E. C. Manning, of Cowley, was elected Chairman, and Henry Pierce, of Rush, Secretary.

Lewis Hanback nominated Hon. Thomas Ryan. Mr. Kellogg nominated J. Jay Buck. Mr. Nichols nominated W. R. Brown. Mr. Martin nominated S. N. Wood. Mr. Finch nominated C. S. Martin. An informal ballot was then taken, as follows: Brown 34, Ryan 32, Buck 15, Martin 7, Wood 6. Mr. Finch withdrew the name of Mr. Martin, in favor of Mr. Ryan. Mr. Martin withdrew the name of Mr. Wood, in favor of Mr. Ryan. A formal ballot was then commenced, but before it was completed, Mr. Ryan having received a large majority, Capt. Booth moved to suspend the rules, and make the nomination of Mr. Ryan unanimous. This motion, prevailed, amidst immense cheering and enthusiasm.

Committee on Conference: The Committee retired, and W. R. Wagstaff offered the following resolution:


"Resolved, That a committee be appointed to confer with the Independents, to ascertain upon what terms a union of the opposition elements to the Republican party can be effected."

On motion of A. A. Hines, it was amended, and a committee of three was appointed to confer with the Independent Committee, to ascertain whether they had any proposition to make to the Convention. E. G. Ross, Judge McClure and G. W. Glick were appointed such committee.

The Committee on Resolutions, through T. P. Fenlon, reported the following, which was unanimously adopted:

"Resolved, That we heartily indorse the declaration of principles, policies and purposes made by the Democratic Convention at St. Louis, as interpreted by the letters of Tilden and Hendricks. That in the nomination of Samuel J. Tilden and Thomas A. Hendricks, the Democratic National Convention has placed before the electors of the country the names of men whose private and public career assures the people that, if elected, economy, purity, ability and statesmanship will characterize their administration; that the highest offices in the Nation are public trusts, and not private perquisites. That in the support of these candidates we will cordially cooperate with all men who desire a change and reform in the administration of the political affairs of the Nation. That we invite the cooperation of all good citizens in the election of this ticket, who desire that capacity, industry and honesty shall supplant ignorance, idleness and dishonesty in the management of our State affairs, and ask the aid of all good citizens for the protection of the honor of our State, stained as it has been by peculation and corruption of many of its officers, to the end that the taxes drawn from the toiling people shall be applied to the purpose for which they are collected, and not filched from the treasury to enrich thieves to whom they have been intrusted."

August 24.—The Independent Greenback Convention of the Third District, at Emporia, nominates Samuel J. Crawford for Congress.

August 24.—Death, in Paris, of Mrs. Minnie Beals Reade, a Topeka vocalist.

August 25.—Democratic Convention of the Third District, at Emporia. President, George S. Brown, of Shawnee; Vice Presidents, L. P. Martin of Chase, R. C. Cobb of Marion, N. A. English of Sedgwick, Archibald Ellis of Butler, J. D. Ronstadt of Barton; Secretaries, John Maloy of Council Grove, W. E. Timmons of Chase. S. J. Crawford, of Emporia, and T. L. Davis, of Eureka, were candidates for the Congressional nomination, and Mr. Davis was nominated by a vote of 62 to 22. The following persons were then appointed as the Democratic Congressional Committee: W. A. Randolph of Lyon, D. Dickson of Woodson, T. F. Allen of Pawnee, J. R. Blackshire of Chase, J. D. Ronstadt of Barton, Dr. Stringfield of Shawnee.

August 31.—First District Republican Convention, at Abilene. A dispute arose between the friends of Wm. A. Phillips and W. W. Guthrie, as to the temporary organization. The Guthrie men, about 24, withdrew; the Phillips men, 68, held the hall and the Convention. The seceders elected A. S. Wilson for Chairman, and nominated W. W. Guthrie for Congress; Mr. Guthrie did not accept. D. R. Anthony called the regular convention to order. A. Larzelere, of Doniphan, was elected Chairman, and D. B. Moore, of Cloud, Secretary. The following committees were then appointed by the Chair:

On Credentials: W. H. Bond of Leavenworth, J. C. Price of Republic, G. W. Wellman of Lincoln, A. Campbell of Mitchell, and E. Aldrich of Pottawatomic county.

