

Record of Claims allowed for losses by guerillas and marauders during 1861-1865

Section 4, Pages 91 - 120

This volume contains 509 claims submitted and allowed for losses due to raids in Kansas during the Civil War. The bulk of the claims relate to Quantrill's raid on Lawrence, August 21, 1863. Other specific incidents were attacks on Humboldt, Kansas, in September and October, 1861, on Olathe, Kansas, September 6 and 7, 1862, and numerous attacks in Johnson County, Kansas, throughout the war years. There may be claims for incidents in a few other counties as there is at least one for Miami County, Kansas. Claims were presented to a special commission established by the Kansas Legislature in 1875. The commissioners were John N. Murdoch, Ottawa, Kansas; C. D. French, Lawrence, Kansas; and William H Beur, Burlington, Kansas. The commission was organized March 18, 1875, and the commissioners were sworn in by D. W. Wilder, Auditor. Murdoch was elected chairman and Beur served as clerk. The commissioners began receiving claims in Ottawa on April 20, 1875. The first claim was for losses from a raid of guerillas on July 1, 1861, in Cherokee County. It contains a general list of losses and amounts: dwelling house, household goods, cattle, and hogs. This format is used for the first 43 pages. Entries after that give the names of the claimants, where they lived, and the amount of money approved. There is a alphabetical name index at the beginning of the volume. One sheet, page numbers 7 and 8 (front and back), has been removed from the volume. Most of the claims are marked paid on by the Auditor in 1887 or 1888. The last three claims in the volume were submitted in 1891.

No 287. A Katzenstein of Lawrence Kansas, appeared and was duly sworn. After hearing his testimony and proof the Board find that on the 21st day of August 1863, at Lawrence Kansas by reason of Quaintrels Raid the said A Katzenstein sustained losses amounting to \$512.00 and issued him a Certificate accordingly.

No 288. Hiram Hunter of Lawrence Kansas, appeared before the Board and was duly sworn after hearing his testimony and proof the Board find that on the 21st day of August 1863, at Lawrence Kansas, by reason of Quaintrels Raid the said Hiram Hunter lost property of the value of \$250.00 and issued him a Certificate accordingly.

After hearing the testimony and proof offered the Board find that on the 21st day of August 1863, at Lawrence Kansas, by reason of Quaintrels Raid the said E W Morgan, lost property of the value of \$7900.00 and issued him a certificate accordingly.

No 290 The claim of Matthew Anderson of Lawrence Kansas, was presented by J W Hendry. After hearing the testimony and proof offered the Board find that on the 21st day of August 1863, at Lawrence Kansas by reason of Quaintrels Raid the said Matthew Anderson, sustained a loss of \$411.00 and issued him a certificate accordingly.

No 291 James W Hendry, of Lawrence Kansas, appeared before the Board and was duly sworn. After hearing his testimony and proof the Board find that on the 21st day of August 1863, at Lawrence Kansas, by reason of Quaintrels Raid the said James W Hendry, lost property of the value of \$288.00 and issued him a certificate accordingly.

No 292 The claim of the Estate of Aaron Case, was presented by Mrs A Pincroft, of Topeka Kansas former widow of said Aaron Case. After hearing the testimony and proof offered the Board find that on the 14th day of Oct 1861 at Haysville Kansas, by reason of the invasion of a band of guerrillas under command of Livingston and Matthews the said Aaron Case sustained a loss of \$1100.00 and issued a certificate to said Estate accordingly.

No 294 The claim of the estate of D C Beach, was presented by Mrs A C Beach of Lawrence the widow. After hearing the testimony and proof the Board find that on the 21st day of August 1863 at Lawrence Kansas, by reason of Quaintrels Raid the said D C Beach lost property of the value of \$80.⁰⁰ And issued a Certificate to said Estate accordingly.

No 295 The claim of Mrs Mary R Thurston, of Humboldt Kansas, was presented after duly causing the testimony and proof offered the Board find that in the month of Sept 1861 at Humboldt Kansas, by reason of the invasion of a band of Guerrillas, under command of Livingston and others the said Mary R Thurston, lost property of the value of \$224.⁰⁰ And issued her a Certificate accordingly.

No 296 The Estate of A W White presents a claim by Mrs Elinor G White the widow of Lawrence Kansas. After hearing the testimony and proof the Board find that on the 21st day of August 1863, at Lawrence Kansas, by reason of Quaintrels Raid the said A W White sustained losses amounting to \$1100.⁰⁰ And issued a Certificate to said Estate accordingly.
