Kansas National Guard,

Dear Sir,

The condition of things in our Company for the past few months, calls I think for some explanation from us, briefly as follows, In May last I was examined by our Colonel, for the position of Captain, resulting, he said favourably, in the aftⁿ of same day at inspection, he openly insulted 1st Lieut H. C. Daily, and myself, a fact which can be substantiated by each member of officers present. In consequence, Lieutⁿ Daily refused to send in monthly report. I (2nd Corporal and Capt Elliot) did so, Colonel Loring returned them informing me that I was not authorized to do so and must not as he would not receive them. Matters stood then, our 2nd Lieut being away. Our Armory rent was stopped, I have since made out Reports, sent them to Regimental Headquarters, but without result. My Blank Bond was not sent to me till August, I filled same & returned, but our money was low, and no prospect for any to come, a great many suits being out, I did not receipt for them.

Since that time I have succeeded in recalling all the goods, and now have them in Amory, where they are in charge of Ex. Capt Buchanan's bondsmen. We have a membership of 43 men but no commissioned officers. Lieut Daily & Smith being discharged. At this time there is about \$17⁰⁰ in fund. Not paid up to Oct 1st 1890. I cannot hear from The Colonel as to what must be done.

This is not written as a charge against anyone but as a statement of facts in explanation of matters through. Hoping to get some orders as to mode of procedure. &c. I am.





Capt Campbell intends leaving next week, He absolutely refuses to receipt for property yet would like very much to be commissioned so as to have evidence in his possession to show of his standing. He has been dealt with very nicely by you yet failed to obey entirely your instructions and desires. Consequently the Co and property drifted every where, yet he has sent communications directly to the Adjutant, over your head, entering complaints against you. The boys are now nearly all gone and others will yet go. The property being so unsafe that I have taken charge and boxed it all up, also taken an inventory. Before Capt Buschman left my string was in the armory, but since then I have been to considerable expense and time in looking up the property and as no one had charge I thought it wise to box it all up, for fear of losing more. Hoping Col that your orders regarding the disposition of the property will arrive soon I remain your friend.