On Permanent Organization: C. Leland jr. of Doniphan, D. A. Hook

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of Leavenworth, J. Beaumond of Norton, M. Schultz of Ellsworth, and G. Payson of Ellis county.

On Resolutions: J. A. Blackman of Leavenworth, Nathan Price of Doniphan, R. S. Craft of Marshall, H. D. Baker of Saline, and D. C. Gamble of Republic county.

The Committee on Permanent Organization, through its Chairman, reported as follows: President, Dr. R. S. Craft of Marshall county; Secretary, D. B. Moore, of Cloud county; Assistant Secretary, L. C. Smith, of Rooks county.

A committee of five from each party held a conference, but did not come to an agreement. Each of the 68 delegates then signed his name and gave his written choice for Phillips for Congress. The Committee on Resolutions then reported as follows:

"Resolved, That the Republican party of the First Congressional District of the State of Kansas heartly indorses the platforms of the National and State Republican party, and feels confident that we shall march to victory under their banners.

"Resolved, That we heartily indorse the course of Hon. W. A. Phillips, our nominee, in Congress, as a champion of the people."

The Chair then appointed the following gentlemen as members of the District Central Committee: D. R. Anthony, Chairman; Cyrus Leland, C. E. Granger, J. W. Pipher, D. C. Gamble, G. M. Lewis, and J. A. Scott.

The Phillips committee of conference consisted of D. R. Anthony, A. Larzelere, W. C. Cornforth, E. Aldrich, and T. C. Henry.

The Guthrie convention was called to order by A. S. Wilson, temporary chairman. T. J. Hume, of Washington county, moved the appointment of a Committee on Credentials. The Committee consisted of T. J. Hume of Washington, L. A. Myers of Jefferson, G. W. Higinbotham of Riley, F. J. Wendell of Atchison, and Ira F. Collins of Nemaha. E. N. Morrill, of Brown, moved that a Committee on Permanent Organization be appointed by the Chair. As such committee the Chair appointed E. N. Morrill of Brown, R. S. Newell of Marshall, J. R. Gearhart of Osborne, A. C. Low of Atchison, and George R. Parker of Smith. C. H. Krebs of Atchison and Wm. Kennedy of Clay were elected temporary Secretaries.

The Committee on Permanent Organization reported as follows: For President, A. S. Wilson, of Washington county; Secretaries, Wm. Kennedy of Clay, and A. B. Smith of Jewell.

Moved that a Committee on Rules and Order of Business be appointed. The President appointed as such Committee, E. B. Doane of Osborne, W. H. Collins of Washington, G. W. Higinbotham of Riley, B. F. Killey of Brown, and A. B. Smith of Jewell.

E. N. Morrill moved that a committee of five be appointed to meet a similar committee on the part of the other convention, with a view to reconciling all differences of opinion between them. Motion prevailed unanimously. The Chair appointed the following committee: E. N. Morrill, J. A. Dixon, F. J. Wendell, M. R. Mudge, and G. W. Higinbotham.





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On motion, the Chair appointed a Committee on Resolutions, as follows: Hogeboom of Jefferson, Brown of Nemaha, Van Winkle of Atchison, Myers of Jefferson, and Hume of Washington.

The committee to confer with a committee of the other convention reported, in substance, that they had met a similar committee, but nothing would satisfy them but an entire surrender, and the nomination of Col. Wm. A. Phillips. On motion, the committee was discharged.

Whereupon, on motion of L. A. Myers, of Jefferson, the rules were suspended, and W. W. Guthrie, of Atchison, was unanimously nominated as the candidate for Member of Congress from the First Congressional District. A committee, consisting of Messrs. Morrill and Auld, was appointed to wait upon Mr. Guthrie, and inform him of his nomination. In the absence of the committee, speeches were made by Dr. Hodge, Mr. Montgomery, and others, heartily indorsing the nomination. Mr. Guthrie appeared before the Convention and thanked them for the honor conferred. He intimated to the Convention that he should use all honorable means to reconcile the unhappy differences that had arisen in the Convention, before he would unqualifiedly accept or decline the nomination.

