This item is correspondence of the Kansas Adjutant General's Office under Charles Chadwick (1862-1863) and Guilford Dudley (1863-1864), including special orders issued by Governor Thomas Carney to Samuel N. Wood of the Morris County Rangers to detain any organized bands of guerillas near Council Grove and William P. Dutton to equip his company in Miami County. Several letters were received from John B. Gray, Missouri Adjutant General, inquiring about Missouri men that had enlisted in the Kansas militia. Most of the correspondence consists of requests for muster rolls, arms, resignations, and commissions. Other notable correspondents include Stephen A. Cobb and Sidney Clarke. Headquarters Department of the Ohio.

Cincinnati, Ohio, Sept 19th, 1863.

General:

By direction of the Major General Comdg this Department I have the honor to request you to furnish for reference at this office a list of Kansas troops Cavalry, Artillery and Infantry, in the service of the United States, giving the Department or Army in which they are serving, and station when last heard from.

This request is made in view of the numerous official communications which find their way to these Head Quarters addressed to officers of Regiments Batteries &c of which there is no record at this office and the frequent inquiries as to the location of such troops. Also to facilitate the return of apprehended deserters &c.


