This black and white photograph shows the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway Company stage coach in front of the Oswego House, at the northwest corner of Merchant and Fourth Streets in Oswego, Kansas. The Oswego House was built by David Willims Clover. In 1867, it was a log house and the structure in the photo was completed in 1870. The coach, operated by S. A. Halsey, provided service from Oswego to Independence and then Coffeyville when the Frisco Railroad reached Oswego in 1876.

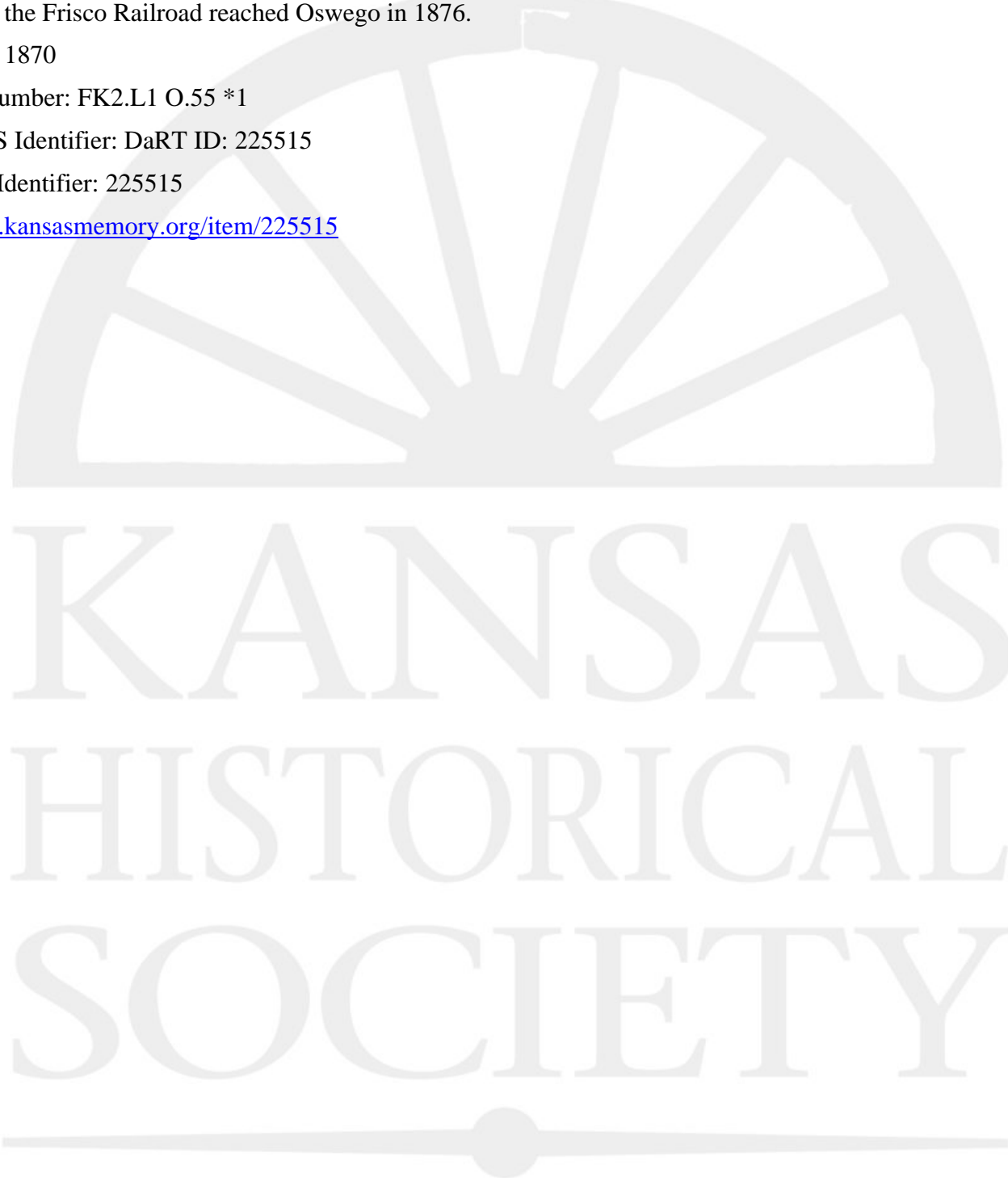

- (5) OSWEGO, KANSAS- 9-14-67. Picture of First Oswego House built by David Williams Clover, located on the north west corner of Merchant at 4th. Started as a log house in 1867 and added to until the structure here was completed in 1870. It was dismantled in 1890 and replaced by the present brick structure on the same location. Stage in this picture operated between Oswego, Independence and Coffeyville when the Frisco Rwy. reached Oswego in 1876. Stage was first operated by S.A.Halsey to those points starting in the early 1870s. For a time, perhaps five years, offices for the City of Oswego, and some of the Labette County offices were located in Clover's Oswego House.