The resolutions were to the effect that "the ring of Federal officeholders, with their hired associates, have refused to participate in this, the regularly organized Convention."

SEPTEMBER 1.—The ladies of Wyandotte have invested their Centennial funds, to the amount of about two hundred dollars, in a grand vase, to be sent to the Kansas Building, at Philadelphia.


SEPTEMBER 5.—Henry Vernon withdraws as a Republican elector, and J. B. Johnson is placed on the ticket.

SEPTEMBER 6.—The A. T. & S. F. R. R. Co. publish "The Iron Trail," a graphically written book from the pen of A. C. Wheeler, of New York. It describes Kansas and New Mexico, and is suitably illustrated.

September 6.—John Davis, of Junction City, announces that the Independent Greenback party of the First District will make no nomination against Colonel Phillips.

September 6.—Democratic Congressional Convention, for the First District, at Atchison. Marcus J. Parrott, Chairman; F. L. Vandegrift and W. W. Embry, Secretaries. Committee on Resolutions: Sherry of Leavenworth, Benton of Atchison, Lowe of Washington, Harrington of Brown, and Townsend of Jefferson. Mr. Tomlinson, of Atchison, offered a resolution that it was inexpedient to make a nomination; it was supported by Cochrane and Griffin of Atchison and Edgar of Nemaha, and opposed by Eaton of Leavenworth and Harrington of Brown, and tabled by a vote of 43 to 27. Thos. P. Fenlon was nominated by acclamation. A ratification meeting in the evening was addressed by Geo. W. Glick, Byron Sherry, E. Harrington, J. W. Taylor, M. J. Parrott, and Thos. P. Fenlon.

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Congressional Committee: E. C. Chapin, Leavenworth; E. K. Townsend, Jefferson; M. Quigg, Atchison; E. Harrington, Brown; and Chas. Hayden, Jackson.

The Convention unanimously adopted the following resolution:

"Resolved, That we, the delegates of the First Congressional District of the State of Kansas, in convention assembled, at Atchison, September 6th, do fully indorse the platform and principles of the National Democratic Convention, held at St. Louis, June 27, 1876, and also the platform and principles of the State Convention, held at Topeka, Kansas, August 23, 1876; and we hereby pledge ourselves to support and use all honorable means to secure the election of the nominees of said conventions."

E. Harrington offered the following resolution, which was adopted:

"Resolved, That it is the duty of Congress to restore silver coin to its former status as a legal tender for the payment of all debts, public and private."

SEPTEMBER 8.—A sketch of Father Defouri in the Commonwelth gives important facts relating to Catholic history in the State.

September 8.—Annual Convention, at Topeka, of the Episcopal Church of the Diocese of Kansas. Address by J. H. Lee, of Manhattan. The following officers were elected: Treasurer, J. W. Farnsworth; Registrar, Rev. C. W. Coxe; Standing Committee, Rev. Charles Reynolds, D. D., Rev. J. N. Lee, Rev. A. Beatty, Rev. C. E. Butler, and Messrs. F. W. Giles, C. C. Kellam, J. W. Farnsworth, and S. W. Stone. A special committee reported a resolution expressive of the regret of the Convention at the decease of the Rt. Rev. H. W. Lee, D. D., late Bishop of Iowa, and formerly Provisional Bishop of Kansas.

SEPTEMBER 9.—W. W. Guthrie, in the Atchison Champion, declines the nomination, making a long statement.

SEPTEMBER 11.—The trotter "Ethan Allen," age 27, dies at Lawrence, on the Ben. Akers stock farm. With a running mate he had made a record of 2:15.

SEPTEMBER 12.—The Leavenworth Times publishes a sketch of Thos. P. Fenlon. He was born in Cambria county, Pennsylvania; he came to Kansas in 1859.

