


I am writing you in regards to my working in the Coal mines under state supervision.

So far I have not received any thing on my car fare. I am enclosing receipt for 2⁵⁸ on the Mo. Pac. and I paid out 5²⁵ on the Frisco from Wichita to Columbus Ks. Now the agent refused to give me a receipt for the 5²⁵ and I have nothing to show up. I also paid 65¢ fare on the Joplin and Pittsburg interurban from Columbus to Pittsburg.

I am enclosing your address of O. S. Hubert. Mr. Hubert says if I can get receipts he will forward my expenses and I am writing asking if you can get me the 8⁴⁸ fare from Sioux to Pittsburg.

I was informed when I got my pay that I am to stand ^{expenses} in return and have done so. But what the Wichita Beacon stated Nov 28th I thought the state offered to give free transportation down and back. I worked 10 days time as carpenter work under Captin Erickson and 2 days at the Flimming No 3 mine at Turk Ks. Respectfully,

On December 6th, Governor Henry J. Allen wrote me to issue railroad transportation to Colonel O. W. Hoop for a party of twenty-one persons, reading from Columbus, Ks to Wichita, Ks and to charge same to Transportation Account which was created several days ago when volunteer miners were brought from various points to Pittsburg, and advised me to handle matter with you and that you would make remittance to me to cover same.

On this request, I issued ticket ^{Form} Local 8 No. 3928 reading from Columbus, Ks to Wichita, Ks good for passing of twenty-one persons and delivered ticket to Colonel O. W. Hoop who gave me receipt for same. The rate per capita is \$4.86. Will thank you therefore to let me have remittance to cover of \$102.06.
