

## **Alvin Julius Wendlandt, World War I soldier**

Around 1919, the Kansas State Historical Society and the American Legion solicited biographical information from returning veterans (primarily members of the 35th and 89th infantry divisions) and the families of those who died in service, notably from the Gold Star Mothers. Each veteran or family member was asked to provide letters, photographs, a biography, and military records. This file contains information on Alvin Julius Wendlandt, Company A, 10th Infantry. Wendlandt died from pneumonia on October 12, 1918.

Alvin Julius Wendlandt

Born the 31 day of March 1896 in Pittsburg  
Kansas son of Julius & Minnie Wendlandt  
was educated at Iola & Coffeyville, Kansas  
later attended Agriculture College at  
Manhattan Kansas. Occupation Mechanic.  
Was drafted at Hillsboro, Illinois  
Worked at Hillsboro Illinois. Was in 10 Infantry  
at Battle Creek Michigan Co. 4. Belonged to  
Evangelical Lutheran Church, died of pneumonia  
October 12-1918 at Battle Creek Michigan  
was buried at Pittsburg, Kansas.  
Age 22 years 6 months - 11 days
