The train will stop near the Santa Fe station in each town, according to the above schedule.

Each program will consist of a series of short lectures, after which the visitors will be invited to board the train and see the exhibits which will be carried for demonstration purposes.

The exhibits will consist of a carload of live stock, including dairy cattle; a carload of poultry; a crops and soils car, and a car devoted to home demonstration and farm club work.

The lectures will be given from a specially built flat car, equipped with an electrically controlled voice amplifier. The train will be electrically lighted for night meetings.

A cordial invitation is extended to women and children to be present, especially boys and girls interested in 4-H club work.
