

#### Council of National Defense Woman's Committee correspondence

This collection consists of correspondence between individuals and committee members to the state chair of the Woman's Committee of the Kansas Council of National Defense. The Council of National Defense was established at the federal level in 1916 as an emergency agency under the Army Appropriation Act and abolished in 1921. It was created in reaction to World War I to coordinate resources and industries for national defense and improve civilian morale. The Woman's Committee of the Kansas Council of National Defense performed the same functions at the state and local levels, coordinating women's activities for national defense. The materials are organized alphabetically by county. The digitization of this collection was paid for through the Margot R. Swovelan Endowment Fund.
































































































### Council of National Defense Woman's Committee correspondence

Servard

September 25, 1918.

Mrs. R. Harrison,

County Chairman,

Liberal, Kansas.

Dear Mrs. Harrison: -

I have been informed that you are either going to leave Liberal or have already gone and this will make it necessary to have a successor for your work as county chairman. It was suggested to me also that either Miss Saunders, Secretary to the Chairman of the Council of Defense, or Mrs. Atzold, wife of Judge Atzold, would make a good chairman. If I am correctly informed about your leaving Liberal, will you not call your committee together and provide for a successor and if either of the ladies su gested would be at liberty to accept the appointment, will you kindly consider these names? You are so well acquainted with the people of your community that I would very much prefer you should look after this matter in the regular way than to attempt myself to secure a successor from this distance and unacquainted with people and conditions there.
