The second annual convention of the Christian Tomberance Union of Arkansas, will meet at the Hall of the House of Representatives on Wednesday 18th Inst, at 12 Witcontinuing its business session through Wednesday, Thrusday and Friday. A farewell meeting will be held in the Hall on Friday night. Or Gospel Femperance meeting will believe on Tuesday night (27) preceding the Convention by prominent workers. Let us urge that each and all come in the spirit of prayer, so that our convention may secure the baptism of the Holy Spirit, fruitful of good results. According to the provisions of our Constitution adopted, the basis of membership to the State Union is "One delegate to every twenty-five members of local or County Unions" Alternates should be chosen to fill vacancies in case principals are unable to attend, or they can be represented by proxy, and let us have as delegates your most active and thoroughly consecrated workers. All Vice Presidents in the Counties are entitled to seats in the Convention - Blanks for credentials must in all cases be signed by the President and Decretary of the body electing them and should be presented to the Credential Committee at the Hall and with be designated by a badge of blue vibbon to secure the advantages available to delegates in Railroad and entertainment It is important to have an early report from every Union giving the names of elclegates appointed that our reception committee may be prepared to receive and and assign them to quarters immediately upon their arrival in the City. We have arranged with our Hotels and boarding houses to entertain visitors for one dollar per day. So far as possible we shall endeavor to furnish free entertainment to delegates who are not able to defray their own expenses, Arrangements are being affected with the Railroads Steam boats and other public conveyances for reduced fare. Let this be a gathering of our Temperance people that will strike terror and confusion into the ranks of the enemy and drive the accurred traffic from our borders. Prominent speakers from abroad will be in attendance, and with our motto" With malice towards none and Charity for all we can save our State from this great Cess-pool of when perance, D'eaternally yours, J J Cox J.
