
Dear Captain:

Trusting this explanation is adequate, I am,

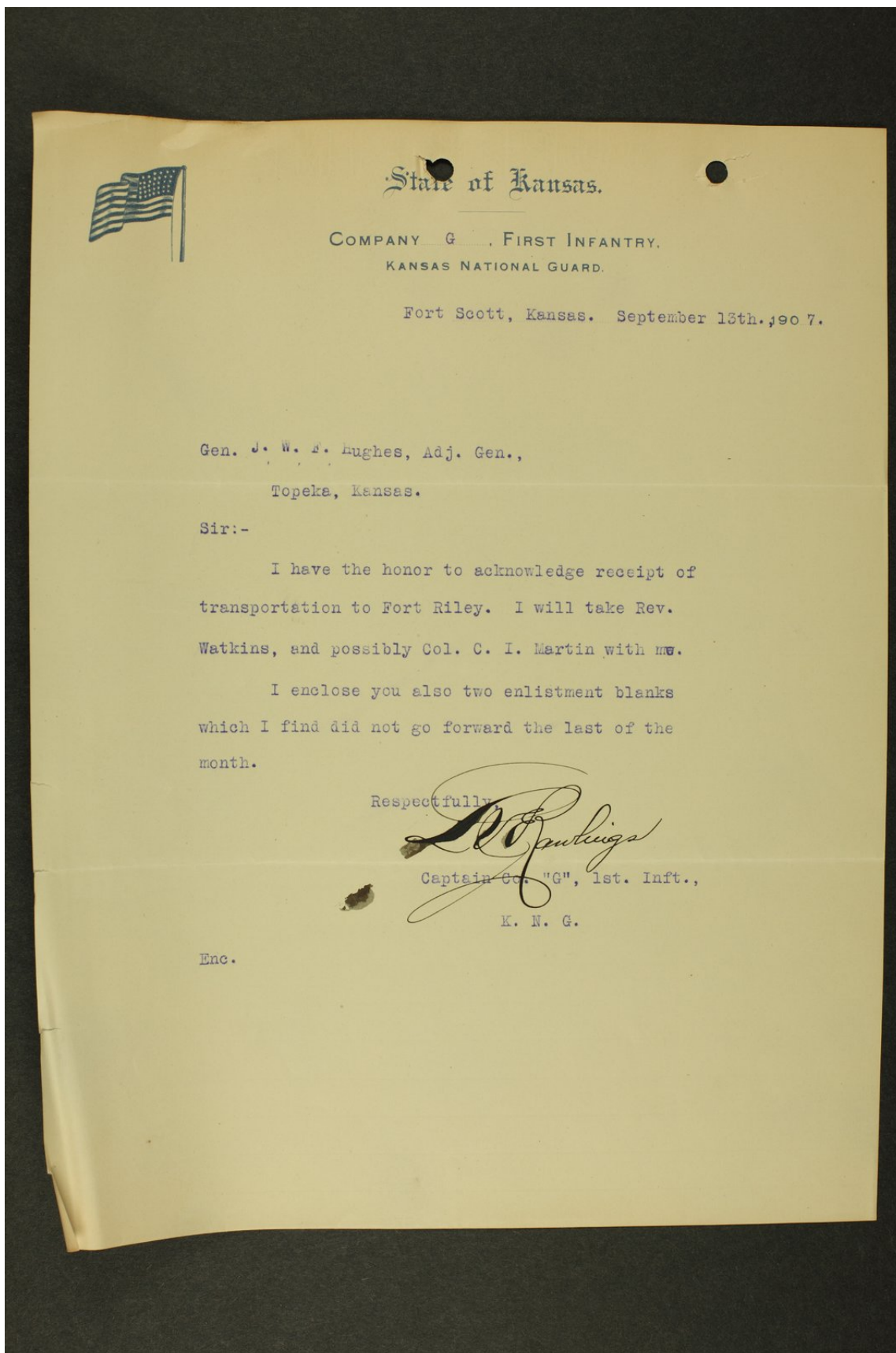

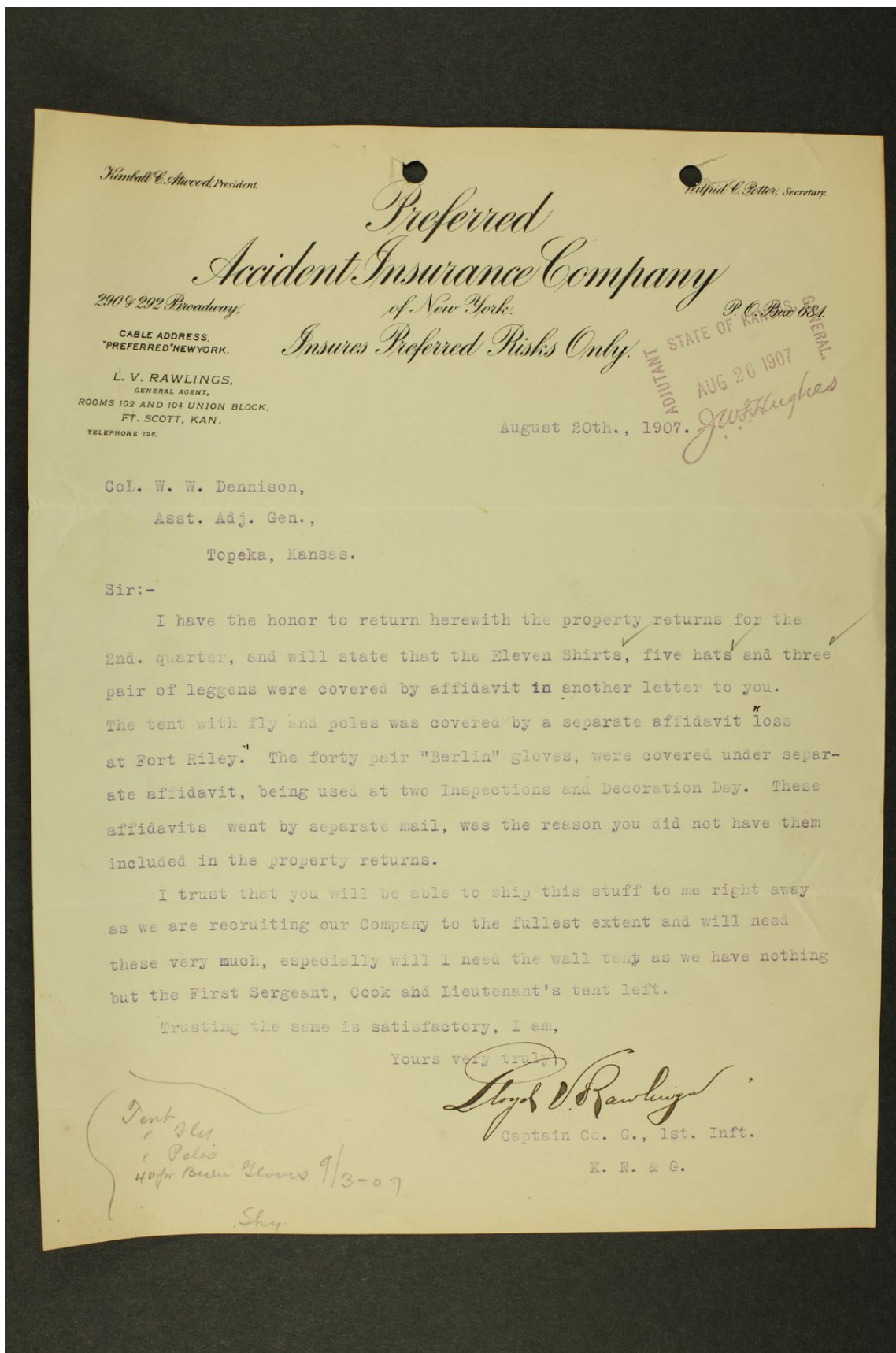

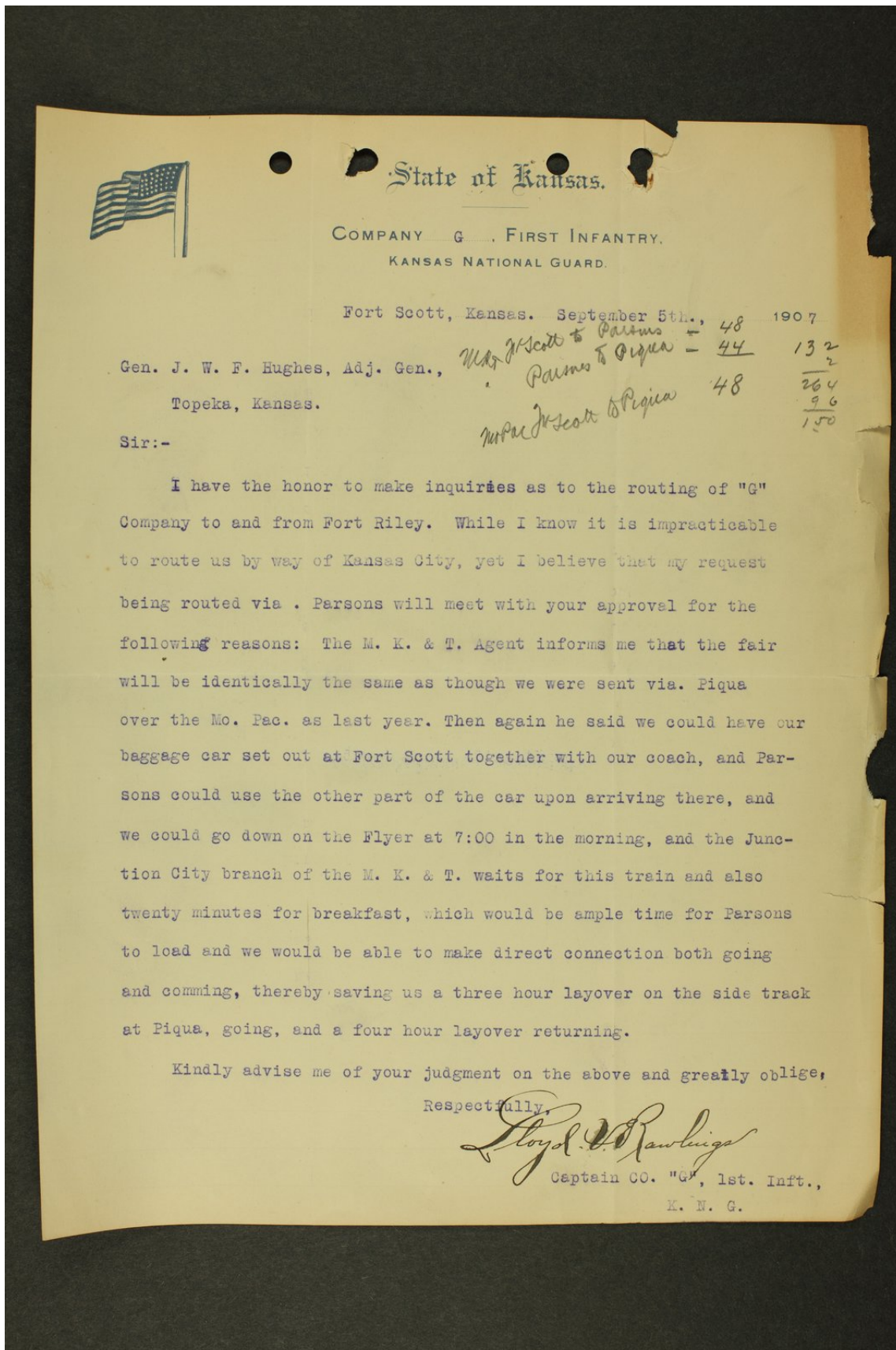
Kansas Adjutant General correspondence by companies, 1905-1910

I have the honor to make inquiries as to the routing of "G" Company to and from Fort Riley. While I know it is impracticable to route us by way of Kansas City, yet I believe that my request being routed via . Parsons will meet with your approval for the following reasons: The M. K. & T. Agent informs me that the fair will be identically the same as though we were sent via. Piqua over the Mo. Pac. as last year. Then again he said we could have our baggage car set out at Fort Scott together with our coach, and Parsons could use the other part of the car upon arriving there, and we could go down on the Flyer at 7:00 in the morning, and the Junction City branch of the M. K. & T. waits for this train and also twenty minutes for breakfast, which would be ample time for Parsons to load and we would be able to make direct connection both going and coming, thereby saving us a three hour layover on the side track at Piqua, going, and a four hour layover returning.

