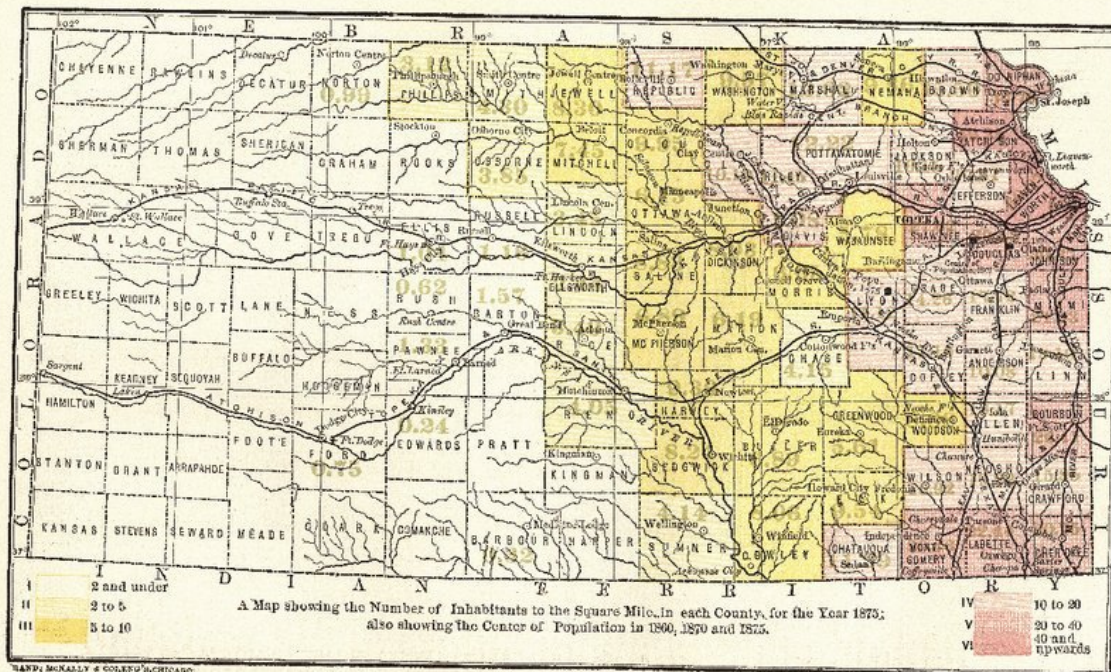

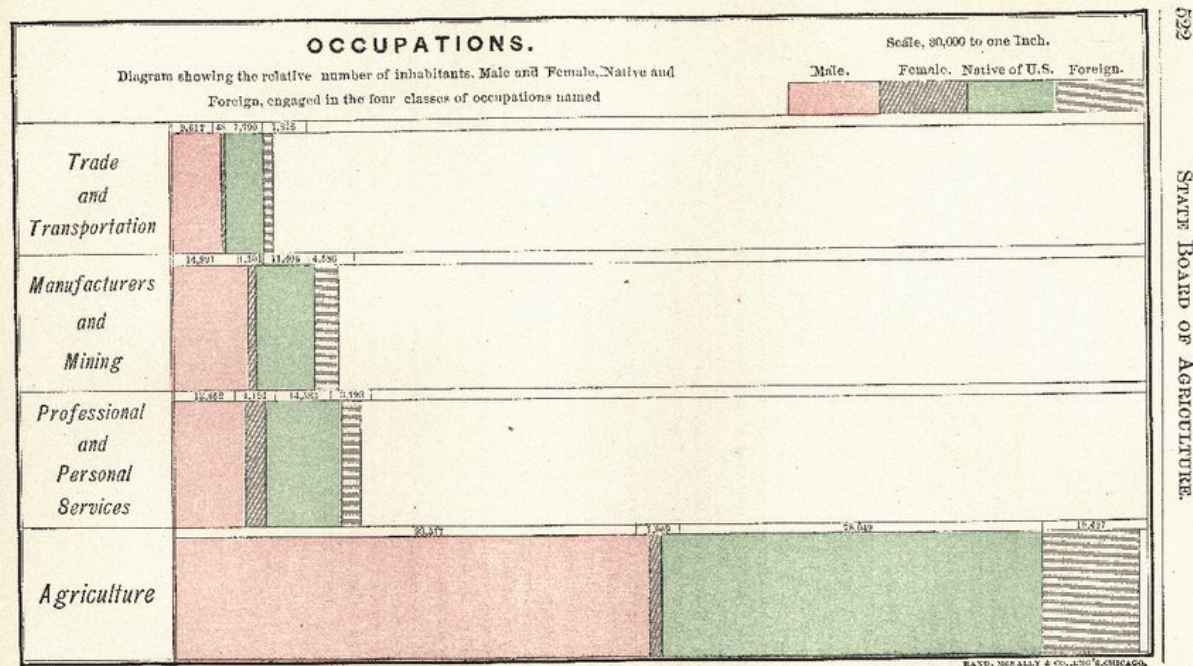

OCCUPATIONS.

We commenced the compilation of the occupation tables in conformity with the classification of ages adopted in the Ninth Census of the United States, to wit: 10 to 15; 16 to 59; 60 and over. Before we had gone far in the work, we ascertained that this classification would lead to erroneous results; and, as we had not the time and clerical force to make all the classifications, we then abandoned it, and included in the following tables only those of 21 years of age and upwards. From 16 to 20 there are many students off at school, who are given in most cases as members of the family present, and then they are taken as students again, where they are remaining only temporarily. Then, only the heads of families, or those at the head of gainful occupations, should be enumerated as such, and the rest as laborers, clerks, etc. But if those from 16 to 20 are classed together, farmers' sons must either be classed as farmers or farm laborers. They are receiving no stated wages or profits. With some propriety, however, they could be classed as farm laborers; but when we take the sons of professional men between those ages, they can seldom be classed in that way. As a rule, they are not lawyers, doctors or preachers, nor their clerks—are probably students. The age of 21 is recognized as the age of majority, when young men are supposed to commence in some gainful occupation on their own account.

Except the classification as to ages, we have endeavored to conform to the classifications and methods adopted by the General Government, which will be found under the four general divisions: Agriculture, Professional and Personal, Trade and Transportation, Manufactures and Mining, with their several subdivisions, which may be better understood by reference to the tables. For the want of time we have been able to make only one table, 21 years and over. As we could make only one at this time, we chose the one the most profitable. In enumerating those only who follow some gainful occupation, all gamblers, prostitutes and keepers of brothels are excluded, for the reason that it would be impossible to make anything like a correct list.

Not having included all ages in the tables of occupations, we will not attempt to account for those not included; that is, those under 21 years of age, married women (who are excluded from the United States tables), those incapacitated from engaging in industrial pursuits from physical or mental infirmities, criminals, etc.
