



TRUST DEED conveying estate to uses, to be stamped as a conveyance.

All Affidavits are exempt from stamp duty.

(Probate of wills, letters testamentary or of administration, or administrator's or guardian's bonds, when the value of the estate and effects, real and personal, does not exceed one thousand dollars, require no stamp.)	
PROTEST of note, bill of exchange, acceptance, check or draft, or any marine protest, whether protested by a notary public or by any other officer who may be authorized by law to make such protest.25
RECEIPT for any sum of money, or for the payment of any debt exceeding \$50 in amt', not being for the satisfaction of any mortgage or judgment or decree of any court, or by indorsement on any stamped obligation in acknowledgingment of its fulfilment.02
PLAYING CARDS, for and upon every pack, not exceeding fifty-two cards in number, irrespective of price or value.05
PRESERVED MEATS, Fruits, &c., prepared or sold in the U. S., each can, bottle, or single package, not exceeding two pounds in weight.01
Every additional pound or part thereof, 1 cent more.

NOTE The indiscriminate use of all kinds of stamps (except postage or proprietary) is permitted, care being	
taken to affix a stamp or stamps of the proper amount.	
Documents made in any foreign country, to be used in the United States, shall pay the same duty as when made here. The party to whom the same is issued, or by whom it is used, shall affix thereon the proper stamp, before using.	
Powers of Attorney, or other papers relating to applications for bounties, arrearages of pay, or pensions, require no stamp; neither do indorsement of negotiable instrument, nor any warrants of attorney accompanying a bond or note when such bond or note shall be stamped; and whenever any bond or note shall be secured by mortgage, but one stamp duty is required, provided the stamp duty placed thereon is the highest rate required for said instrument, or either of them.	
No document signed or issued prior to June 1st, 1803, without being stamped, shall be invalid for that reason; but it shall not be admitted or used in any court until it shall have been stamped, and the initials of the person using, and the date when it is used, placed thereon.	
The person using or affixing the stamp or stamps, shall write thereupon the initials of his name and the date upon which the same shall be attached or used, so that the same shall not be used again, under a penalty of \$50; or they may be otherwise canceled as the Commissioner of Internal Revenue may prescribe.	
Official instruments issued or used by United States officers are exempt.	
All wilful neglect to comply with the conditions of these Stamp Duties will be punished as the law directs.

VENUS will be Morning Star until May 9th, and Evening Star the rest of the year.

JUPITER will be Evening Star until April 17th, then Morning Star till November 8th, and Evening Star again the rest of the year.
