have it.

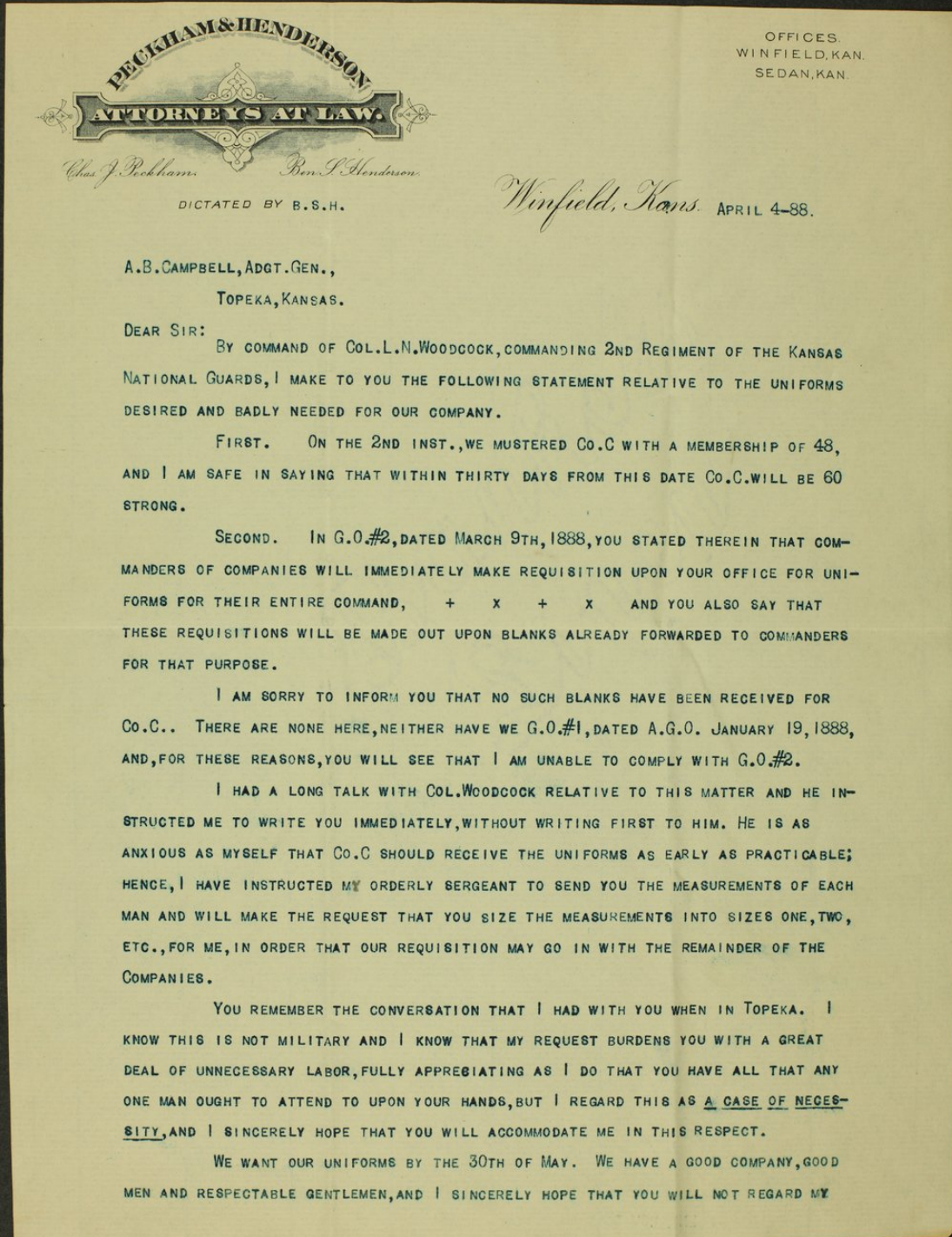

