Section 1, Pages 1 - 30

This item is correspondence received by the Adjutant General's Office. Josiah B. McAfee succeeded Thomas J. Anderson as Kansas Adjutant General in August 1867. The correspondence includes letters from citizens seeking to reenter the armed forces, orders for the disarmament of state militia arsenals, and claims for service records and pensions. A letter, dated June 25, 1867, from former Kansas Governor Charles Robinson, states that a list of officers commissioned during his term is no longer in his possession. Also included are several statements taken by district court clerk Mitchell G. Williams in New Albany, Wilson County, Kansas, regarding the theft and killing of horses by Osage Indians.

Resolved:— By the Senate, the House concurring, that the Governor be directed to turn the State arms now at Topeka over to the General Government & discontinue the use of the building now occupied as a State Arsenal

2^d.— That the Governor be directed to collect the State arms, & turn them over to the General Government as fast as the safety of the State will permit

3^d.— That the Quartermaster at Fort Leavenworth Kansas be respectfully requested to furnish transportation for the State Arms from the different Regimental Head Quarters in Kansas

4th.— That a copy of these resolutions be sent to the Governor, the Quarter Master at Fort Leavenworth the Quarter Master General & to each of our Senators & Representative in Congress, with the request that they use their influence to get the necessary orders for the return of these arms & transportation for the same

I enclose stamps to pay charges.



I have a very interesting case under investigation in regard to the identity of a Federal Officer buried at Millers Lea a short time before the arrival of Shermans Army - He was nursed, died and was interred as a Confederate Officer, but some things found in his valise, which are now in my possession, point most unmistakably to the fact of his having been a Union Officer in disguise - Circumstances seem to point to him as an Ohio Officer by the name of Engless, ^{a Capt. Col} but of what regiment, or from what State I am as yet unable to find out - If you can render me any aid you will confer a great favor upon his bereaved relatives, or at least put me in the way of solving the mystery -

As the Adj. Genl of Ohio I am Very Respectfully informs me that no such Officer is to be found on the rolls of that State -
