

Dear Sir:-

Regarding the competitive drill.

It is going to be perfectly satisfactory to all to have you, for this time, as exclusive judge; and you need have no fear of hurting any one's feelings either. The usual method of conducting a competitive drill is somewhat in the way of an old fashioned ~~six~~- spelling school. All stand up and those making errors to fall out.

My idea is that all will begin with inspection and that the dress arms and bearing be marked during this ceremony. Then that the company be drilled in school of the soldier and manual and those manifestly inferior asked to fall out one by one. Not one slight error in manual necessary at first to cause failure, but the four or five experts in this case, will soon appear and be left alone.

Then the judgement can become more rigid and a small break cause a man to lose his place in the line. I am sorry about the result of efforts for law but I have feared that this would be the result. Dear Sir

Some time ago Capt W. C. Davies of C. C. made application for a (60) days leave of absence it was approved by me and forwarded to your Office for your approval but for some reason he never received the leave asked for however he is absent in Colorado and is absent without leave according to rules and regulations I have just received his monthly reports from him made out in Colorado based from a report made out by his 1st Sergt and forwarded to him the reports show that Capt Davies is absent with leave he also certifies to the correctness of the report he also desires to remain in command of the Co and requests that all communications be forwarded to him I do not know his object other such a thing cannot be he at the same time informs me that it is more than likely remain there permanently I will hold his reports until I hear from you in the matter I would like very much if you could grant him 30 days leave of absence I will also write to Lieut J.
