





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June 11, 1919. Director, Bureau of War Risk Insurance, Washington, D.C. Dear Sir: Mr. Earl Whitcher, of Melvern, Kansas, formerly a private in the 30th Infantry, 3d Division, A.E.F., but now discharged, has written to me in reference to the non-payment by the Government of his salary allotment during his period of service. Whitcher entered the service on Sept. 19, 1917, and made an allotment of \$15.00 per month in favor of his mother, Mrs. Nellie J. Whitcher, in November, 1917. He was discharged from service on May 12, 1919. He states that while the amount of the allotment was withheld from his pay-check each month, no money was ever sent to his mother, and claims that there is now due her the amount of \$270.00. Kindly check up your records on this case and make such adjustment as is equitable. Am sorry that I am unable to furnish Whitcher's army serial number or more detailed reference to your files.

















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August 21, 1919. Dear Sir: Our files do not disclose that we have yet been favored with a reply to my letter of June 11, 1919, in reference to the allotment of Frivate Barl Whitcher, 30th Inf., 2d Division, A.E.F. (Discharged), whose present address is Helvern, Kansas. I would greatly appreciate being advised of what is being done to adjust this soldier's claim. I am now advised that his army serial number is 2179013 and his allotment was filed on or about November 1st, 1917, he then being a memoer of the 164th Depot Brigade at Camp Function. This information may be of use in identifying his case in the records. In further reply to your communication concerning the case of the above named soldier, you are advised:

The records of this Bureau show no application on file by this soldier, and a report from the Adjutant General's Office is to the effect that no duplicate Form 1-B executed by the soldier is on file in that office. The War Department also reports no record of allotment through the Zone Finance Office.

However, as the records show checkage for \$15 allotment the soldier should request a refund of allotment checked against his pay and still unpaid, of the Director of Finance, War Department, Washington, D. C.

Enclosed is a copy of this letter for your use.


