My dear Governor

At the last meeting of the  
 Leav. Prohibition Club I was requested  
 to write, and ask you to come over to  
 Leavenworth, and deliver a lecture  
 to the Colored people of this City - the  
 time to be designated by yourself.

The Col. people are ignorant of the  
 nature of the Const. Amendment & the friends  
 think, that if you would condescend to  
 come & talk to them, we might have a  
 good vote from them, as it is now, they  
 fear the Runn party - have them under  
 their influence - The Col. folks have  
 a good sized Church, in the Northern part  
 of the City - where the meeting could be held.

Please acknowledge this & state your
