Enclosed please find communications from Capt. Houston Co. F. and Lt Neff of the Board concerning their inability to attend the Officers School and encampment at St Riley Oct 19th to 24th inclusive as per G.O. #14 & G.O. 1896.

The following officers for the reasons given have stated they could not attend,
1st Lt. Koenke Co. "A" could not find a man to take his place and could not leave his job.

Capt. H.C. Loonis Co "C" reached Junction City Monday night where he was confined to his room at the hotel until Thursday morning when he returned home without visiting the camp, or otherwise reporting.

1st Lt. J.J. Norton Co. "D" could not leave his business.

2^d Lt. Hawley Co. "E" reason same as above.

These excuses were given me verbally and in letter, containing references to other matter, and on file in this office. They are satisfactory to me and I trust may be so to the Commander in Chief.



Dear Sir:

Inclosed you will find supplemental receipt from Col. Hoisington, also letter by copy, explaining the question and disposition of saddles, with you have made so much complaint about turning over. I have no property in my care or custody belonging to the State or to the General Government, consequently have none to turn over. All property in my charge as Colonel of the Second Regiment has been turned over to Colonel Hoisington my successor and is now in his hands or in charge of either his Staff or Non-Commissioned Staff. My saddle was taken to Emporia Encampment by Major Hayes and turned over to the Chief Trumpeter and then by orders of Colonel Hoisington was issued to Major Armstrong who is Regimental Surgeon, and by him reported to and as Colonel Hoisington says, charged by you to him.. The saddle of the Quartermaster Lieut. J. P. Norton, then and now the Regimental Quartermaster, was issued by you to him direct on a requisition approved by myself last June. This is the one Colonel Hoisington failed to report as he states in his letter. He should have received me for both possibly, although I do not see how I am charged with it and Lieut Norton be charged with it too. You may know. The frying pan and Camp Kettles were procured for Capt D^o Douglas.