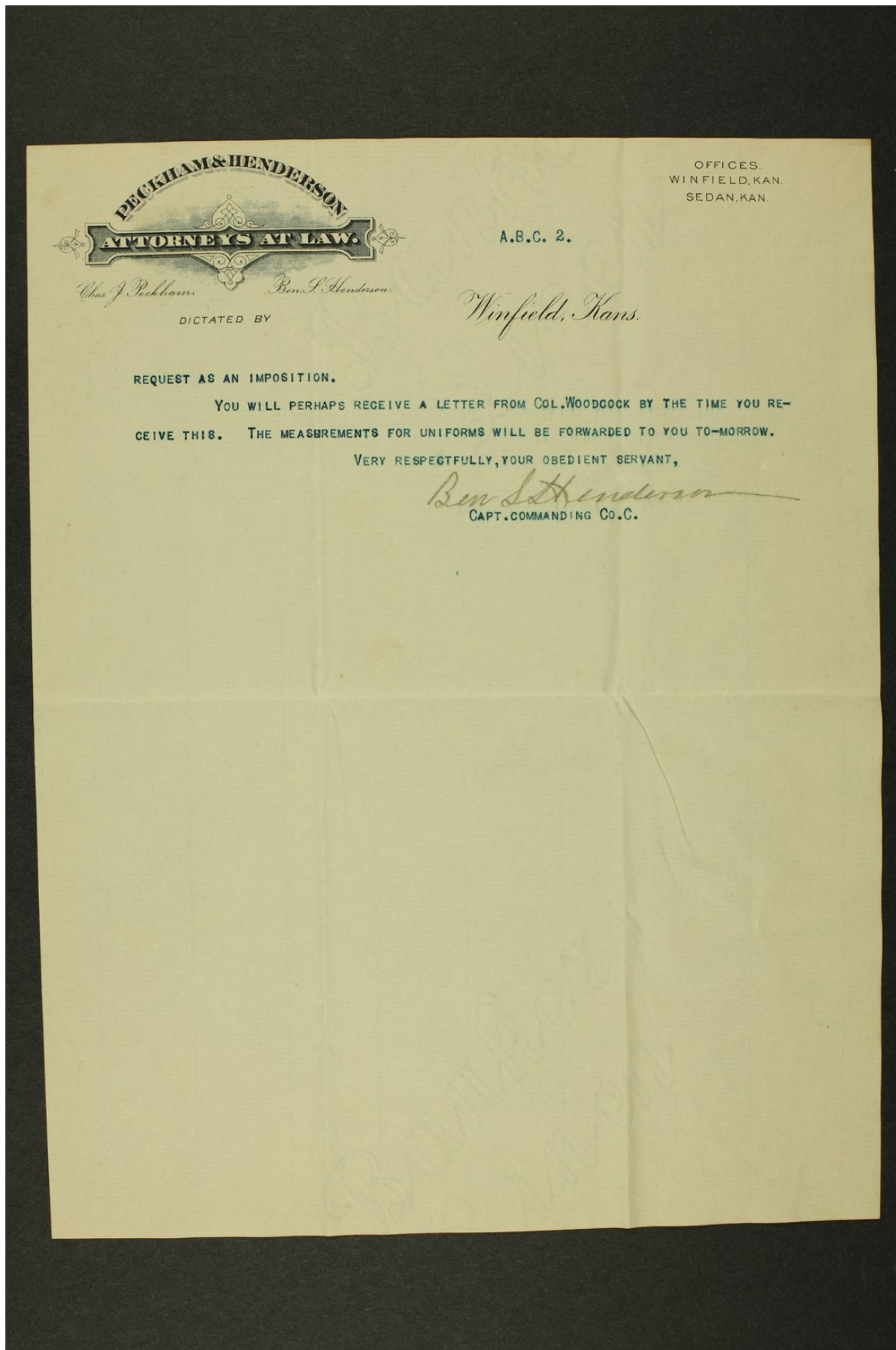
