

Victor Wendell Welton, World War I soldier

Around 1919, the Kansas State Historical Society and the American Legion solicited biographical information from returning veterans (primarily members of the 35th and 89th infantry divisions) and the families of those who died in service, notably from the Gold Star Mothers. Each veteran or family member was asked to provide letters, photographs, a biography, and military records. This file contains information on Victor Wendell Welton, Students Army Training Corps. Welton died from influenza on November 1, 1918.




















The have no extractes from his letters which would be ginterest to publish as we received but one letter from him after entering the service. He took sick just I week later & was unable to write

Nov,7th 1898. The greater part of his earlier was spent upon the old homestead a few miles to the northwee Southwest of Rantoul. After graduating from the common schools he spent one year in the Ottawa high school and graduated from the Lane Wigh school in 1918. In September of 1918 he entered the Kansas State Agricultural College from which he was araited for the U.S.Army but volunteered in the Students Army Training Corps on the second of August 1916. He served one week and was stricken with influenza and in combination with lung fever died Nov.the first 1918.

The leaves his parents and five sisters to morn he his loss. Always untiful and generous in his dealings with others he leaves a vacancy in his family circle that can never be filled.
