

Fredrick B. Behrherst, World War I soldier

Around 1919, the Kansas State Historical Society and the American Legion solicited biographical information from returning veterans (primarily members of the 35th and 89th infantry divisions) and the families of those who died in service, notably from the Gold Star Mothers. Each veteran or family member was asked to provide letters, photographs, a biography, and military records. This file contains information on Fredrick B. Behrherst, Headquarters Convalescent Camp, Mesves Hospital Center, France. Fredrick died from pneumonia there on October 24, 1918.

Stenry Herman, Fredrick Behrhorst was born on the 24th of april 1891 in Grawford Eo. Stans. (Sherman John) Itis parents are Timis Behahorst and sing, anna nie Mahnken He received his education in branford Eo. schools including a term at the normal School in Pittsburg and lived on the farm all his life until he was inducted into the Services of his country in July 1918. Ufter a brief training at Campo Finnston he was sent across to France where he served his country in Headquarters Convalesant Camp, Mesves Hospital Genter (a. E. F. France) and died of Pneumonia on 24th of October 1918. On July 7, 1918 hermanical to Christine nee Selle who is left to moun his death together with "parents, mentioned above, and three sisters, Laura, Elars, and Dora and two brothers Henry + Stalter. Mr. Behrhorst was born + raised a Lutheran and was at the time of his death a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Emannels church near Stepler, Stans.
