In the evening, Capt. J. M. J. Samms, "7th Infantry W. S. & "Instructor, Department of Law "Infantry and Cavalry School", delivered a Lecture on "Relations of the Military to the Civil Authorities," which was very instructive to the Officers of the Second bringing out many points in Law, in which the Officers were heretofore uninformed.

Friday morning. Instructions in the "School of the Soldiers" and "Duties of Officer" were continued, after which the "Duties of Guard Mounting" and proper methods of posting and relieving Sentinels was demonstrated. All the Officers taking part armed and equipped as enlisted men.


Battalion movements were taken up during the afternoon. the Officers being divided into Companies to practically demonstrate the different Battalion movements.

I have not yet received any information from the Leavenworth committee having in charge the collection of funds to buy rations for the National Guard at the proposed encampment on the Ft. Leavenworth reservation.

Business will call me to Ottawa tomorrow; but I will probably return Friday morning. If you should desire to communicate with me tomorrow or tomorrow night, send it in care of Major Atkinson.

Will it be possible for you to secure a cavalry guidon before the next encampment?

Topeka Kansas October 1st, 1894.

Dear Sir:-

As it is possible that the Second Regiment Kansas National Guard, will be ordered into camp at Arkansas City, as early as Monday October 8th. I send you this letter of caution, as the time intervening is short.

This is mearly a request from this department calling your attention; that the attention of the men may be called in order, that they might be in a position and make arrangements to the end that they may be able to attend this encampment. If arrangements are completed for holding this encampment on October 8th closing Octobet 13th orders will be issued from this department by W're to you.







Sir:--

I have the honor to inform you that in answer to my proposition to a number of the leading towns in the First Brigade District, asking for certain supplies and money for our encampment, I have received the following telegram from Capt. C. S. Flanders, dated Paola, Kansas, 6:30 P. M. Oct. 4th, " Your proposition for encampment is accepted, letter follows this evening."

As I have estimated it, the expenses for an encampment at Paola will be no more, and perhaps less, than if held at Ottawa, for the reason that at Paola Company C. is stationed and would not have to be moved.


If Capt. Flanders has really secured all that I have asked for namely: Wood, water, camp ground free, straw for tents, lumber for tables and boxing in straw, feed for troop horses, 20 to 25 horses for use of Battery and Field and Staff Officers, all drayage free,
