The information for each town includes the population, information about the town, and a list of business people in that community. The town listings begin on page 65. The classified business directory (see general index for page number) groups information by business, profession, industry, etc. for the entire state. The gazetteer also includes advertisements for many businesses, lists of state and county officials, district courts and judges. There is a general index on page 14 but it does not include the town listings. An index to advertisers begins on page 17. The gazetteer also contains a business directory for Kansas City, Missouri.

A small village settled in 1865, and located on Dry creek, in the western part of Washington county, 22 miles from Washington, the county seat, and 10 from Clyde, on the Central Branch Union Pacific R R, its nearest shipping point. Exports grain and hogs. Daily mail. Population, 60. A. H. Lidell, postmaster.

BREMEN.

More commonly called Mountain Creek, from the stream on which it is located, in the northwestern part of Marshall county. It is a farming section, settled in 1862, and chiefly devoted to raising grain and live stock. Bremen is 8 miles from Marysville, the county seat and shipping point, and 120 from St. Joseph, Mo. Daily mail. Wm. Kutis, postmaster.

BRENNER.

A small place settled in 1870, located on Rock creek, in the northeastern part of Doniphan county, 5 miles from Troy, the county seat. It is a station on the Atchison & Nebraska R. R., 13 miles from Atchison. Topeka is 64 miles distant. Daily mail. Sophia M. McDaniel, postmistress.


BRIDGE.

A small village located on Gypsum creek, in the southern central part of Saline county, 15 miles from Salina, the county seat, and the same distance from Solomon City, to either of which goods may be shipped. Topeka is 120 miles distant. Principal exports, wheat, of which 100 cars were shipped last season. Stage to Solomon City. Weekly mail. Settled, 1864. Population, 50. Mrs. Eva E. Miller, postmistress.

A country village located in the northern part of Lynn county, 3 miles from Barnard and 5 from La Cygne.


BROOKVILLE.
