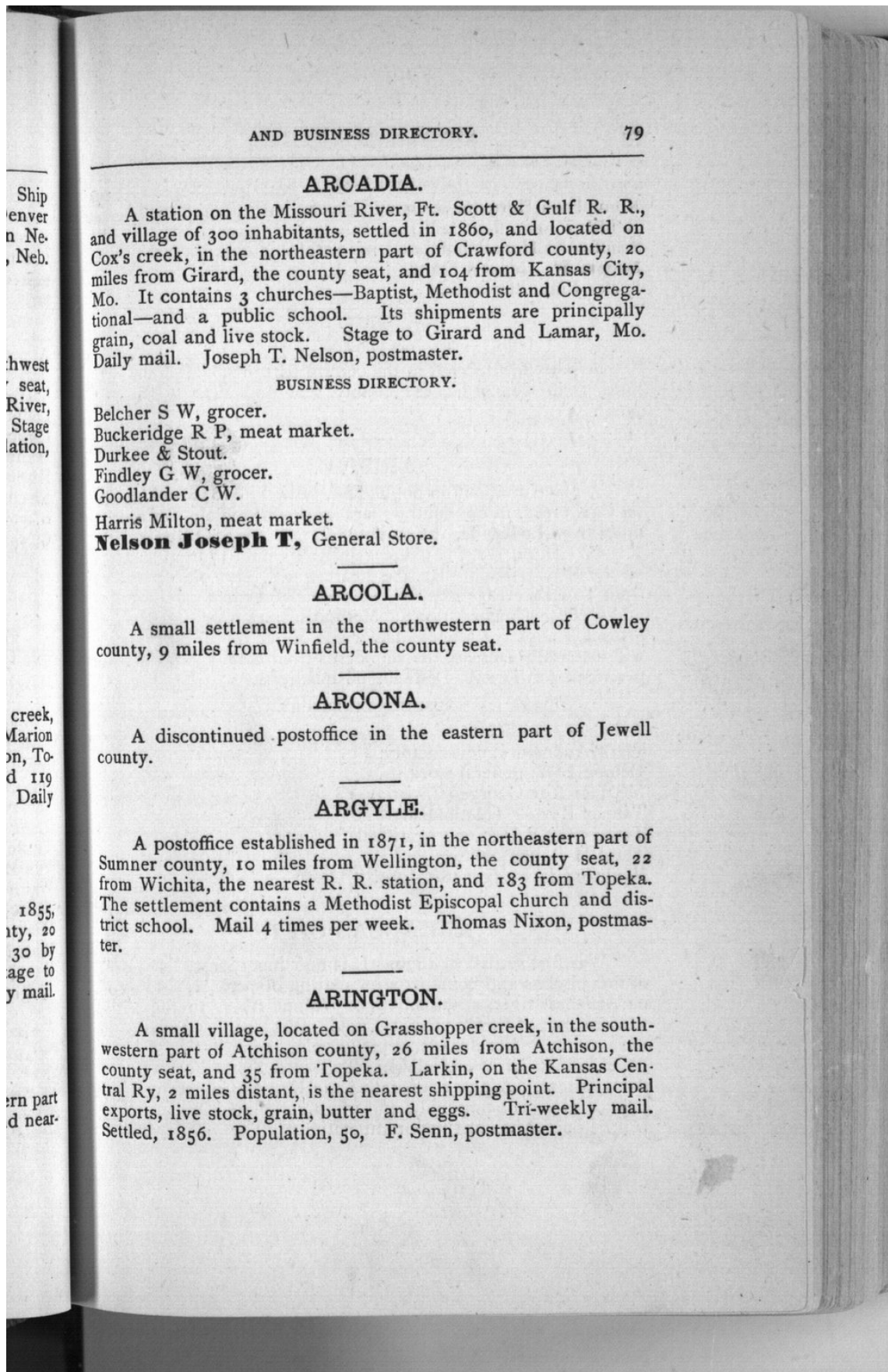

ARCADIA.

A station on the Missouri River, Ft. Scott & Gulf R. R., and village of 300 inhabitants, settled in 1860, and located on Cox's creek, in the northeastern part of Crawford county, 20 miles from Girard, the county seat, and 104 from Kansas City, Mo. It contains 3 churches—Baptist, Methodist and Congregational—and a public school. Its shipments are principally grain, coal and live stock. Stage to Girard and Lamar, Mo. Daily mail. Joseph T. A small settlement in the northwestern part of Cowley county, 9 miles from Winfield, the county seat.

A discontinued postoffice in the eastern part of Jewell county.

ARGYLE.

A postoffice established in 1871, in the northeastern part of Sumner county, 10 miles from Wellington, the county seat, 22 from Wichita, the nearest R. R. station, and 183 from Topeka. The settlement contains a Methodist Episcopal church and district school. Mail 4 times per week. Thomas Nixon, postmaster.

ARINGTON.

