send the following list of articles for
Kansas, in 3 barrels marked 301, -2, -3.

301) Contains about 70 art. namely
Underclothes for men - women & children
of bleached & unbleached cotton and
canton flannel - one muslin
de-laine dress, remnant of muslin
de-laine, nearly one piece of shirting
and one gent's Coat, ^{drilled} Bag of beans, price

302) about 30 art. viz:
8 shirts of blue canton flannel & 2 men's
coats of same & children's Calico dresses & Calico
morning dresses 1/2 doz pair woolen drawers
1 doz. pair of woolen socks - 6 talmas
1 piece of gray flannel - 1 of worsted & cotton plaid
2 second hand articles.

303) - 8 Comfortables - remnant of
cashmere from wh. talmas were cut,
1 piece of siffray Calico, 1 doz. towels
& shawls, 1 piece of satin & remnants of cassimere.

We send \$12.00 for freight; if not enough
please inform - I shall mark barrels so
that it may be known whether they arrive at
Kansas in safety. Any information may be
