

### James H. Lane material

Material relating to James H. Lane. Lane served as president of the Topeka and Leavenworth constitutional conventions and was elected one of the state's first U.S. senators. He raised the "Frontier Guard," recruited and commanded "Lane's Brigade" (the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Kansas Volunteers), and was responsible for forming the First Kansas Colored Volunteers, the first regiment of African American troops to see action on the side of the Union during the Civil War. Included in this material is an order from the War Department accepting the resignation of James H. Lane as recruiting commissioner, several certificates acknowledging Lane's service in the Third and Fifth Regiments of the Indiana Volunteers, and his appointments to the district courts of the state of Kansas. Several letters written by Lane are also included.






JAMES HENRY LANE.

UNITED STATES SENATUR, JAMES H. LANE, WAS BORN IN LAWRENCEBURG, INDI-HE RECEIVED A COMMON SCHOOL EDUCATION. HE STUD-IED LAW. WAS ADMITTED TO THE BAR. AND ACQUIRED A FAIR PROFESSIONAL PRAC-IN 1846, HE ENLISTED AS A PRIVATE IN THE 30 INDIANA VOLUNTEERS. FOR THE WAR WITH MEXICO. AT THE BATTLE OF BUENA VISTA COMMANDED A BRIGADE AND HIGHLY DISTINGUISHED WHEN THE YEAR'S TERM OF SERVICE EXPIRED. HE RETURNED HOME AND RAISED THE OTH INDIANA VOLUNTEERS. IN 1848, HE WAS CHOSEN LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR OF INDIANA, AND IN 1852, MEMBER OF CONGRESS AND ELECTOR AT LARGE ON THE DEMOCRATIC TICKET. IN CONGRESS, HE AT FIRST, OPPOSED THE KANSAST NEBRASKA BILL WITH THE CLAUSE REPEALING THE MISSOURI COMPROMISE; BUT HE FAVORED THE BILL ON ITS PASSAGE WITH THE PUPULAR SUVEREIGNTY PROVISION. IN THE SPRING OF 1855 HE CAME TO KANSAS, AND SETTLED AT LAWRENCE. SOON BECAME IDENTIFIED WITH THE FREE STATE PARTY, AND IN THE TERRITO-RIAL CONVENTION, SEPTEMBER 29, 1655, HE WAS MADE CHAIRMAN OF THE EXECU-TIVE CUMMITTEE OF KANSAS TERRITORY, WHICH WAS CHARGED WITH THE DETAILS OF URGANIZING THE MOVEMENT FOR A STATE COVERNMENT. HE WAS PRESIDENT OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION WHICH MET AT TOPEVA. ON THE 23 OF OCTOBER FULLOWING AND FRAMED WHAT WAS KNOWN AS THE TOPEKA CONSTITUTION. ELECTED, WITH GOVERNOR ANDREW H. REEDER, A UNITED STATES SENATOR, BY THE LEGISLATURE CHOSEN UNDER THAT CONSTITUTION. AND WHICH MET AT TOPEKA MARCH THIS CONSTITUTION WAS NOT RATIFIED BY CONGRESS, AND GENERAL LANE, WITH MANY OTHERS, WAS INDICTED FOR TREASON FOR HIS CONNECTION WITH IN THE WAKARUSA WAR !! , IN DECEMBER, 1855, HE WAS MADE THE COMMANDER OF THE FREE STATE FORCES; AND DURING THE YEAR 1856, HE

VENTION HELD IN LEAVENWORTH, IN 1857, WHICH POSITION HE RESIGNED. HE WAS ELECTED IN 1861, ONE OF THE FIRST UNITED STATES SENATORS FROM THE STATE OF KANSAS. IN THAT CAPACITY HE WAS VERY INFLUENTIAL IN THE AF-FAIRS OF THE COUNTRY, DURING THE WAR, ON THE UNION SIDE. IN 1865 HE WAS RE-ELECTED, HIS FIRST TERM HAVING BEEN A SHORT ONE. JULY 1, 1866, DU-RING A PERIOD OF EXTREME MENTAL DEPRESSION, TO WHICH HE WAS SUBJECT, HE SHOT HIMSELF WITH A PISTOL , THE BALL ENTERING HIS BRAIN, AND CAUSING HIS DEATH ON THE LITH OF THAT MONTH.