A small village, located on Grasshopper creek, in the southwestern part of Atchison county, 26 miles from Atchison, the county seat, and 35 from Topeka. Larkin, on the Kansas Central Ry, 2 miles distant, is the nearest shipping point. Principal exports, live stock, grain, butter and eggs. Tri-weekly mail. Settled, 1856. Population, 50. F. Senn, postmaster.

A postoffice located in the central part of Cloud county, 10 miles from Concordia, the county seat and nearest shipping point.

ARISPIE.

A place of about 60 population, settled in 1870 and located on Coal creek, in the central part of Pottawatomie county, 14 miles from Louisville, the county seat, 9 from Onaga on the Kansas Central Ry, the nearest shipping point, 17 from Wamego on the Kansas Pacific Ry, the nearest telegraph office, and 54 from Topeka. Live stock is the principal export. It contains 3 churches—Congregational, Methodist and Christian, and a district school. A cheese factory is about to be built, which will materially increase the shipments from here. Mail 4 times per week. Abbie A. Dennen, postmistress.

ARKANSAS CITY.

Was first settled in 1870. It is now incorporated as a city of the 3d class and contains a population of 700. It is located on Arkansas river, at the mouth of Walnut river, in the southwestern part of Cowley county, 14½ miles from Winfield, the county seat. The nearest shipping point at present is Wichita, on a branch of the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe R. R., 60 miles distant. A new road, called the Kansas City, Emporia & Southwestern is being built, and when completed Arkansas City will be one of its most important stations. The principal man-

ufacturing establishments are a water power flour mill, steam saw mill and combined saw and grist mill. There are 3 churches—2 Presbyterian and 1 Methodist, and a graded school built at a cost of \$10,000. Principal shipments, grain, live stock and hides. Arkansas City has 2 banks, 3 hotels and a number of good stores. A weekly newspaper is published here. Stage to El Dorado and Wichita. Express, Southwestern Stage Co. Daily mail. C. M. A small town of 400 population, is situated in the eastern part of Wyandotte county, one and one-half miles from Wyandotte, the county seat. It is located on the Kansas Pacific Ry, one mile from Kansas City, Mo., and 66 from Topeka. The Kansas river furnishes water power here but it is not utilized. It has 1 steam flour mill; 2 churches—Methodist and Presbyterian, and 2 schools. The shipments are corn and potatoes. Telegraph, Western Union. Express, United States and Kansas Pacific. Daily mail. Asher creek furnishes water power here, running one saw and one grist mill. It has one Baptist church and one public school. Shipments, grain, hogs and produce. Stage to Beloit and Solomon City. ASH GROVE.

The postoffice of a small settlement formed in 1872, on Solomon river, in the central part of Rooks county, 6 miles from Stockton, the county seat, 41 from Hays City, on the Kansas Pacific Ry, the nearest station, and 263 from Topeka. It contains a steam flour mill, Baptist church and district school. Stage to Hays City and Norton. Semi-weekly mail. W. B. Fulkerson, postmaster.

ASHLAND.

A hamlet, settled in 1875, and located on Walnut creek, in the southwestern part of Ness county (unorganized). Its nearest points by rail, are, Ellis, on the Kansas Pacific Ry, and Dodge City, on the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe R. R. It contains a Presbyterian church and common school. Semi-weekly stage to Great Bend. Mail 4 times per week. John P. Johnson, postmaster.

ASHMEAD.

A village of 75 inhabitants, first settled in 1874, located in the southern part of Ellsworth county, 12 miles from Ellsworth, the county seat and shipping point, and 168 from Topeka. A hamlet in the northwestern part of Nemaha county, 5 miles from Seneca, the county seat and nearest shipping point.

A postoffice located in Lowell township, Rooks county, 15 miles from Stockton, the county seat, 45 from Russell, on the Kansas Pacific Ry, the nearest station, and 350 from Topeka. Stage to Russell and Kirwin. Semi-weekly mail. Henry F. Olde, postmaster.

ASH VALLEY.

A hamlet settled in 1874, on Ash creek, in the northeast corner of Pawnee county, 10 miles from Larned, the county seat, and shipping point, and 251 from Topeka. It contains 2 churches—Presbyterian and Methodist—and a district school. Wheat is the chief product and export of this region. Stage once a week to Hays City and Larned. Semi-weekly mail. T. Baldwin, postmaster.

ATCHISON.

