
My Dear Sir:--

I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of your esteemed favor of recent date and was glad to hear from you. I am much impressed with the ideas expressed in your letter and will be inclined to follow them. I have always maintained that the Populists will never support a ticket which they have had no part in making. I had hoped that our committee would see the #6659646 wisdom of postponing the convention, but as they have not, I think it devolves itself on the delegates to take the matter in their own hands. Our county convention will be held tomorrow and I feel there is little doubt we will pass a resolution favoring adjournment and instruct our delegates to work for it. Of course, Mr. Sapp, Who is a member of the committee, will ask the county convention to hold up the hands of the committee, but we will be able to beat him. There is only one thing to do as I see it, and that is get together in one big convention, as you suggest, and nominate one ticket under the Democratic head. Every county in the Third district has passed a resolution favoring postponement as far as conventions have been held, and I am sure Cowley and Wilson will be in line. I was in Wilson county a few days ago and know the sentiment there, and I assume Mr. Jackson will be able to take care of Cowley. Mr. J., by the way, will be at the Wichita convention. 




Dear Sir: --

Replying to your inquiry received this morning. Oour representative candidates are: 25th district, John McLaughlin, Scammon, Kas. 26th district, Chas. Stephens, Columbus, Kas. McLaughlin will be elected without a doubt, as the last legislature redistricted this county, making the 25th stronger fusion than ever and cutting down our majority (24th) in this district. On Secretary of State in 1900 the precincts which now constitute the 25th district gave the Reps. 1626 and the fusionists 2452. So you see there is no guessing about one representative down here. The 26th district (the south part of the county) in 1900 gave Reps. 2735 and fusionists 2757, on Sec. of State. The Reps. meet next month. If they nominate E. B. Schermerhorn, of Galena, which seems likely, we will have a fight. He made the race against Weilep two years ago, and though defeated was able to keep a little ahead of his ticket everywhere. He is a banker, money loaner, merchant and mine operator -- one of the wealthiest men in the county, if in fact any have as many "rocks" as he, but he is a poor spender. He is new at politics, though believed to have an ambition to go to Congress. He has some opposition from a Baxter Springs man in the convention, but owing to the big delegation from this
































