Also included is correspondence between the citizens volunteering for the Kansas State Militia and government officials, including Adjutant General Guilford Dudley, Adjutant General Cyrus K. Holliday, Governor Charles L. Robinson, and Governor Thomas Carney.

Having some little responsibility placed upon me I proceed to address you in as few lines as possible stating the fact that we have organized in accordance with your proclamation and now wish to ascertain if we can get arms. We would like to get them very much as we are some-what exposed to north west Missouri and also that we have been threatened by Rebels in and around Nebraska City who have been driven from Mo. who say their day is not far distant when they will clean out northern Kansas before any assistance can get to us. I am aware that others need arms as well as ourselves but notwithstanding I think that we stand in need of arms as well as any. As we now are raid after raid could be made from Missouri without the least molestation the Rebels knowing that we are without arms, therefore we most humbly beg your excellency to inform us whether we can get arms, and forward us the information the same time you send us our commissions this being all that is necessary at present I will close.
