This collection consists of correspondence between individuals and committee members to the state chair of the Woman's Committee of the Kansas Council of National Defense. The Council of National Defense was established at the federal level in 1916 as an emergency agency under the Army Appropriation Act and abolished in 1921. It was created in reaction to World War I to coordinate resources and industries for national defense and improve civilian morale. The Woman's Committee of the Kansas Council of National Defense performed the same functions at the state and local levels, coordinating women's activities for national defense. The materials are organized alphabetically by county. The digitization of this collection was paid for through the Margot R. Swovelan Endowment Fund.

August 15. 1910. Mr. A.D. Crooks, Fredchia, Kansas. Dear Mr. Crocks:-I hope the blanks feached you in good condition and that this work has not been too great a burden for you. you have inquiries concerning civilian service, an enrollment card alone will be accepted necause of the shortage of blanks and later they will be sent direct to the applicant from Washington. The shortage of planks was such a serious handicap that I have written a circular letter to my county chairmen explaining the matter and am enclosing you a copy so you may understand the handicap under which we have been working. Our chairmen have worked leyally in spite of thenheat and the lack of material and Kansas can be proud of our loyal women, octh recruiting officers and student nurses. Thanking you for your assistance and hoping to have a return of your blanks at your early convenience, I am, Sincerely yours, Enc. State Chairman.
