In enclosing memorandum of annual contribution to this Association, I invite your attention to the fact that under the operation of the Dick bill, your State will receive from the National Government, arms and equipment approximating in value \$23,920. apart from and not chargeable against your proportion of the annual U. S. appropriation, in addition to other actual money benefits, annually.

The Dick bill is on the Senate calendar as unfinished business, comes up first at the January session and will undoubtedly become law without delay.

I have the honor to say that the legitimate and necessary expenses incident to the framing and passage of this bill have been more than double the amount of the annual contribution from the States and I am confident that if the State authorities could realize the amount of labor, in addition to heavy money advances by individuals, a means would be devised to contribute considerably more than the amounts
