Mr. and Mrs. George W. Lawson

From the minute you meet them, you can tell that Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Lawson are an active, energetic farm family. Their plans for future growth are evidence of their youthful outlook.

Today, the Lawson's farm 857 acres, of which they own 480. Their cash operation centers around a cow herd with some emphasis on feeding out their calves when feed is plentiful. He currently is feeding mixed two-year-olds.

Lawson crosses a Charolais bull with Hereford cows. He feels this makes an effective cross with less calf loss. He plans to maintain a herd of 40 to 50 head, selling calves in the spring. In 1969 he sold 18 cows and 36 steers. He keeps the cattle on the farm an average of two years.

Lawson produces all the feed used in the cattle operation. He sells a lot of his milo, but feeds most of his corn. His entire wheat crop is sold. He puts up a lot of protein-rich alfalfa silage.

The Lawsons have been active in Geary county community affairs for over 21 years. Lawson served as a member of the local unification board, and is the current president of the unified school district No. 475. He is also a member of the board of directors of Kansas State High School Activities Assn., Inc.

Mrs. Lawson has completed four terms as president of the local EHU, and has been active in 4-H and youth church activities. She takes pride in keeping their yard looking attractive.


Future plans call for the Lawson's to improve the farmstead buildings for better use in the cattle operation.

Mr. and Mrs. Ruben A. Neher

Mr. and Mrs. Ruben Neher and their son Harold invested in 138 acres of Brown county farmland 23 years ago. Today they have 1270 choice acres and a very successful beef cattle operation.

The Neplers credit their success to their emphasis on management. "We read a lot and try to manage our operation like any other business. Today's farmer is a businessman and he can't make a go of it unless he realizes that fact."

The Nepler operation centers on feeding 650 to 700 head of cattle. They buy steers weighing from 400 to 500 pounds, use them to clean up fields and brome grass, then finish them on silage and high moisture grain.

The Neplers are proud of the fact that they buy virtually no outside feed. In fact, they sell about half of the feed grown. There is on-farm storage for 40,000 bushel of silage, and automatic feeding for 200 head of steers.

The Neplers have been active in several youth and church organizations. Nepler served on the Soil Conservation District Board for six years, five as president. His wife has spent 31 years in Extension homemakers unit education.


In 1963, the Neplers were one of 33 Kansas families to tour Europe (including several communist countries) as part of an agriculture "good will" tour. Since that time, they have been asked to present slide programs on the results of their trip to over 60 groups in northeast Kansas.

Mr. and Mrs. James C. Strong

Mr. and Mrs. Jim Strong started buying hogs in 1956. Today, they have one of the most outstanding feeder operations in the state.

Strong farms 705 acres in Allen county of which he owns 420. He can handle up to 1,800 pigs per year in his feeder program.

Strong buys pigs weighing around 40 pounds, and sells them after about 4 months in the lot at a market weight of 220 to 225 pounds. He buys and sells almost every week, depending on his needs. His feeder operation, currently being updated with an auger feeding system, can accommodate up to 800 hogs.

A believer in heavy fertilizing, Mr. Strong produces most of the feed required in his operation. He emphasizes continuous corn with commercial fertilizer. The remainder of his cultivated land produces wheat and alfalfa, which he also uses for feeding.

To utilize pasture and roughage, Strong keeps a cow herd composed of 21 cows and a registered Hereford bull. He usually sells his calf crop in the fall.

Mr. & Mrs. Strong have been, and still are, active in 4-H and church programs. In addition, he is president of District 8 Kansas Swine Improvement Assn., and she has been a substitute teacher in the Moran schools for 16 years.




Mr. and Mrs. Dallas Wells

Mr. and Mrs. Dallas Wells believe in making the most out of what they've got, as evidenced by the diversified use they have made of their Pawnee county farm.

The Wells own 800 acres and rent another 320. Of that, 1060 is cultivated and 40 is pasture. They produce wheat, hay, grain sorghum, cattle and pigs.

A strong believer in soil conservation, Wells uses a fallow/wheat/sorghum rotation system, utilizing undercutting equipment for maximum residue management on the cropping program. He feels this method controls soil erosion more effectively and gives better moisture penetration.

Again using residue management, Wells purchases 200 beef calves each fall to utilize roughages and wheat pasture. He sells most of the cattle as feeders the following spring, keeping back around 20 head for final market feeding.

The Wells' feeder-pig operation was started late in 1969. They are setting up for 300 head twice a year.

County 4-H work has taken up a large share of the family's extra hours, but Wells found time to assist the local co-op as secretary for 22 years. Mrs. Wells is a member of the local Extension homemakers unit, holding many offices over the years.

The Wells list traveling as one of their favorite pastimes. In the last nine years they have made trips to such distant points as Los Angeles, Calif.; Washington, D.C.; Mackinac Island, Canada; and Cape Kennedy, Fla.
