

Ed Roland McWilliams, World War I soldier

Around 1919, the Kansas State Historical Society and the American Legion solicited biographical information from returning veterans (primarily members of the 35th and 89th infantry divisions) and the families of those who died in service, notably from the Gold Star Mothers. Each veteran or family member was asked to provide letters, photographs, a biography, and military records. This file contains information on Ed Roland McWilliams, Ambulance Company No. 24. Ed died of pneumonia on November 19, 1918 in the Base Hospital at Fort Sam Houston, Texas.


























Ed Roland McWilliams, World War I soldier


February 28, 1919

I received your favor of the 26" inst., enclosing me sketch of the life of the soldier Ed Roland McWilliams. I thank you for sending me this. Please send me a photograph of the soldier. The material we are collecting will be published at some time in the future. I cannot tell you just when. That will depend on when the legislature furnishes the money. Nothing will be published for two years in any event. I would be glad for you to write me a plain statement of facts of what you saw in the hospital. As I said above, it is uncertain when this material will be published, but it will be published some time.


Dear Madam-

We have not returned the photograph of the soldier Ed. Roland McWilliams for the reason that the legislature has made no provition to copy the photographs of the soldiers. We have the photograph here in a fireproof building which has recently been erected by the state at a cost of more than \$600,000, and it is absolutely safe. I feel sure that you would not want the state to have pictures of the other soldier boys and not the picture of your boy, for the state will sooner or later want to publish the records and pictures of these soldier boys. To make a copy of all these photographs would cost from \$2,500 to \$3000 and the state has made no provision for that. I should like to retain the picture until such provision is made.
