Memorandum

In 1864 there was a large militia force in Ohio enlisted for service within the State - this force was well organized by companies and regiments in every County. By a somewhat arbitrary Order, which received the sanction of the Society of War, about thirty thousand of this militia force was mustered into the service of the U.S. for One Hundred days, with the understanding that they were to do only Post or guard duty. There were strong protests from a large number against their being taken outside the State - Some went so far as to engage a ~~lawyer~~ lawyer to take their protests to the Governor and to argue the unconstitutionality of his Order. Nevertheless they were sent outside the State and performed well the duties assigned them. There were large forces of One Hundred Days' men sent forward from other States at the same time but the Governors of those States did not seem to be as watchful of their States' finances as was Brown of Ohio, and did not get their Hundred Days' men mustered into the U.S. service. The Government afterward refunded to those States the amount paid by them on that account. Notwithstanding the fact of their having been mustered into the U.S. service there are many who claim that the One Hundred Days' men of Ohio are no ~~less~~ more entitled to membership in the Order than the One Hundred Days' men of other States who had like orders and did like service.

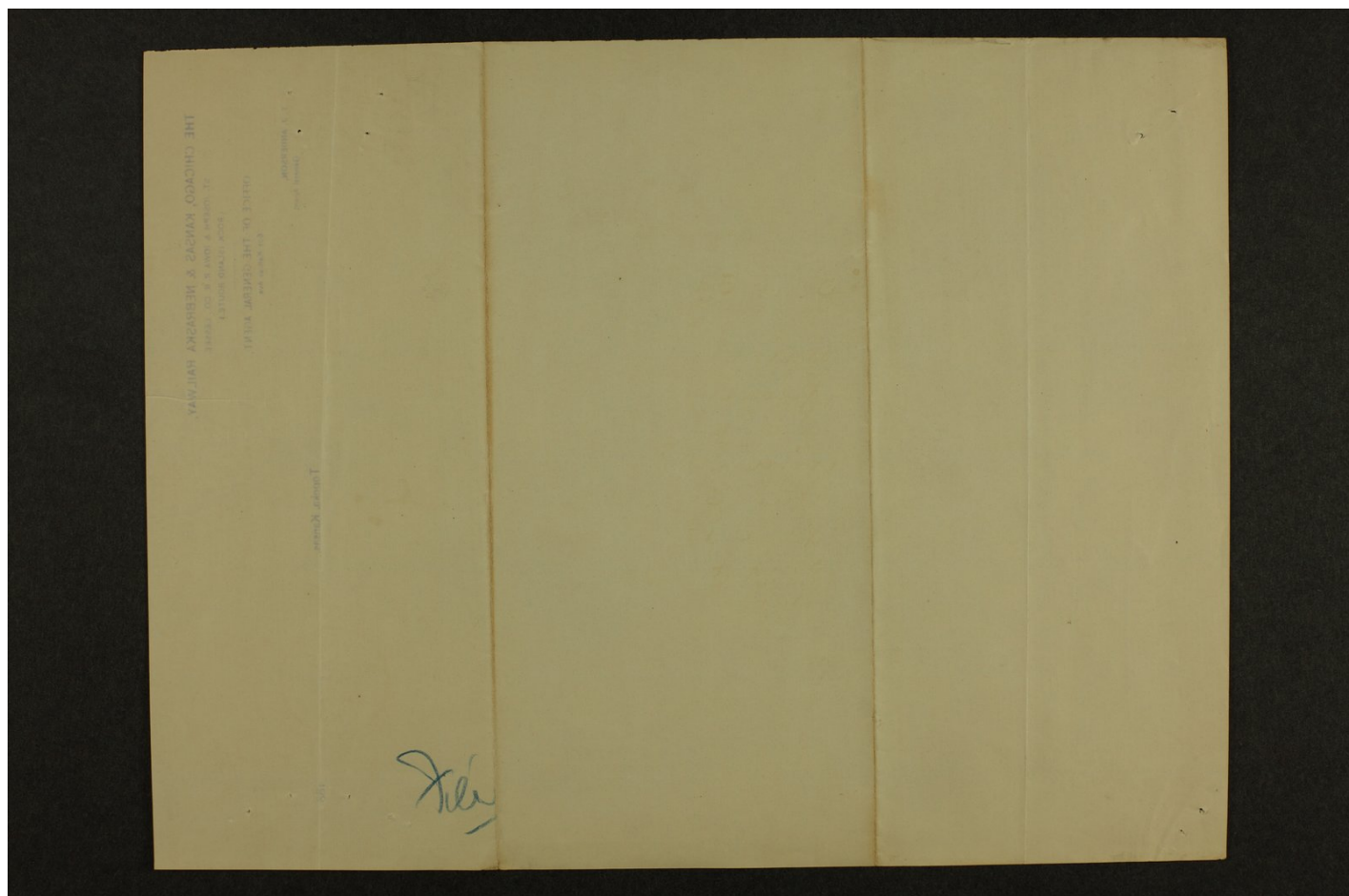

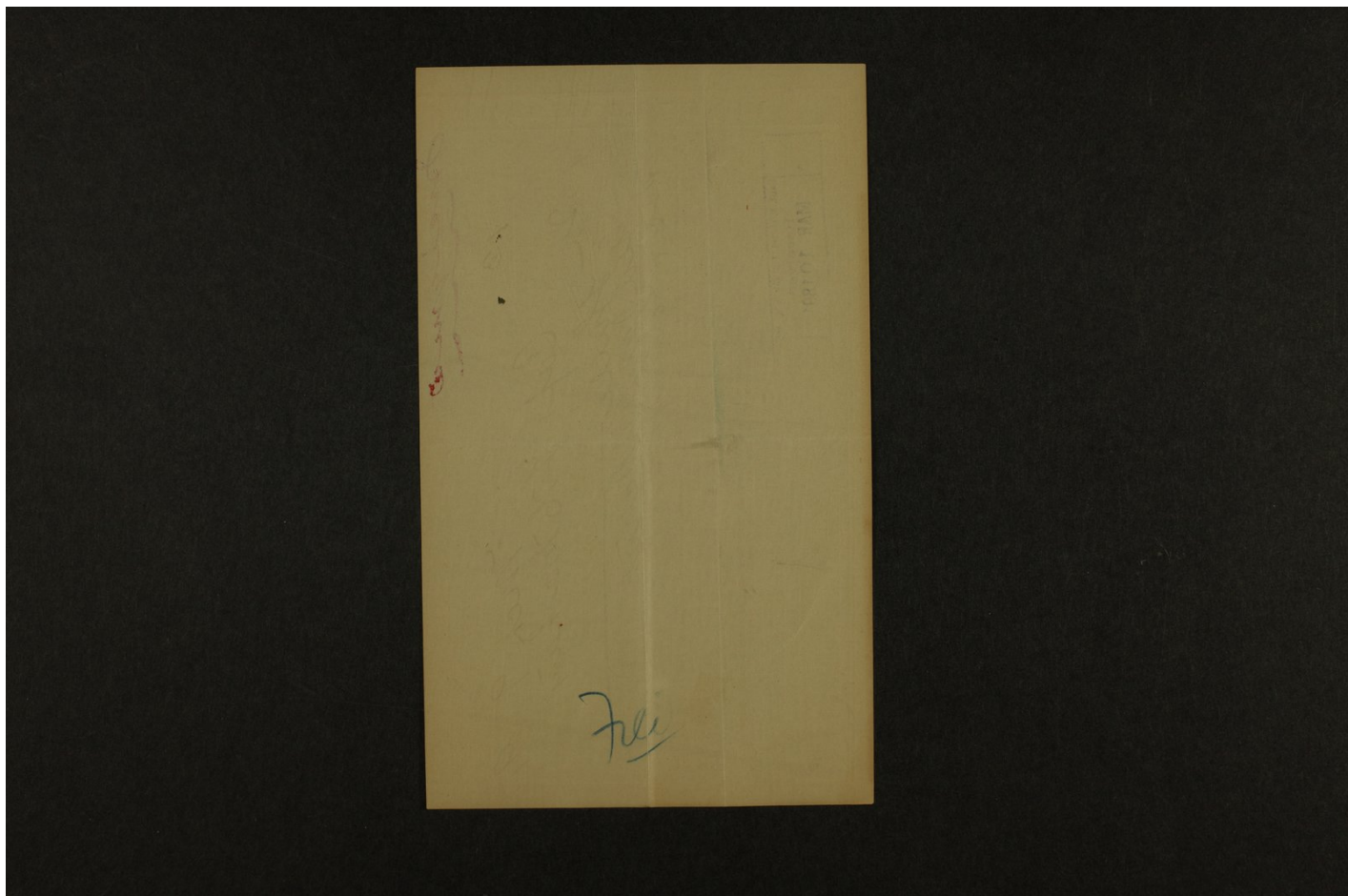
