

Rolla Clymer correspondence

This series of the Rolla Clymer collection includes sent and received correspondence arranged chronologically beginning in 1909. With few exceptions, the correspondence provides a continuous and very complete view of his activities. Much of the earliest correspondence in the Clymer collection pertains to information about the College of Emporia for the period Clymer was a student there. Scattered throughout the remainder of the correspondence is information about Emporia athletics and alumni activities and letters with former classmates. From 1914 to 1918, Clymer was editor and manager of the Olathe, Kansas, Register. In 1918, Rolla Clymer moved his young family to El Dorado, Kansas, where he became editor and manager of the El Dorado Republican. Except for a six month hiatus in 1937 as editor and manager of the Santa Fe New Mexican in Santa Fe, New Mexico, Clymer served the remainder of his professional career in El Dorado.

In his later years, Clymer devoted much of his time to efforts to preserve the Kansas Flint Hills region which he dearly loved. In addition to newspaper editorials, he wrote and published numerous widely circulated articles and poems about the Flint Hills. Perhaps his best known tribute was his poem "Majesty of the Hills," which helped earn him the designation as Poet Laureate of the Flint Hills. Rolla Clymer died on June 4, 1977, having been the editor of the El Dorado Times for fifty-nine years. For a complete contents list of the Rolla Clymer collection, see the External Links below.

Hillard: Shortly after you left today, we cancelled whatever tentative arrangements we had made toward filling the vacancy that will shortly occur in our job department, and decided to offer you the job on their terms of \$42.50 per week, stated in our conversation this morning. 

This letter will substantiate a telephone message that I intend to convey to Mr. Micholson. We should like to know at once your decision in the matter, and will ask you to



If there are any of the recommendations listed which you do not understand, we shall be very glad to have you write us regarding them and we will give you full explanation.



Gentle men:

On reviewing our file we find that you have not yet replied to our letters recently mailed you relative to list of recommendations submitted as a result of inspection of your premises under date of April 21, 1920.

In giving this matter your earnest consideration, we feel that you will no doubt appreciate the full value of our inspector's suggestions, inaemuch as each item covers a cause of accidents always resulting in loss of time, loss in efficiency, loss in production and other losses which very materially affect the general operation of your plant, as well as the rating. Then too, your moral obligation to do everything possible to prevent accidents to your employees should be considered.

The great humanitarian principle involved should, we believe be an incentive toward cooperation with us in this accident prevention work; and, as considerable time has elapsed since the inspection of your premises and receiving no word from you in the meantime, we again bring the matter before you and trust that you will favor us with an expression indicating the progress shown in this work of making improvements.

Trusting that this matter will receive your best attention and in anticipation of your reply to the above, we remain.
