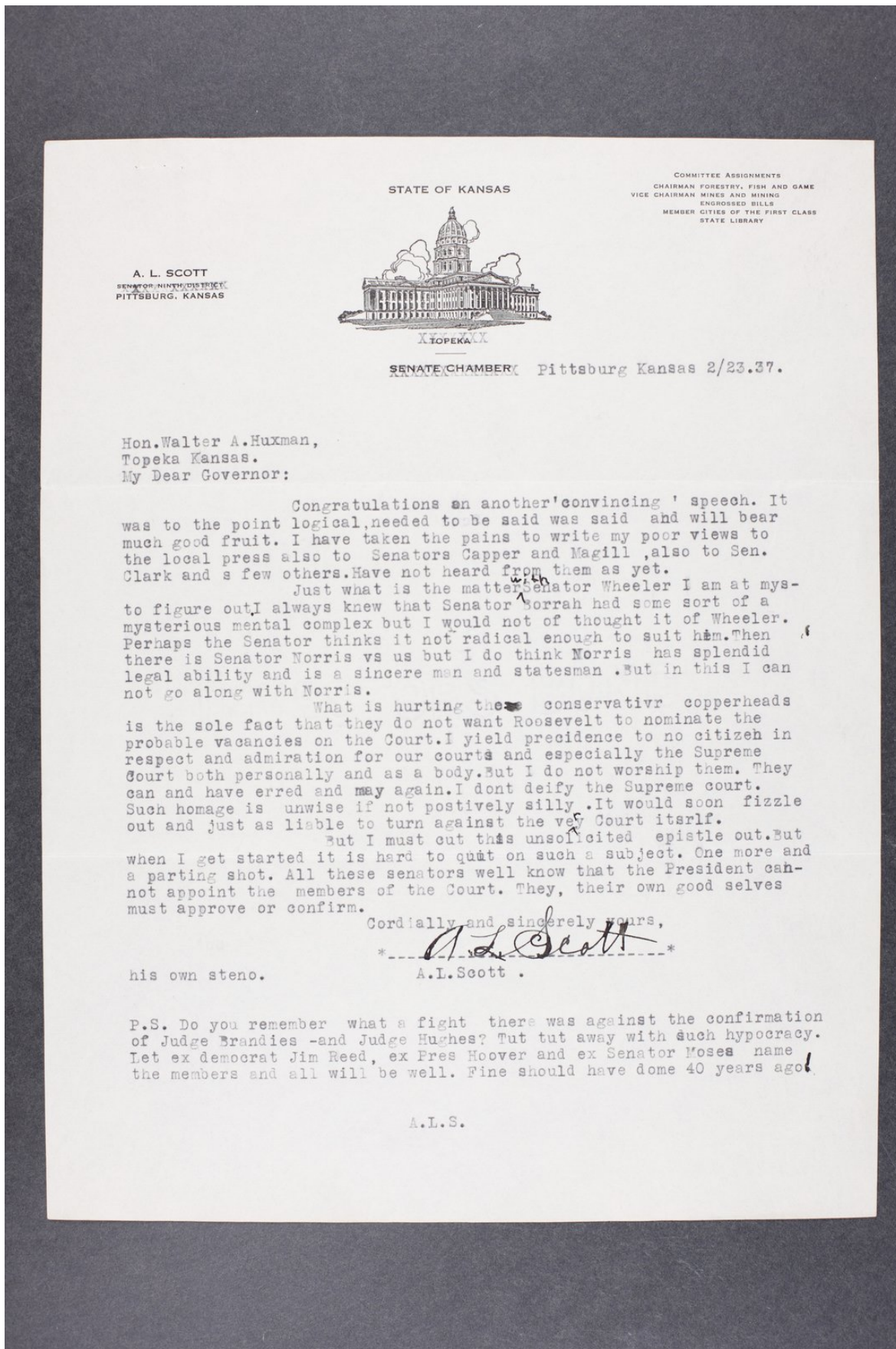

ROOSEVELT, THE SUPREME COURT AND THE COPPERHEADS.

To the Editor:

The President has stirred up quite a gale of unfavorable criticism because of his recent message to the Congress recommending a very slight reorganization of the Supreme Court and the United States circuit courts which are badly congested. It seems to be the idea of the President to have these various departments of government so organized that they function in an efficient and progressive manner.

I do not maintain that the courts are above criticism yet ill tempered and unwise criticism of them is to be deplored and hardly the role of good citizenship. But why should the courts be shielded from such critics and not the executive branch of our government? These vile critics heretofore called "conservatives" do not hesitate to hurl such epithets at the executive department of our government as "dictator," "socialist," "Fascist," "communist" designs to "pack" the Supreme Court, etc.

While it seems more reasonable to conclude that if there is any packing to be done at all the President may only be trying to "unpack" the court as well as to reorganize it for efficiency.

But these critics do not now merit the name of "conservatives." What really fits them like a glove is the name "Copperheads." They feign to be greatly grieved because that under the President's plan, if superannuated judges who have reached the age limit do not resign the President may appoint younger and more efficient men. Certainly that ought to be no crime under a free and efficient government.