September 14.—Jefferson Davis is present at the Kansas City, Mo., Exposition, and makes an address. He sees that the great commercial need of this valley is water transportation, to compete with the railways.

—September 15.—The Comanche county school-bond forgery case comes up in the District Court, at Topeka. The case was dismissed on the 18th.

-J. C. Hebbard has written an elaborate history of Nemaha county.

September 15.—The Kansas River Baptist Association holds its twentieth annual session, at Dover, Shawnee county; J. Barrett, Moderator; Andrew Stark, Clerk; nine churches represented.

September 20.-D. W. Wilder writes a letter to Governor Osborn re-

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signing his office of State Auditor, and removes to St. Joseph to edit the Herald. P. I. Bonebrake is appointed Auditor.

SEPTEMBER 26.—The Republican State Committee unanimously declines to remove Geo. T. Anthony from the State ticket, declaring by resolutions that he has completely vindicated himself from the charges made against him.

SEPTEMBER 26.—Cole and Bob Younger, the Northfield bank robbers, are committed to jail, at Faribault, Minn. They were probably members of Quantrill's band of assassins.

SEPTEMBER 30.—Right Rev. Innocent Wolfe, O.S.B., is elected Abbot of St. Benedict's Priory, at Atchison.

Остовев 2.—Р. I. Bonebrake commissioned as State Auditor.

OCTOBER 3.—The Presbytery of Topeka, including the churches from Leavenworth, west to Hays City, meets, and continues in session two days. It consists of thirty-three ministers and forty-nine churches.

The Synod of Kansas met on the 5th, and was opened with an elaborate sermon by the retiring Moderator, Rev. William Bishop, D. D., of Independence. The Synod includes five Presbyteries, covering Kansas, Indian Territory and Texas, 109 ministers and 161 churches. The delegation consists of the ministers, and a lay delegate from each church.—The organization was perfected by the election of Rev. William N. Page, of Leavenworth, as Moderator, with Rev. F. S. McCabe, D. D., of Topeka, Stated Clerk; Rev. J. P. Harsen, of Wichita, Permanent, and Revs. J. M. Calkins and J. C. Miller, Temporary Clerks.



October 4.—Meeting of the Grand Lodge of Good Templars, at Lawrence. John B. Campbell, of Fort Scott, was reëlected G. W. C. T.; L. Ricker, of Lawrence, G. W. V. T.; N. H. Wood, of Leavenworth, G. C.; D. C. Beach, of Lawrence, Grand Secretary; L. W. Burbank, of Leavenworth, Treasurer; J. W. Clock, of Centropolis, Superintendent. Junior Templars: Rev. G. S. Dearborn, of Salina, Grand Chaplain; G. S. Mansur, of Winfield, Grand Marshal. The secret movement of the British Grand Lodge was condemned by an unanimous vote. J. B. Campbell, H. C. Meecham and Jno. Paulson were elected delegates to the Right Worthy Grand Lodge.

OCTOBER 6.—The Missouri River Baptist Association meets at Hiawatha. Rev. J. B. Hardwicke declined a reëlection as Moderator. Rev. George Mitchell was elected Moderator, and Rev. R. S. Cook, Clerk.

OCTOBER 7.—The Kansas wagon receives the medal at the Centennial Exposition, as the best farm wagon.

OCTOBER 16.—Track-laying begun on the Waterville & Washington Railroad.





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OCTOBER 17.—T. L. Davis withdraws as a candidate for Congress.

OCTOBER.—Kansas fruit is awarded the first premium at the Centennial.

NOVEMBER 3.—Judge John T. Morton appoints C. S. Greeley and Henry Villard Receivers of the Kansas Pacific Road.

—William Crozier, son of Judge Crozier, has been transferred to the Engineer Corps, by President Grant. Young Crozier graduated at the head of his class at West Point.

NOVEMBER 7.—State and Presidential election; Hayes and Tilden are both in doubt as to the result.


