September 8.

Half-mile—Open for Boys under Sixteen.

1st Prize, Croquet Set, worth \$2.50; 2d Prize, Croquet Set, worth \$2.50; 3rd Prize, two Base Ball Bats and Ball, worth \$1.50.

Two-mile Tandem Race open; must be three starters, and make
time satisfactory to Judges.

1st Prize, two Sweaters, \$7.50; 2nd Prize, Stop Watch, \$7.50.

September 9.

Half-mile, open.—1st Prize, Gold Filled Watch, \$15.00; 2nd Prize, Silver Watch, \$12; 3rd Prize, Cyclometer, \$2.00.

Mile, open.—1st Prize, Gold Filled Watch, \$15.00; 2nd Prize, Set Silver Knives and Forks, \$5.00; 3rd Prize, Cyclometer, \$2.00.

September 10.

Mile, for Championship of Marshall, Jackson, Brown, and Nemaha.—1st Prize, Medal, engraved with name of winner, \$10.00; 2nd Prize, Pair Silver Napkin Rings, engraved with name, \$5.00.

HALF-MILE, open.—Exhibition to lower record of Association; track to be paced by tandem—1st Prize, Set Coin Silver Teaspoons, \$6.00; Tandem riders each to receive Pair of Shoes, \$5.00.

September 11.

Two Mile, open.—First Prize, Gold Filled Watch, 15.00; 2nd Prize, Diamond Ring, 7.50; 3rd Prize, Opal Pin, \$5.00.

One Mile, open.—1st Prize, Set Coin Silver Teaspoons, \$6.00; 2nd Prize, Alarm Clock, \$4.00.

Must be Four Starters except as Otherwise Stated.