But these "Copperheads" are not the only critics of the President. There is a venerable class of sob-sisters and weak-minded men who part their hair in the middle that go even further than venerate our Su-

preme Court. They hold it in much the same vision as do the real religious Chinese who worship their ancestors. Just what these venerables think of Jefferson, Jackson and Abraham Lincoln who very severely criticized the Supreme Court would be interesting indeed.

Yet there is a sure and certain remedy which would cure the "Copperheads" over night and here it is: Let the Congress pass a resolution empowering three of these "Copperheads" to name the supreme judges for Roosevelt to appoint and that will settle all opposition in a jiffy.

Then there is the "Copperhead" press which schemed to abandon the field of journalism last campaign and undertook to defeat Roosevelt for reelection. They made few of their readers believe that Mr. Landon would win. But apparently these journals are similar to the Bourbons of France, who never forgot anything and never learned anything.

To people of intelligence it would seem that the last election should have taught these journalistic fascists just what the people thought of them. But some people will just not learn.

Again, all persons appointed to our highest court must first be confirmed by the United States Senate. So why all this "much ado over nothing" but the very thinnest camouflage. A tip: Now just watch Roosevelt win.

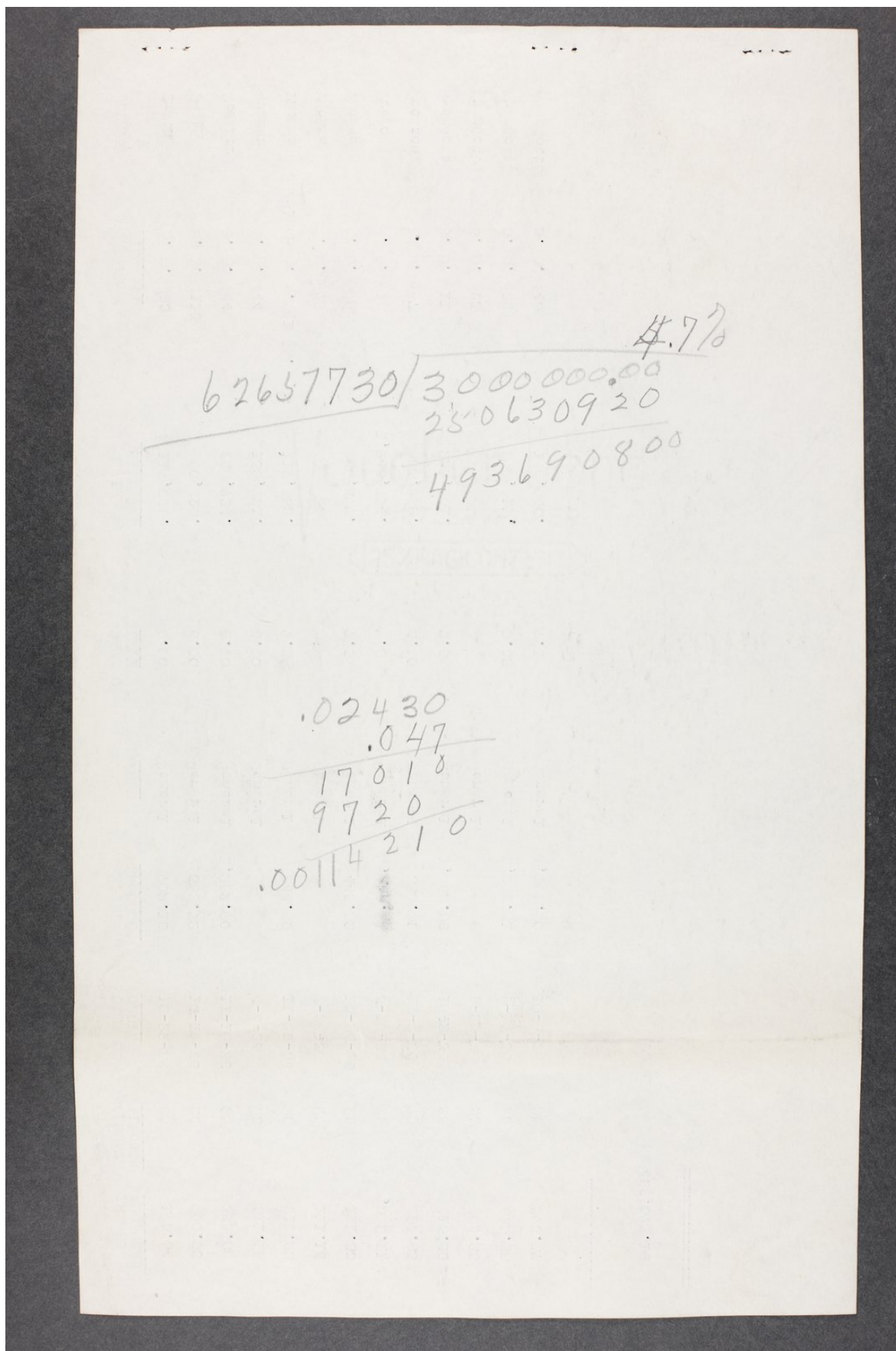