Kindly advise me of your judgment on the above and greatly oblige,

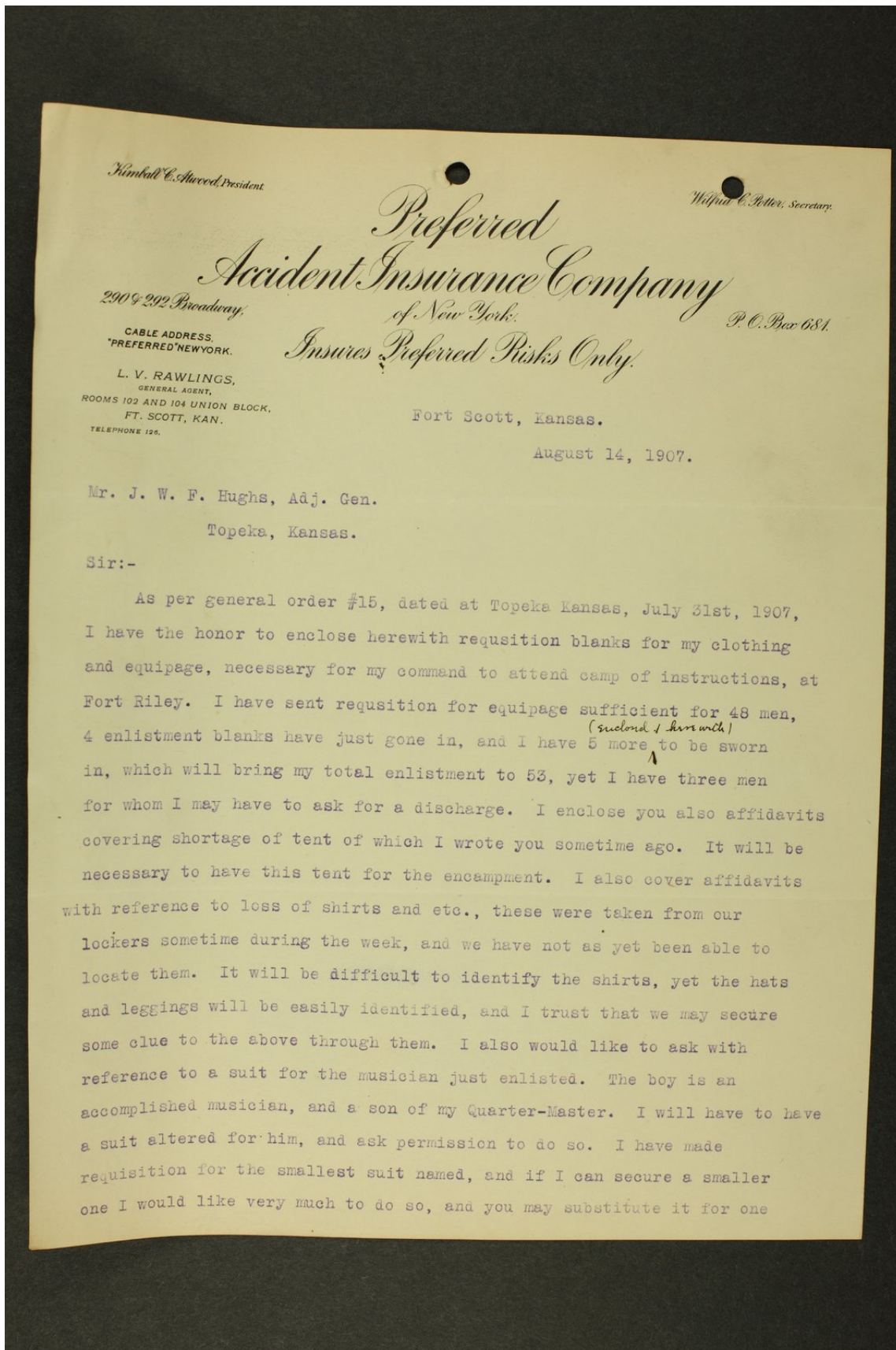

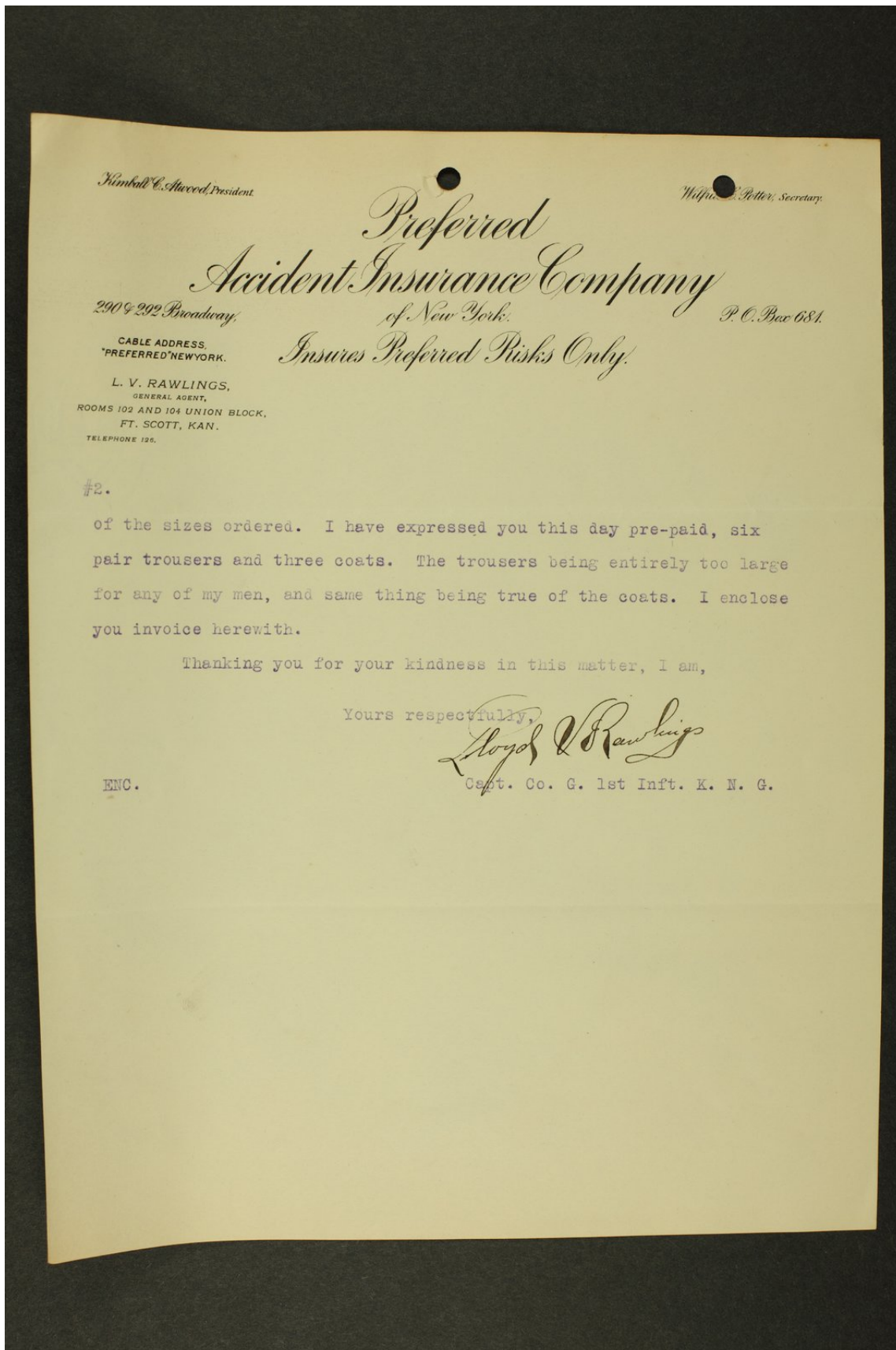