The great railroad centre, and one of the most important cities of Kansas, was founded on the 27th of July, 1854, by a party of gentlemen from Platte county, Mo., who discovered the many advantages it possessed from its geographical position as a trade centre, being situated on the left bank of the Missouri river, at the point known as the "Great Bend," or, as the early French settlers called it, the "Grand Detour." It took its first start during 1855, when it was selected as the depot for government freight about to be transported across the plains, and also as a place for general outfitting for Salt Lake merchants. Border troubles retarded its early growth from the beginning, but about 1858 it commenced to advance rapidly, and continued to do so until the outbreak of the war, in 1861, which, by putting a stop for the time to westward immigration, caused not only Atchison but all the other towns of Kansas to suffer from the almost complete prostration of business. The close of the war brought about a complete change; immigration began to pour rapidly in, and business to revive generally. From that time till the present the growth and prosperity of the city have been rapid and healthy. Atchison is located in latitude 39°, 43", in the centre of the river border of Kansas, and within 75 miles of the geographical centre of the United States. It is deservedly called

THE GREAT RAILROAD CENTRE OF KANSAS,

being, as it is, either the initial or terminal point of 8 different roads, having a total length of 2,992 miles, and connecting with every railroad route on the continent. These lines are as fol-

lows: The Central Branch Union Pacific, running directly west from Atchison to Washington and Concordia, 161 miles. The Atchison & Nebraska, running northwest from Atchison to Lincoln, Neb., 147 miles. The Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe, running southwest from Atchison to Pueblo, Col., with branches to Wichita and El Dorado, a total length of 741 miles. The Missouri Pacific, from Atchison to St. Louis, Mo., 434 miles. The above mentioned are on the west side of the river. The following, on the east side, also centre in Atchison. The Kansas City, St. Joseph & Council Bluffs, running south to Kansas City and north to Omaha, 203 miles. The Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific, from here to Chicago, 538 miles. The Hannibal & St. Joseph, running to Hannibal and Quincy, 242 miles, and the Burlington & Missouri River, running northeast to Chicago, 527 miles. These roads radiate to every point of the compass, and all do a large business at Atchison. An idea of the amount of general business done may be formed from the following exhibit of freight handled at this point during 1877. There were 825,548,854 pounds of freight received, and 705,101,861 pounds forwarded, which of itself plainly indicates an extensive business. A very important branch, to which much of Atchison's prosperity is attributable, is her

GRAIN TRADE

the development of which during 1876-7 has been very rapid, and which may be said to be as yet only in its infancy. The city has at present two of the finest elevators to be found anywhere, but so great has been the demand upon them that we think it would be quite safe to say that four times as many could find plenty to do in handling the vast amount of grain which pours into Atchison from all quarters. In this same connection it would not be out of place to say a word with reference to the flour mills, prominent among which we may mention the Central, City, and West Atchison, the two former of which do a particularly large manufacturing business.

WHOLESALE TRADE.

This trade in Atchison is not confined to any particular branch, but extends over every line of business, and compares very favorably with much larger cities. In her retail trade, also, she shows that she keeps pace with the times.

BANKS.

Atchison has 6 organized banking establishments, 2 of which are National banks, 3 incorporated under the State law, with 1 private bank. These have an aggregate capital of \$470,-

ooo, with assets considerably over \$1,000,000. Their aggregate deposits, as shown in their last statement, amounted to over \$580,000.

MANUFACTURES.

There are about 40 different manufacturing establishments, all doing a safe and prosperous business, and employing at least 800 men. Among the larger establishments are the Atchison Foundry, the Atchison Furniture Co., Linseed Oil Factory, Soap Factory, Barrel Factory, several carriage and wagon factories, and numbers of others which our space does not permit of enumerating.

EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES.

Atchison may justly pride herself on her public school system and the facilities she affords for education, from the simple rudiments to the collegiate. There are 5 public schools, valued at \$100,000, in which 22 teachers are employed, and which will accommodate over 2,000 pupils. There are also 2 academies—St. Scholastica's and the Atchison Institute—and 1 college—St. Benedict's—besides a number of private schools, all of them excellent institutions and which have high reputations.

CHURCHES.

There are 8 churches in the city, of the following denominations: Episcopal, Presbyterian, Catholic, Lutheran, 2 Methodist, and 2 Baptist.

NEWSPAPERS.

Of these there are 3, the "Champion," which is published every morning except Monday, the "Patriot," published every evening except Sunday, both of which have weekly editions, and "Der Courier," a German weekly.

Among the many attractions of Atchison is the great Missouri river bridge, 1,182 feet in length, built of iron, resting on stone piers. It is used for highway as well as railway traffic, and has sidewalks for foot passengers. It is equal in point of strength, beauty and permanence, to the very best bridges in America.

The Western Union Telegraph, American, United States and Adams Express Companies have offices here. There is also stage communication with all points not directly approachable by rail. The population has been variously estimated. It is probably, however, about 10,000. Benjamin B. Gale, postmaster.

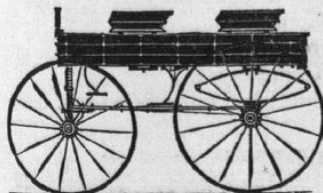

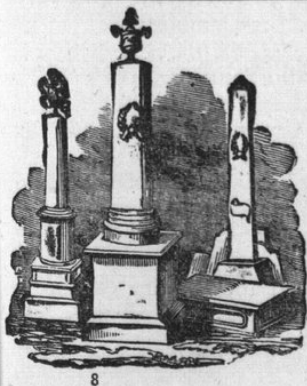
